The Second Sunday of Advent

Dear Friends,

The Gospel for today focuses on John the Baptist. When John began preaching in the desert of Judea he proclaimed this message: **“Reform your lives! The reign of God is at hand!”** It was of him that the prophet Isaiah had spoken: **“A herald’s voice in the desert; prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his path.”** It is in the wilderness where **“the highway of our God”** will be found.

John typically wore a garment of camel’s hair and a leather belt. He also had a strange diet that consisted of grasshoppers and wild honey. John’s mission was to prepare the way for the One who would come after him. Typically crowds of people came out to hear John preach and he baptized many people in the Jordan River. However, when John realized that many of the Pharisees and Sadducees wished to be baptized, he soundly rebuked them saying: **“You brood of vipers! Who told you to flee from the wrath to come? If you wish to be baptized, show proof that you mean to reform your lives. Don’t just claim that you will reform your lives; words alone simply are not sufficient.”**

John then adds: **“I baptize you with water for the sake of reform, but there is one who will come and he will baptize in the Holy Spirit and with fire. He will clear the threshing floor and gather his grain into barn and the chaff will be burned in an unquenchable fire!”** John called the people to repentance. Repentance (the Greek word, metanoia) is not simply turning away from our past way of life; rather it is the beginning of a new path to life, which typically is signified by the rite of Baptism. Today and every day we are called to reform our lives. No matter how much we strive to be better human beings, we always have room to grow. Today, ask yourself: how can I live a better life today? May you strive to do so.

Rosary in the Chapel: Thursday, December 11, at 7:00 p.m.

As we journey through Advent and prepare for Christmas this month shopping for gifts, observing all of the decorated trees and light displays, and participating in many events leading up to and through December 25, we should also reflect upon the fact that Jesus was born in the most humble environment possible - a stable. His tiny baby body was placed in a manger, a food trough for animals. (This is the quintessential foreshadowing of the Eucharist.) Humility was one of the hallmarks of the King of Kings from the very beginning.

Mary and Joseph also came from humble beginnings and lived simple lives before, during, and in Mary's case, even after they raised Jesus. Unlike secular royalty, they never had a palace, a bevy of servants waiting on them, or an unlimited source of financial wealth. What they did have was implicit trust and faith in God. After Jesus, they are the perfect role models for us now and all throughout the year.

Please join the Knights of Columbus on Thursday, December 11, at 7:00 p.m., in the Chapel for 30 short minutes to pray the rosary. We will gather to pray and give thanks for the greatest gift all of us have received-Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. As always everyone is welcome to attend!



OUR LADY OF VICTORY CHRISTMAS TREE OF REMEMBRANCE

As we prepare to celebrate one of the most wonderful times of the year, many of us may find our minds and hearts thinking of those loved ones we have lost. As a way of keeping their memory close during the holiday season, we invite you to add a memorial ornament to our *Tree of Remembrance* in the church Gathering Space. If you live locally, we welcome you to come to OLV and place an ornament on the tree for yourself. If you don't have an ornament, we can provide one for you.

If you are out of town or live out of the area, but would like an ornament on our Remembrance Tree, you are welcome to mail one to us. A staff member will make sure your ornament is placed on the tree.

Oplatki Christmas Tradition

The tradition of the Oplatki originated in Poland during Early Christian times. This Christmas Custom began with a simple white wafer, baked from flour and water. The wafers are wonderfully designed to display Christmas images, such as the Nativity. Families enjoy the Oplatki, typically right before the Christmas Eve meal. The entire family will gather around the table with the Oplatek. Generally, the eldest member of the family will begin the ritual by breaking off a piece of the wafer and passing it to another family member with a blessing. This blessing can simply consist of what you desire for your loved one in the upcoming year—whether it be good health, success, or happiness. The purpose of this act is primarily to express one's unconditional love and forgiveness for each member of his or her family.

The significance of the Oplatki Christmas wafer is that it shadows the Eucharistic meal that Catholics participate in at each Mass. Just as we share in the Eucharist as one family in Christ and receive Christ's love through the Eucharist, the Oplatki allows for one's immediate family to come together and share the love they have for one another.

The Oplatki tradition is one that is easy and fun to introduce to the family at Christmas time. All it requires is a simple wafer paired with love and affection, and the willingness to share it. This is a heartwarming tradition that will complete your family's time together during the Christmas season.

READINGS OF THE WEEK | SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT
