SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Baptisms are usually celebrated after any weekend Mass. Currently we only schedule one family at a time. Parents and godparents are required to attend a seminar prior to the Baptism. The seminar is usually held on the third Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Day Chapel in Church. More information and required forms can be found on our website.

SACRAMENT OF FIRST COMMUNION: First Eucharist is celebrated the first Saturday of May for students in the 2nd grade or above. Children older than 2nd grade will be prepared on individual situations. The Sacrament of Reconciliation must be celebrated prior to Communion.

SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION: Confirmation is celebrated in the Fall of 11th grade. Candidates who attend Catholic high school or are enrolled in the High School of Religion program come together for Sacramental preparation. All candidates are asked to pre-register in their freshmen year and no later than December of their 10th grade year. Information and registration can be found on our website: www.olphbc.org.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: Contact the Church Office at least nine months prior to the planned date. No other arrangements should be made before contacting the Church Office.

VISITATION OF THE SICK: Inform the Church Office when someone is sick, shut-in or hospitalized and unable to attend Mass.

FUNERALS: Inform the Church Office as soon as possible when someone in the family dies, preferably before contacting the funeral home.

Religious Education

The mission of OLPH's Religious Education program is to bring the "Good

News" of God's love to all children and their families and to call them to commit their lives to Christ. Religious Education is available for children in Kindergarten through adults. We encourage parents to be parishioners of OLPH when registering students for Religious Education classes. Census forms can be obtained from the Parish Office during regular business hours, in the gathering area of the church or you can register online. Call C.C. SUNDAY LITURGY OF THE WORD: Children in grades K-2nd are invited with a catechist during 11:00 a.m. Mass to the Day Chapel for the Liturgy of the Word for Children (September-May). A summary of the readings of the day is discussed on their level.

PARISH SCHOOL OF RELIGION: Our PSR program is divided in two parts. Family Faith Formation is the "academic" part with the textbook discussed at home as a family. Our Encountering Engaging Events are a chance to come together as a community to worship together, do crafts, or engage in traditional events like our Nativity Play and Living Way of the Cross.

HIGH SCHOOL OF RELIGION: Students in 9th through 12th grade not attending a Catholic High School are offered Faith Formation with academics at home, working at their own pace, but also some time to get together to discuss what they have learned with their peers about three times a year. It is intended to be an informal study with honest Catholic answers.

RCIA: Are you or someone you know interested in becoming Catholic or completing Sacraments? Please join our RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). We have a Year-Round RCIA process that you can enter into whenever you are ready. This is for you if you have never been baptized, if you have been baptized into another denomination and now want to become Catholic, or if you are an adult Catholic but have never been confirmed. Sessions will be held in person on Tuesday evenings at 7:30 p.m. (day and time can be adjusted to personal schedules). For additional information and to register, contact C. C. Did you know that the only reason we say that there were three wise men is that they brought three gifts? The Bible never says their number or their names. The gifts tell us about the givers. And these special gifts—gold, frankincense, and myrrh—tell us much.

When one king visited or sent an ambassador to another, he would give a gift of gold to show that he acknowledged the kingship of the other. So the first gift of the wise men tells us they recognized Jesus as King. The second gift is a type of incense, which was used in Jesus time to worship God. So this gift shows the wise men paying homage to Jesus' divinity. The gift of myrrh is

oil used to anoint the dying. It reminds us of Jesus suffering and death on the cross.

So what gifts do we have for Jesus? Maybe we can take a hint from the wise men. If we acknowledge Jesus as king, maybe a better gift than gold would be to pledge our obedience to him. Each day we can promise to live our vocation as best we can, to love those around us, and forgive those who hurt us.

A better way than burning incense to pay homage to Jesus' divinity is to take time to pray throughout the day. Some people are able to attend daily Mass, others spend time in adoration before the Eucharist, or even a few minutes of their lunch break to say the rosary.

