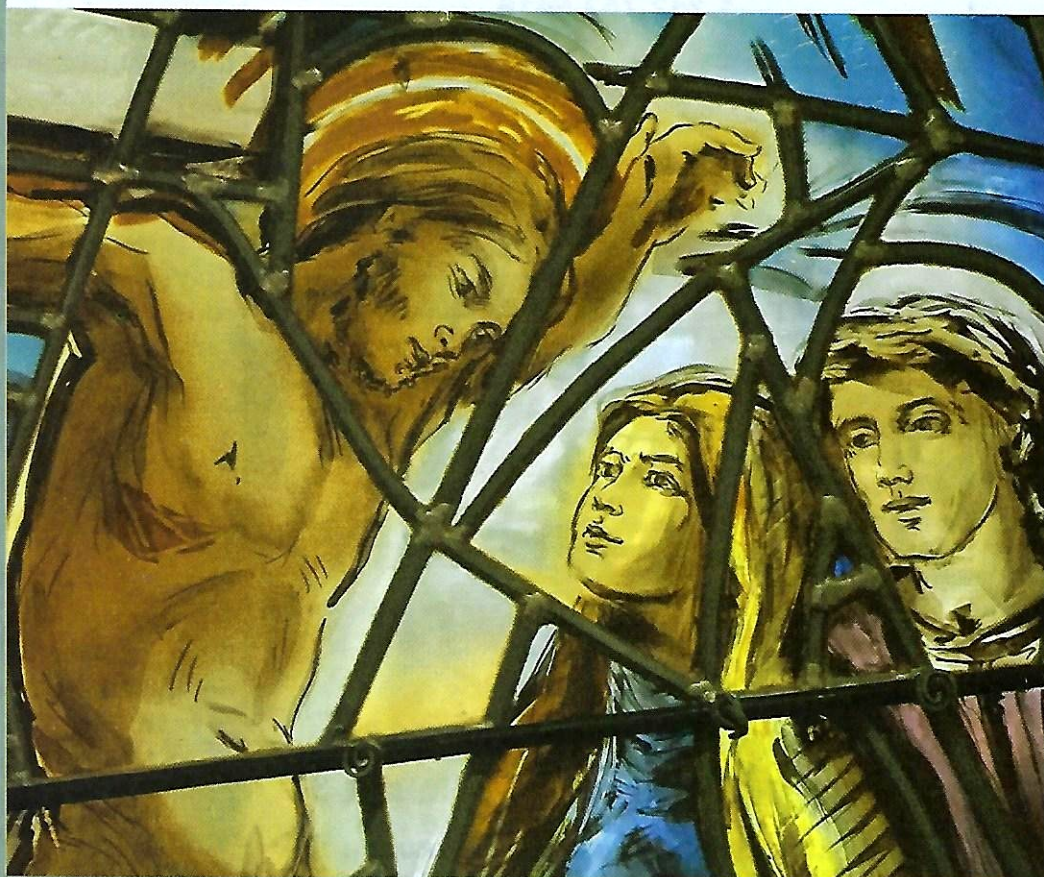

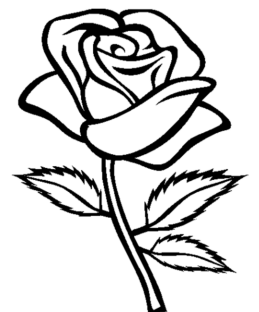

**My Dear Parishioners,**

**The Church designates October as “The Month of the Most Holy Rosary.” As you pray the Rosary, you join Mary in praying to the Father while reflecting on the Mystery of the Life of Jesus, the Son of God and the Son of Mary.**

**When Mary appeared at Lourdes and at Fatima, she prayed the Rosary. In fact, at Fatima, Our Lady identified herself as “The Lady of the Rosary.” Mary also asked us at Fatima to recite the Rosary every day “to obtain peace for the world and the end of war.”**

**In a prayer to Our Lady, written by St. John Paul II, he asks Mary’s help in delivering our modern world from “...the incalculable self-destruction...of every kind of war; sins against life...the demeaning of the dignity of the Children of God; and, from the loss of awareness of good and evil.”**

**Please join with St. John Paul II in asking Mary to help end all wars, bring peace to our world, and to restore human dignity and goodness, as you follow Mary’s call to pray the Rosary not just in October but every day throughout the year.**

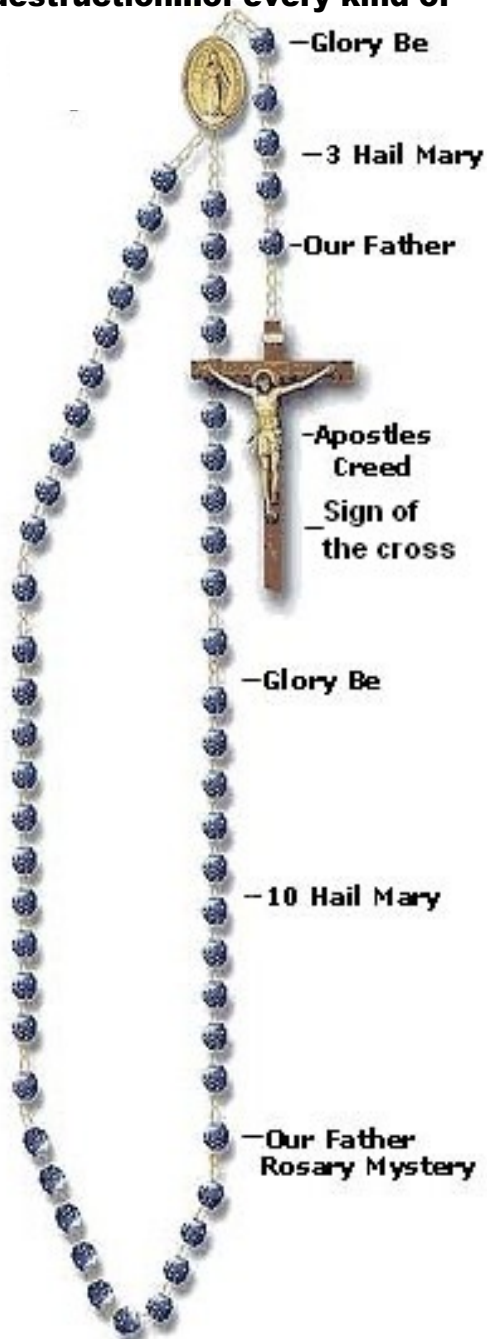
### **How To Say the Rosary**

- 1. Make the Sign of the Cross and say the Apostle’s Creed while holding the Crucifix/Cross at the end of the Rosary beads.**
- 2. Say the Our Father on the first large bead after the Crucifix/Cross.**
- 3. Say three Hail Marys, one on each small bead following the first large bead.**
- 4. Say the Glory Be on the large bead before the central medal.**
- 5. Announce the First Mystery; then say the Our Father on the same large bead.**
- 6. Say ten Hail Marys on the smaller beads.**
- 7. Say the Glory Be on the next large bead.**
- 8. Announce the Second Mystery; then say the Our Father on the same large bead.**
- 9. Repeat steps 6 and 7.**

**While praying the Rosary, you can meditate on various mysteries in the life of Jesus and Mary.**

**These mysteries are traditionally divided into four groups:**

- 1. The Joyful Mysteries, 2. The Sorrowful Mysteries,**
- 3. The Glorious Mysteries, and 4. The Luminous Mysteries.**
