Sacraments



SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Baptisms are usually celebrated on the fourth Sunday of the month following the 10:30 a.m. Mass. Parents and godparents are required to attend a seminar prior to the Baptism. The seminar is held on the third Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Day Chapel in Church. More information and required forms can be found on our website. (Baptisms are not celebrated during Lent.)

SACRAMENT OF FIRST COMMUNION: First Eucharist is celebrated the first Saturday of May for students in the 2nd grade or above. Children older than 2nd grade will be prepared on individual situations.

SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION: Confirmation is celebrated in the Fall of 11th grade. Candidates who attend Catholic high school or are enrolled in the High School of Religion program come together for Sacramental preparation. All candidates are asked to pre-register in their freshmen year and no later than December of their 10th grade year. Information and registration can be found on our website: www.olphbc.org.

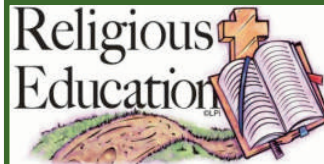
SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: Contact the Church Office at least nine months prior to the planned date. No other arrangements should be made before contacting the Church Office.

VISITATION OF THE SICK: Inform the Church Office when someone is sick, shut-in or hospitalized and unable to attend Mass.

FUNERALS: Inform the Church Office as soon as possible when someone in the family dies, preferably before contacting the funeral home.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION:

The mission of OLPH's Religious Education program is to bring the "Good News" of

SUNDAY LITURGY OF THE WORD: Children in grades K-2nd are invited with a catechist during 10:30 a.m. Mass to the Day Chapel for the Liturgy of the Word for Children. A summary of the readings of the day is discussed on their level.

PARISH SCHOOL OF RELIGION: PSR classes for students in Kindergarten through 8th grade not attending a Catholic school, are offered on Tuesday or Wednesday during the school year from 4:45—6:00 p.m.

HIGH SCHOOL OF RELIGION: Students in 9th through 12th grade not attending a Catholic High School are offered classes on Sunday evenings 5:30-6:45 p.m. in the KC Hall.

RCIA: Are you or someone you know interested in becoming Catholic or completing Sacraments? Please join our RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). We have a Year-Round RCIA process that you can enter into whenever you are ready. This is for you if you have never been baptized, if you have been baptized into another denomination and now want to become Catholic, or if you are an adult Catholic but have never been confirmed. Sessions are held every Tuesday evening at 7:30 p.m. in the Day Chapel. Call Dolly Roy at 394-0314.

Family Rosary

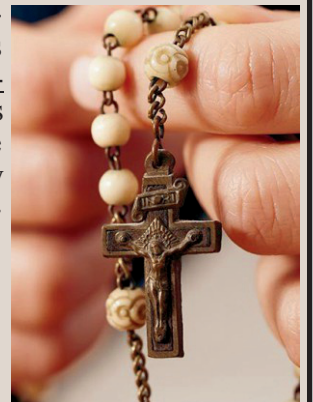

Having recently completed a Consecration to Jesus through Mary, I had the powerful feeling that Mary was telling me to do something. As I started asking how I could do it answers kept coming to me. The thoughts would not stop until I discussed this with Fr. Kyle and came up with a plan.

Saint of the Week: St. Francis of Paola



Francis was born in the tiny village of Paola, Italy, on March 27, 1416. His parents were poor but humble and holy. They had prayed to St. Francis of Assisi for a son. When their baby was born, they named him after the saint.

When Francis was old enough, he went to a school taught by the Franciscan priests. When he was fifteen, he asked for and received his parents' permission to become a hermit and spend his life for God alone. After this, Francis went to live in a cave.

In 1436, two of his friends joined him. They built a monastery, and Francis wrote a rule of life stressing charity, humility and penance. He added a vow of fasting and abstinence from meat. In this way Francis and his community hoped to set an example for so many Christians who at that time did not take their Lenten obligations of fasting and avoiding meals of meat on certain days seriously. Francis's Order was approved by Pope Sixtus IV in 1474. They were called the Minim Friars, meaning "the

littlest ones." This name was chosen because of the importance of the virtue of humility for Francis and his friars.

Everyone loved Francis. He prayed for them and worked many miracles. He told his followers that they must be kind and humble. He himself was the best example of the virtues he preached.

When King Louis XI of France was on his deathbed, he asked the pope to send Francis to him. Francis was such a source of hope and comfort for the dying king, that the king's son, Charles VIII, became Francis's lifelong friend and benefactor. Charles built a monastery in Plessis, France, for the Minims, and this is where Francis spent the rest of his life.

Francis of Paola died on Good Friday, April 2, 1507 at the age of ninety-one. He was canonized a saint in 1519. We celebrate his feast day on April 2nd.

St. Francis knew that it's very important while we're living on this earth to get ready for the life we want to spend with God forever in heaven. Sometimes we can get so wrapped up in music, television shows, videos and computer games that we forget all about God. Saying our prayers every morning when we get up and every night when we go to bed are two important ways to keep close to God.

Spiritual Direction



As Christians, we'll never reach perfection this side of heaven. There's always room to learn and grow in our spiritual life. We should be drawn to people who can help us along the way. That's why many people seek out spiritual direction.

A spiritual director is someone who will "walk with you," helping you discern and understand God's promptings and will for your life. Typically a person will meet regularly with their spiritual director, perhaps once a month. It's important to note that a spiritual director is not a therapist, or someone who will tell you what to do. They listen, ask questions and offer insight that will help you see and hear more clearly what God may be speaking to you. The aim of spiritual direction is to help

you grow in holiness.

A spiritual director can be a priest, religious or lay person. A reputable spiritual director will have gone through a training and certification process. (Note: while all priests can give spiritual counsel, not all priests are trained as spiritual directors.)

Spiritual direction is for those who seriously wish to grow closer to God, to discern the movement of the Holy Spirit in their life. If you're interested in seeking out a spiritual director, talk first with your local parish or diocese. Many part of the country now offer formation and training for spiritual directors.

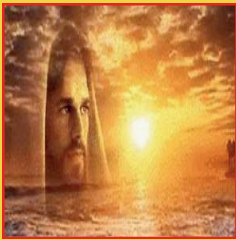

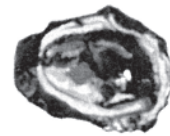