As for the gift of myrrh, we can give Jesus the crosses we bear each day. When we accept suffering in our lives, especially that caused by our sins, we give ourselves to Jesus as he gave himself for us on the cross. The song "Little Drummer Boy" reminds us that the best gift is not necessarily the most expensive. Instead, it is the simple gift that only we can give. Let Epiphany remind us to offer our lives to Jesus each day.

The Epiphany of the Lord



Straight Talk by: Father William Maestri **Blessing Same-Sex Unions**

The Vatican, specifically Cardinal Prefect Victor Fernandez, with the approval of Pope Francis, revised its 2021 directive which denied the blessing of same-sex unions ("God cannot bless sin"). The new directive (Fiducia Supplicans / Supplicating Trust) now allows for the blessing of such relationships. This shift was motivated by Pope Francis' desire to avoid "rigid ideological positions". At the same time, the Declaration emphasizes that, "There's no intention to legitimize anything, but rather to open one's life to God, to ask for his help to live better, and

also to evoke the Holy Spirit so that the values of the Gospel may be lived with greater faithfulness".

This latest move by Pope Francis should come as no surprise: the pontiff told the Associated Press, "Being homosexual isn't a crime". In addition, the Vatican stated that under certain circumstances transgender people (even those who have undergone sex readjustment and therapies) can be baptized as Catholic and serve as godparents. This would be allowed as long as it did not cause scandal or confusion among the faithful. Same-sex couples are to be shown the same respect as the other faithful. This too is a reversal of the 2015 directive which banned transgenders from serving as godparents. Also, on various occasions, Pope Francis has reached out to members of the LGBTQ+ community. Pope Francis, for example, sent an email response to Stan Zerkowski, who serves as the leader of the Diocese of Lexington's outreach to LGBTQ+: "Dear Brother, thank you very much for your ministry. I pray for you, please continue to do so for me. May the Lord bless you and the Madonna watch over you. Fraternally, Francis." (Oct. 21, 2023)

The new Declaration emphasized the following: Marriage is a permanent covenant between one man and one woman; sexual relations outside of marriage is a sin; homosexual acts are disordered; such blessings are forbidden within the context of a civil union; and they are not to be administered with the vestments of the clergy or associated liturgical symbols. The Declaration explains that the blessings are a sign of acknowledging the love shared by the couple as well as the companionship and mutual support which are goods for human development. What is disapproved of are the conjugal acts which are properly expressed in a sacramental marriage. In effect, the Church is extending Christ's love for the individuals while the homosexual act is sinful. In so doing, there is the hope of conversion. The release of the document evoked strong reactions, both in support and dissent. Advocates have seen the Declaration as "'progress" for the Church's evangelizing mission to those in the shadows and have turned away from the Church. Others have viewed the documents as opening the door for the Church to recognize same-sex unions as sacramental marriages. Such a recognition would be contrary to Divine Revelation and the moral Tradition of the Church. The U. S. Conference of Catholic Bishops has highlighted the continuity of the Declaration with both Divine Revelation and settled Catholic moral teaching.

What we are witnessing is a conflict of ecclesiologies; a difference of visions concerning the Church Jesus left behind. Those who disapprove of the Declaration understand the Church's mission to be a CERTAIN TRUMPET in teaching the truths about faith and morals. Those who approve understand the Church to be a "field hospital" (Pope Francis) called to bring the love, mercy, and inclusive arms of Jesus, especially to those who have been rejected and scorned. Unfortunately, what is emerging is a separation between fidelity to Divine Revelation and the pastoral-evangelical mission to preach the Gospel to the whole world. Such a breach must be reconciled.

Both dissenters and advocates need to be Solomon-like by praying together, "...give your servant a discerning heart to govern your people and to distinguish between right and wrong" (1 Kgs 3:1-15). God was pleased because he didn't ask for passing things among which was "the death of your enemies." Likewise, our differences must never move us to view one another as "enemies". We are known to be faithful disciples of Jesus by "the love we have, one for the other" (Jn 13:35).


