**SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:** Baptisms are usually celebrated on the fourth Sunday of the month following the 10:30 a.m. Mass. Parents and godparents are required to attend a seminar prior to the Baptism. The seminar is held on the third Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Day Chapel in Church. More information and required forms can be found on our website. (Baptisms are not celebrated during Lent.)

**SACRAMENT OF FIRST COMMUNION**: First Eucharist is celebrated the first Saturday of May for students in the 2nd grade or above. Children older than 2nd grade will be prepared on individual situations.

**SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION**: Confirmation is celebrated in the Fall of 11th grade. Candidates who attend Catholic high school or are enrolled in the High School of Religion program come together for Sacramental preparation. All candidates are asked to pre-register in their freshmen year and no later than December of their 10th grade year. Information and registration can be found on our website: www.olphbc.org.

**SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:** Contact the Church Office at least nine months prior to the planned date. No other arrangements should be made before contacting the Church Office.



### Saint of the Week: St. Julie Billiart



Marie Rose Julie Billiart was born in France in 1751. Her uncle, the village school teacher, taught her to read and write. She especially loved to study about God. In fact, when she was just seven, Julie would explain the Catholic faith to other little children. When her parents became poor, she worked hard to help support the family. She even went to harvest the crops. Yet she always found time to pray, to visit the sick, and to teach catechism.

While she was still a young woman, Julie became very ill and completely paralyzed. Although helpless, Julie offered her prayers so that many people would find eternal happiness with God. She was more united to God than ever and kept on teaching catechism from her bed. She was a very spiritual person. People came to her for advice because she helped them grow closer to Jesus and practice their faith with more love. Many young women were inspired by Julie's love for God. They were willing to spend their time and money for good works. With Mother Julie as their leader, they started the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur.

Once a priest came to preach in the town where Julie lived. He asked her to make a novena (nine days of prayer) with him for a special intention, which he would not tell her. After five days, on the feast of the sacred Heart, he said: "Mother, if you have faith, take one step in honor of the Sacred Heart of Jesus." Mother Julie, who had been paralyzed for twenty-two years, stood up and was cured!

Julie spent the rest of her life training young women to become sisters. She watched over her congregation. She had to suffer much from those who did not understand her mission, but she always trusted God. Her favorite words were: "How good is the good God." The Lord promised her that someday her religious congregation would be very large. And that is just what happened. Julie died on April 8, 1816. Today there are many of her sisters all over the world. Mother Julie was proclaimed a saint by Pope Paul VI in 1969.

Whenever we're worried about something, let's pray, "Jesus, I trust in you." This will help us remember the goodness of god, as St. Julie always did. God never stops loving us and watching over us.

### **Indulgences**



Most people have heard of indulgences. Perhaps the only thing they could tell you is that it is the selling of indulgences that sparked the Reformation. But what is an indulgence?

Here's what the Catechism paragraph 1471 says: "An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose quilt has

already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the church which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints."

Think of it like this: when you go to confession and are truly repentant, you receive absolution from the Church, through the authority of Christ. Well, an indulgence would be like the removal of the penance. Through confession, repentance and certain pious acts, done with proper disposition, a conversion occurs.

The Catechism paragraph 1472 then says: "A conversion which proceeds from a fervent charity can attain the complete purification of the sinner in such a way that no punishment would remain."


