

Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Friends,

Do you always pray with persistence? Do you pray continuously without losing heart until you receive what you

have been praying for? In our gospel, Jesus teaches us the importance of being persistent in prayer. Even if what we are praying for seems impossible, we must continue to pray persistently because with God, the impossible becomes possible.

In our Gospel passage today, there is a heartless judge who neither feared nor respected anyone. Yet, when the widow persistently asked for a just decision, he granted it to her. Why? Because the widow did not give up.

If we were in the widow's shoes and knew that the judge was impertinent, would we still pursue our request for a decision, or would we simply give up?

When we have a prayer request before God, we must always have the motivation to humbly ask God again and again to grant us what we desire. It does not matter if it takes time for God to answer; what is important is that we continue to pray and never give up.

Those who never give up in any aspect of life's endeavors will always achieve what they seek. This is evidenced by the persistent widow in our gospel. Do you easily give up when God does not answer your prayer?



Our Lady of Victory Parish is committed to the safety of all children, youth, and vulnerable adults on our campus. It is our responsibility to provide an environment which is safe and nurturing for all. In compliance to the Archdiocese of Detroit's Safe Environment Policy, OLV requires that ALL school and church volunteers complete the Virtus Protecting God's Children training and have a State of Michigan background check on file. New to the policy is the requirement that those who completed the Protecting God's Children training greater than 3 years ago will need to complete an online recertification session. 



HAITI OUTREACH MISSION



This weekend I am appealing to all parishioners for help. I have previously explained that gangs attacked the town of Mirebalais, where HOM focused its work. In a single day the Mirebalais residents became refugees, living in churches, schools and even on trails in other towns. With school recently resuming, the issue of people residing in the school is not ideal.

HOM has been sending a total of \$8,000 each month—half going to each of our two priests in Haiti. They work hard to acquire everything these refugees need, but the need is always greater than the help coming in. Most recently one of the priests described a current project to build three shelters in three nearby villages, each housing

between 80 and 100 refugees. This would provide some stability to these poor, displaced people, and that would especially be beneficial to the children. The cost to build these shelters is approximately \$20,000 each.

While the need is great on so many levels, it is especially critical for the children to remain in school. Tuition assistance is desperately needed for the current school year. Keeping children in school is the best chance of keeping them away from the influence of the gangs. It is hoped that after the current school year the residents will find their lives a bit more stabilized and possibly be able to pay for all or at least part of their children's tuition.

HOM is a small operation that provides incredibly meaningful assistance on a monthly basis. The expenses of HOM are kept to an absolute minimum—just wire transfer fees and website & Harness donation platform fees—so that donated funds can do what they are supposed to do: help the people of Haiti.

Please take a moment to think about the difference between our lives and those of the Haitians. While they worry about poverty, gangs and the sounds of gunfire, we find ourselves concerned with the cable going out or whether the streets of Northville are open or closed. Certainly we all face much bigger issues too, such as health concerns, skyrocketing costs, job losses, etc., but when those bigger issues emerge we always seem to have options.

I know there are many requests placed upon the people of OLV for financial help. Last year the OLV parishioners were extremely generous, and I am asking for your generosity again.








EUCHARISTIC MINISTERS NEEDED AT ASCENSION
