

The Promises of the Sacred Heart of Jesus

The Church dedicates the month of June to the special honor of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. While this devotion has long been part of Church practice, it received a new and richer meaning through private revelations made to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque.

St. Margaret Mary Alacoque was a member of a religious community called the Sisters of the Visitation. Since the Visitation Sisters are a cloistered community, this holy woman had the great joy of spending countless hours in prayer and devotion before Jesus in the Most Blessed Sacrament. During her prayer before the Tabernacle at the Visitation Convent in Paray-le-Monial, France, she began to experience visions of Jesus. A series of these visions began on December 27, 1673, and lasted for approximately eighteen months. Through these visions, Jesus made known to her His great desire to have her spread devotion to His Sacred Heart throughout the universal Church. Pope Clement XIII approved this devotion to the Sacred Heart in 1765. Sister Margaret Mary Alacoque was canonized a Saint in 1920.

During her private revelations, the Lord made twelve promises to St. Margaret Mary about graces and blessings those who had devotion to His Most Sacred Heart would receive. Those promises are:

- 1. I will give them all the graces necessary in their state of life.
- 2. I will establish peace in their families.
- 3. I will console them in all their difficulties.
- 4. I will be their secure refuge during life, and especially at the hour of death.
- 5. I will bestow abundant blessings upon all their undertakings.
- 6. Sinners shall find in My Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.
- 7. Tepid souls shall grow fervent.
- 8. Fervent souls shall quickly grow to high perfection.
- 9. I will bless every place in which a picture of My Heart shall be exposed and honored.
- 10. I will give to Priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts.
- 11. Those who promote this devotion shall have their names written in My Heart, never to be blotted out.
- 12. I promise in the excessive mercy of My Heart that My all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on First Friday in nine consecutive months the grace of final repentance; they shall not die in My displeasure nor without receiving the Sacraments; My Divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment.

What's the significance of the Holy Spirit? Why wasn't the Spirit more present to Jesus during His life?

Confused? You're not alone. To many, the Holy Spirit is the least-understood member of the Blessed Trinity, but many insights about the Spirit can be gleaned from Scripture.

For example, the Old Testament, contains many references to the Spirit. The "Spirit of God" is alternately seen as a Divine Force in the world, or as God Himself acting upon the earth or individual lives. In Genesis, this force is active at the creation. History, too, is affected by the Spirit, or "presence" of the Lord (Exodus 33:14–17). The Spirit is imparted to patriarchs, prophets, kings, and individuals who will shape history for the covenant people: Abraham, Joseph, Moses, Gideon, David, Ruth.

The Spirit is also evident in the New Testament. The Spirit "overshadows" the Virgin Mary (St. Luke 1:35) and inspires the prophecy of John the Baptist (St. John 1:26). The Spirit is an integral part of Jesus' mission, beginning with His Baptism in the Jordan (St. Matthew 3:13–17; St. Mark 1:9–11; St. Luke 3:21–22). By the Spirit's power, Jesus expels demons and heals the sick (St. Matthew 12:28; St. Luke 11:20). The Spirit is resurrected Jesus' gift to the Apostles (St. John 20:22). Jesus' mission is complete when He sends the Spirit to the Church at Pentecost (Acts 1:8; 2:1–4).

This brief review doesn't mean the mystery of the Holy Spirit can be easily solved. God can't be fully explained, even by Scripture. Mystery invites trust, not comprehension! It's only when you give yourselves entirely to the Spirit's power in your life that you begin to understand the significance of the Holy Spirit with and in you.
