St. Luke



The evangelist St. Luke was St. Paul's companion and a physician. The Gospel of Luke has some of the most loved stories, including those about the birth of Jesus. Luke shows

the compassionate Jesus who loves all people, especially the poor. His Gospel is called the Gospel of the Spirit, the Gospel of Prayer, the Gospel of Women, the Gospel of the Poor, and the Gospel of Joy. Besides his Gospel, Luke wrote the Acts of the Apostles, considered to be part two of his Gospel. St. Luke's feast day is October 18.

Luke is called the winged ox, since he deals with the sacrificial aspects of Christ's life and since his version of the Gospel begins with a temple scene.

Legend has it that Luke painted a portrait of the Blessed Mother, the icon of Our Lady of Czestochowa, also known as the Black Madonna. According to this tradition, he painted it on a board from the table St. Joseph built for the Holy Family. Historical studies, however, place the icon's origin between the fifth and eighth centuries. Today it can be seen at Poland's Jasna Gora monastery, where it has been a symbol of Polish spirituality and a place of pilgrimage since 1382. It is said to have traveled from Palestine to Byzantium, then to Hungary, and on to Ruthenia, and finally to Poland. (One legend says that angels finished a picture of Christ that was outlined by St. Luke; another, that Luke is the anonymous painter of Our Mother of Perpetual Help.)



This year, both the school and PSR will be trying to memorize a scrip-

ture verse each month. All the verses have to do with the Gospel Value for this year "Inclusion". We invite the parishioners to join us in this effort. The verse for October is: "A faithful friend is a sturdy shelter; he who finds one finds a treasure." Sirach 6:14

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Baptisms are celebrated on the fourth Sunday of the month following the 10:30 a.m. Mass. Parents are expected to call the Church Office three months before the anticipated birth to make an appointment for the prebaptism seminar. The seminar is held on the third Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Day Chapel in Church. (Baptisms are not celebrated during Lent.)

SACRAMENT OF FIRST COMMUNION: First Eucharist is celebrated the first Saturday of May for students in the 2nd grade or above who will be completing their 2nd year of religious education at the time of the celebration. SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION: Confirmation is celebrated in the Fall of 11th grade. Candidates must attend Catholic high school or be enrolled in the High School of Religion program in 9th-11th grades.
