Sacraments















SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Baptisms are usually celebrated after any weekend Mass. Currently we only schedule one family at a time. Parents and godparents are required to attend a seminar prior to the Baptism. The seminar is usually held on the third Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Day Chapel in Church. More information and required forms can be found on our website.

SACRAMENT OF FIRST COMMUNION: First Eucharist is celebrated the first Saturday of May for students in the 2nd grade or above. Children older than 2nd grade will be prepared on individual situations. The Sacrament of Reconciliation must be celebrated prior to Communion.

SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION: Confirmation is celebrated in the Fall of 11th grade. Candidates who attend Catholic high school or are enrolled in the High School of Religion program come together for Sacramental preparation. All candidates are asked to pre-register in their freshmen year and no later than December of their 10th grade year. Information and registration can be found on our website: www.olphbc.org.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: Contact the Church Office at least nine months prior to the planned date. No other arrangements should be made before contacting the Church Office.

VISITATION OF THE SICK: Inform the Church Office when someone is sick, shut-in or hospitalized and unable to attend Mass.

FUNERALS: Inform the Church Office as soon as possible when someone in the family dies, preferably before contacting the funeral home.



Religious Education

The mission of OLPH's Religious Education program is to bring the "Good

News" of God's love to all children and their families and to call them to commit their lives to Christ. Religious Education is available for children in Kindergarten through adults. We encourage parents to be parishioners of OLPH when registering students for Religious Education classes. Census forms can be obtained from the Parish Office during regular business hours, in the gathering area of the church or you can register online. Call C.C. SUNDAY LITURGY OF THE WORD: Children in grades K-2nd are invited with a catechist during 11:00 a.m. Mass to the Day Chapel for the Liturgy of the Word for Children (September-May). A summary of the readings of the day is discussed on their level.

PARISH SCHOOL OF RELIGION: Our PSR program is divided in two parts. Family Faith Formation is the "academic" part with the textbook discussed at home as a family. Our Encountering Engaging Events are a chance to come together as a community to worship together, do crafts, or engage in traditional events like our Nativity Play and Living Way of the Cross.

HIGH SCHOOL OF RELIGION: Students in 9th through 12th grade not attending a Catholic High School are offered Faith Formation with academics at home, working at their own pace, but also some time to get together to discuss what they have learned with their peers about three times a year. It is intended to be an informal study with honest Catholic answers.

RCIA: Are you or someone you know interested in becoming Catholic or completing Sacraments? Please join our RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). We have a Year-Round RCIA process that you can enter into whenever you are ready. This is for you if you have never been baptized, if you have been baptized into another denomination and now want to become Catholic, or if you are an adult Catholic but have never been confirmed. Sessions will be held in person on Tuesday evenings at 7:30 p.m. (day and time can be adjusted to personal schedules). For additional information and to register, contact C. C. 



Reasons to Rejoice

Saint Paul seems to be throwing out a handful of sayings that may sound overly optimistic, but are actually very practical. "Rejoice always? Who can do that?" It sounds absurd, but

the next two lines give it context: If we pray constantly and thank God for all that happens to us, we have reason to rejoice. Whatever happens is the will of God for us. Even the bad things, things we don't like, can be allowed by God, so that God can bring good out of them. God allows sin because it leads to forgiveness, an experience of God's love for us. And God allows even death, because God can bring us to eternal life.

The next two sayings may be a little obscure. When Paul tells us not to quench the Spirit, he means we should be open to what the Holy Spirit moves us to do. "Prophetic utterances" refer to things that other people were inspired to proclaim. If we pray constantly (1 Thessalonians 5:17) we won't be so distracted by the things of this world that we cannot hear the promptings of the Holy Spirit in us. We won't be so critical of others that we miss what the Spirit is telling us through them.

How do we know if something really is from the Spirit? The next phrase helps with that: Test everything. Retain what is good (1 Thessalonians 5:21). Use the scriptures, the teachings of the Church, and your conscience to decide whether the Spirit is moving you, or if advice you hear is worthwhile. And most of all trust God to help with all this because God wants us to be holy. God will make us holy if we only allow it. Then we will be ready for the coming of the Lord, whether through the sacraments, the celebration of Christmas, or God's final coming in glory. I'd say that's a reason to rejoice.

Straight Talk by: Father William Maestri

A Christmas Gift

'Tis the season to be jolly, or so we are told. Yet there are many who go about as if they were weaned on vinegar and pacified on dill pickles! Such dispositions and faces are not the exclusive of Scrooge and the Grinch.

This sour condition is even found among cradle Catholics. One is reminded of the influential "God is dead" philosopher Friedrich Nietzsche (1844-1900) who asked his sister, "Why don't Christians look more redeemed?" Why indeed. Nietzsche's father was a Lutheran pastor!

A general gloom and doom has increased the aggressiveness of many: from driver's frustration to road rage; from assertiveness to the sharper elbows; bargain shopping to a blood sport; and the shopping malls into the modern colosseums in which life is a war of all against all. Even for those who take refuge behind a computer, there are late deliveries, no deliveries, stolen packages, along with merchandise sent to the wrong address. Such test the patience of Job.

Why is all this so? It would take more social psychologists and psychiatrists than staff the Menninger Clinic. It could be that deep in our souls there is a mourning for a lost good. Specifically, we are over fed and under nourished from the buffet of modern secularism. Maybe we have allowed this season to become a problem to be solved; a time to endure as best one can; and we calculate the cost while refusing to be drawn into the mystery of Divine Love.

We become like Martha, "worried and upset about many things, but few are needed - indeed only one." (Lk 10:41-42). What is this one thing? - the Unconditional Love of God who became one of us in order to free, heal, and forgive all of us.

This one thing is the humor of God revealed in a crib, in a stable, witnessed by animals, shepherds, and visited by three searchers from the East. The heavenly hosts grasp the humor and burst forth in song, "praising God...Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward all." (Lk 2:14).

One can't help but laugh with wonder, with the God who brings about the ultimate victory for humanity over sin and death in a most extraordinary way: God becomes flesh (Jn 1:14); not in a palace but a barn; and not amidst royal attendants but the lowly and unlikely.

The holy, silent night of "God with us" (Emmanuel) (Mt 1:23) evokes wonder; and amazement at God's infinite love for us. The solemnity of the Nativity is so great that we must laugh, be filled with joy, and join with the heavenly hosts. Such is God's gift; a gift to be lived; a gift to be given.


