


How To Say the Rosary

- Make the Sign of the Cross and say the Apostle's Creed while holding the Crucifix/Cross at the end of the Rosary beads.
- 2. Say the Our Father on the first large bead after the Crucifix/Cross.
- 3. Say three Hail Marys, one on each small bead following the first large bead.
- 4. Say the Glory Be on the large bead before the central medal.
- 5. Announce the First Mystery: then say the Our Father on the same large bead.
- 6. Say ten Hail Marys on the smaller beads.
- 7. Say the Glory Be on the next large bead.
- 8. Announce the Second Mystery; then say the Our Father on the same large bead.
- 9. Repeat steps 6 and 7.

While praying the Rosary, you can meditate on various mysteries in the life of Jesus and Mary.

These mysteries are traditionally divided into four groups:

- 1. The Joyful Mysteries, 2. The Sorrowful Mysteries,
- 3. The Glorious Mysteries, and 4. The Luminous Mysteries.
