

Seventh Grade Lesson: Getting Ready for Lent

Lent starts next week with Ash Wednesday! This week we take some time to do a little overview of what Lent is all about. Ash Wednesday is this week! This begins our journey through Lent. On Ash Wednesday we receive ashes upon our forehead. When we receive these ashes, we hear this prayer, "Turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel" or "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." The ashes are not a sign of how holy we are but rather a reminder to repent of our sins, humble ourselves, and renounce our own pride. Just as God formed man out of the clay of the earth and breathed into him the breath of life, He can breathe new life into all of us who have fallen to sin.

Matthew 4: 1-4

"Then Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert. He fasted for forty days and forty nights, and afterwards he was hungry. The tempter approached and said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, command that these stones become loaves of bread.' He said in reply, 'It is written, 'One does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes forth from the mouth of God.'"

1) What is Lent?
