Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome

Dear Friends,

In the first letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians, he said: "Do you not know that you are the temple of God and that the Spirit of God dwells in you? If anyone destroys God's temple, God will destroy that person; for the temple of God, which you are, is holy," (1Cor 3:16-17)

Today, we are celebrating a feast not of a person but of a building. It is because today is the celebration of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica or the Church of the Most Holy Savior in Rome.

According to the very old book, *Butler's Lives of the Saints*, the residence of the Popes which was named the *Lateran Palace* was built by Lateranus Palutius, whom Nero put to death to seize his goods. It was given in the year 313 by Constantine the Great to Saint Miltiades, a Pope, and was inhabited by his successors until 1308 when they moved to Avignon, France. The Lateran Basilica built by Constantine near the

palace of the same name, is the first Basilica of the West. Twelve councils, four of which were ecumenical, have assembled there, the first in 649, the last in 1512.

Until now, the Basilica of St. John Lateran remains the home church of the Bishop of Rome, the Pope and the Cathedral of the Diocese of Rome. This is the oldest church in the world and even older than the St. Peter's Basilica in Vatican City. On the facade of this church is this inscription: "Mother and Head of all churches in Rome and throughout the world." This is because the Basilica of St. John Lateran is the cathedral of the Pope and the Pope is the Head of the Universal Church, therefore this Church, too is the Mother of all Churches in the world.



For several centuries the Popes have no longer lived in the Lateran Palace, this does not mean that the primacy of the Basilica is thereby altered; no, it is not altered. It remains the head of all churches. Saint Peter Damian wrote that "just as the Savior is the Head of the elect, the church which bears His name is the head of all the churches. Those of Saints Peter and Paul, to its left and its right, are the two arms by which this sovereign and universal Church embraces the entire earth, saving all who desire salvation, warming them, protecting them in its maternal womb."

This Mother of all Churches was dedicated by the Pope Saint Alexander in 324. The Lateran Church was partially ruined by fires, enemy invasions and earthquakes but it was always rebuilt with great zeal by the Sovereign Pontiffs. In 1726, after one such restoration, Pope Benedict XIII consecrated it anew and assigned the commemoration of that event to the present day. The church was afterwards enlarged and beautified by Popes Pius IX and Leo XIII.

And so, today, we join together to celebrate its dedication, and in a special way, we celebrate our connection, (communion) with Pope Leo XIV and the whole church! We the connections we share, hold us tightly together until we are together again, in everlasting life!

Hello from the Second Grade!


