

Sixth Grade-Lesson 7-Messianic Fulfillment: Jesus and the Gospels

Key Points: What do you think about Jesus? What difference does it make in your life? What you believe about Jesus, and what difference that makes in your life, are the two most important decisions you will ever make. What you believe about Jesus and how you live because of it have eternal consequences (as in, for all of eternity). This is Huge.
