### **Sacraments**













**SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:** Baptisms are usually celebrated after any weekend Mass. Currently we only schedule one family at a time. Parents and godparents are required to attend a seminar prior to the Baptism. The seminar is usually held on the third Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Day Chapel in Church. More information and required forms can be found on our website.

**SACRAMENT OF FIRST COMMUNION**: First Eucharist is celebrated the first Saturday of May for students in the 2nd grade or above. Children older than 2nd grade will be prepared on individual situations. The Sacrament of Reconciliation must be celebrated prior to Communion.

**SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION**: Confirmation is celebrated in the Fall of 11th grade. Candidates who attend Catholic high school or are enrolled in the High School of Religion program come together for Sacramental preparation. All candidates are asked to pre-register in their freshmen year and no later than December of their 10th grade year. Information and registration can be found on our website: www.olphbc.org.

**SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:** Contact the Church Office at least nine months prior to the planned date. No other arrangements should be made before contacting the Church Office.

VISITATION OF THE SICK: Inform the Church Office when someone is sick, shut-in or hospitalized and unable to attend Mass.

## **Religious Education**

The mission of OLPH's Religious Education program is to bring the "Good

News" of God's love to all children and their families and to call them to commit their lives to Christ. Religious Education is available for children in Kindergarten through adults. We encourage parents to be parishioners of OLPH when registering students for Religious Education classes. Census forms can be obtained from the Parish Office during regular business hours, in the gathering area of the church or you can register online. Call C.C. **SUNDAY LITURGY OF THE WORD:** Children in grades K-2nd are invited with a catechist during 11:00 a.m. Mass to the Day Chapel for the Liturgy of the Word for Children (September-May). A summary of the readings of the day is discussed on their level.

**PARISH SCHOOL OF RELIGION:** Our PSR program is divided in two parts. Family Faith Formation is the "academic" part with the textbook discussed at home as a family. Our Encountering Engaging Events are a chance to come together as a community to worship together, do crafts, or engage in traditional events like our Nativity Play and Living Way of the Cross.

HIGH SCHOOL OF RELIGION: Students in 9th through 12th grade not attending a Catholic High School are offered Faith Formation with academics at home, working at their own pace, but also some time to get together to discuss what they have learned with their peers about three times a year. It is intended to be an informal study with honest Catholic answers.

RCIA: Are you or someone you know interested in becoming Catholic or completing Sacraments? Please join our RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). We have a Year-Round RCIA process that you can enter into whenever you are ready. This is for you if you have never been baptized, if you have been baptized into another denomination and now want to become Catholic, or if you are an adult Catholic but have never been confirmed. Sessions will be held in person on Tuesday evenings at 7:30 p.m. (day and time can be adjusted to personal schedules). For additional information and to register, contact C. C. ## Prepare the Way of the Lord

Saint Peter shows us a characteristic of God that we normally do not think about. He tells us that for God, "a day is like a

thousand years and a thousand years like one day" (2 Peter 3:8). Because early Christians sometimes complained that Jesus' second coming had been delayed, Peter is trying to tell us that what seems like a long time to us is nothing to God.

Like the early Christians, we may wonder how long it will take for God to answer our prayers. We may be praying for someone who is looking for a job, a sick relative, an end to abortion, or world peace. Some prayers require us to change, and we may not be ready.

What Peter means is that a thousand years is not too long for God if someone needs that long to repent. God is far more patient than we are. God has been "waiting" over two thousand years for us to preach the gospel to all nations. God has been waiting for millennia for people to give up war as a means for solving our problems. God has been waiting since the beginning of the human race for us to learn how to love our neighbor.

We might not be as patient as God, but we can help. Saint Peter says that we are not just waiting for the Lord's return, we are hastening it. When we make a choice that is based on faith rather than selfishness, we make it a little easier for people to believe in God. Jesus is the light of the world; he asks us to let our light shine, so that people can see Jesus in us. May our light "prepare the way of the Lord" (Mark 1:3).

#### **Second Sunday of Advent**



Straight Talk

The Catholic Mind

Among the many contributions of Pope Benedict XVI to the development of the Catholic mind, and thinking in general, was his rejection of EITHER/ OR THINKING (see his address at the University of Regensburg on Sept. 12, 2006) which impairs the minds' quest for truth. Such thinking, which is prevalent today and too often results in division and weakens dialogue, is a distortion of a mature Catholic mind. This type of thinking promotes a kind of mental straitjacket. In effect, one's creativity and imagination become restricted to the two options proposed for advancing knowledge. Even more destructive, dialectical thinking

(Either/ Or) hinders the development of community and communication essential for participating in learning and civic life.

To better understand the danger of Either/ Or thinking, consider this episode from the life of Jesus. The Pharisees sent their disciples and the Herodians (loyalists to Herod Antipas) to Jesus under the guise of settling a dispute concerning a tax issue, "Is it lawful to pay the census tax to Caesar or not?" (Mt. 22:17). The Pharisees did not object, while the Herodians did. Jesus recognizes the question for what it is - a trap! If Jesus answers no, he is labeled an enemy of Caesar. If Jesus answers yes, he is smeared as a dissident who undermines the religious authority of the Pharisees. No matter how Jesus answers, he incriminates himself and those who follow him. Such is the danger of Either/ Or thinking.

Jesus knows the malicious intent behind the question, for both groups are united in their desire to rid themselves of this troublesome messiah. However, Jesus refuses to put his neck in the noose. How does he escape? He brilliantly answers, "...repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God". (Mt. 22:21). His answer neutralizes the poison of the Either/ Or with the antidote of the Both/ And (analogically or integrative thinking). Jesus' response is one which acknowledges the claim of Caesar while affirming the proper justice claims of God. One can be both a good subject of Caesar as well as respecting religious law and authority.

Both/ And thinking has provided Christian theology with a fruitful way for a deeper way of understanding and teaching the mysteries of faith - Incarnation, Trinity, and Eucharist to name some of the essentials. A key expression of Catholic Both/ And thinking, specifically the union of faith and reason, is present in the enduring works of Saints Augustine and Thomas Aquinas. Augustine found his philosophical soulmate in Plato; for Aquinas it was Aristotle ("THE PHILOSOPHER"). This intellectual marriage serves as a reminder that Faith and modern science are not enemies but companions for the mind's journey to God and human fulfillment. For the more we understand the mysteries of creation, the deeper we are drawn into the Word (Logos) "through whom all came to be". (Jn 1:3).

Unfortunately, Both/ And thinking has lost its appeal in a time more comfortable on the battleground than common ground. The casualties are mounting - civility, community, compassion, and the common good. Our situation is not new. The Apostle Paul faced similar circumstances with the Christians at Corinth, a community he established in 51AD. Rivalries and divisions, secular and religious, were prevalent. His words to them serve as a distant mirror reflecting <u>our</u> image and turbulence: "As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts...are one body, so also Christ. For in one Spirit we were baptized into one body, ...and we were all given to drink of one Spirit ". (1Cor 12:12-13).

It is into the darkness of our fears and suspicion that the One who is Light and Life, and the one Spirit given to all, are such "that there may be no division in the body, but that the parts may have the same concern for one another. If [one] part suffers, all the parts suffer with it, if one part is honored, all parts share its joy." (1Cor 12:25-26).




