#### **Sacraments**















**SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:** Baptisms are usually celebrated after any weekend Mass. Currently we only schedule one family at a time. Parents and godparents are required to attend a seminar prior to the Baptism. The seminar is usually held on the third Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Day Chapel in Church. More information and required forms can be found on our website.

**SACRAMENT OF FIRST COMMUNION**: First Eucharist is celebrated the first Saturday of May for students in the 2nd grade or above. Children older than 2nd grade will be prepared on individual situations. The Sacrament of Reconciliation must be celebrated prior to Communion.

SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION: Confirmation is celebrated in the Fall of 11th grade. Candidates who attend Catholic high school or are enrolled in the High School of Religion program come together for Sacramental preparation. All candidates are asked to pre-register in their freshmen year and no later than December of their 10th grade year. Information and registration can be found on our website: www.olphbc.org.

**SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:** Contact the Church Office at least nine months prior to the planned date. No other arrangements should be made before contacting the Church Office.

VISITATION OF THE SICK: Inform the Church Office when someone is sick, shut-in or hospitalized and unable to attend Mass.

#### **Religious Education**

The mission of OLPH's Religious Education program is to bring the "Good

News" of God's love to all children and their families and to call them to commit their lives to Christ. Religious Education is available for children in Kindergarten through adults. We encourage parents to be parishioners of OLPH when registering students for Religious Education classes. **SUNDAY LITURGY OF THE WORD:** Children in grades K-2nd are invited with a catechist during 11:00 a.m. Mass to the Day Chapel for the Liturgy of the Word for Children (September-May). A summary of the readings of the day is discussed on their level.

**PARISH SCHOOL OF RELIGION:** Our PSR program is divided in two parts. Family Faith Formation is the "academic" part with the textbook discussed at home as a family. Our Encountering Engaging Events are a chance to come together as a community to worship together, do crafts, or engage in traditional events like our Nativity Play and Living Way of the Cross.

HIGH SCHOOL OF RELIGION: Students in 9th through 12th grade not attending a Catholic High School are offered Faith Formation with academics at home, working at their own pace, but also some time to get together to discuss what they have learned with their peers about three times a year. It is intended to be an informal study with honest Catholic answers.

RCIA: Are you or someone you know interested in becoming Catholic or completing Sacraments? Please join our RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). We have a Year-Round RCIA process that you can enter into whenever you are ready. This is for you if you have never been baptized, if you have been baptized into another denomination and now want to become Catholic, or if you are an adult Catholic but have never been confirmed. Sessions will be held in person on Tuesday evenings at 7:30 p.m. (day and time can be adjusted to personal schedules). For additional information and to register, contact C. C. 

#### TITLES OF MARY:

#### OUR LADY OF ALTAGRACIA January 21

In 1502, on the island of Hispaniola, the Blessed Virgin Mary was honored under the title of *Nuestra Señora de la Altagracia*. Her image had been brought from Spain by Alfonso and Antonio Trejo, brothers who were among the first European settlers of the island. She is

now patroness of the Dominican Republic.

#### OUR LADY OF DAMASCUS January 24

An ancient icon of Our Lady of Damascus was brought to Malta from Rhodes by the Knights of St. John in 1530, and venerated in the Greek Catholic Church in Valletta.



#### To Answer the Call

Something very profound is going on in this brief passage about the call of the first apostles. Jesus calls, they follow. It's a pretty simple cause and effect scenario. Yet, you and I both know that following Jesus is anything but simple these days...right? Or could it be that this passage is the perfect model for just how radical it is to follow Jesus?



Jesus offered the first apostles no explanations, He didn't try to sway them. He boldly called out an invitation and issued a promise. He continues to stand by the shore near our boats and offer the same to us. First, He invites us. It's a call, a challenge, a summons to adventure. "Come on, let me show you where you could go." However, Jesus always respects our free will. We freely choose to follow, or to remain behind. The choice is ours.

Then, he makes a promise, "I will make you fishers of men." What does that mean exactly? Each baptized individual is called to be a witness of the faith. This mission looks different for each person. I am called to witness to the faith in this written format. I am also called to share the faith with my children. Others are called to be a witness in the workplace. Some of you might witness before large groups of people. Others will share the faith one person at a time, helping to share the light of Christ candle by candle. We are invited, each in our own unique way, to participate in Jesus' mission to build the Kingdom of Heaven. No matter who we are, Jesus invites us to get up and go on an adventure with Him.

I think the word "abandoned" is important here. Abandoned is a very active word, it paints a vivid picture of someone throwing an object aside, forgetting it's very existence. The first apostles abandoned their nets when they answered Jesus' summons. They didn't hold onto their tools, just in case. They didn't ask to stow their boats first so they wouldn't get stolen. The apostles show us how to let go of everything to follow Jesus. This isn't an easy task, and fortunately we have a God who is not outdone in generosity. There isn't a time limit on Jesus' call to discipleship. He calls us every day, every moment. Over and over again, we have the opportunity to more freely say "Yes!" and abandon our own nets to follow Jesus.

## Teach me your ways, O Lord.

#### A New Way, A New World

When the people of Nineveh repented, they showed it by wearing sackcloth and fasting from food. Sometimes we might think that way: That repenting

means punishing ourselves or feeling sorry. Jesus sees things differently. He preached repentance that was a change of heart, a new way of looking at things, a new way of acting. In the gospel today, we see an example. The first people he calls to be disciples were fisherman. They would have considered their family, their partners, and their boat as the most important things in their lives. You need all of them to be a successful fisherman. Yet the disciples don't even hesitate when called by Jesus. They leave behind their boats, their nets, even their father, to follow Jesus. They don't worry about what they will do, or look back at what they are leaving behind. Now they are fishers of men. Their "repentance" was more than just giving up sins. They were beginning a new life and a new way of looking at the world.

Saint Paul refers to this as a new world. When he talks about not using the world fully, he means not fully engaged in the world, but looking to a better one, where God is more important than any passing pleasure or pain. Is your marriage an example of God's love for your friends and relatives? When you are rejoicing, do you give thanks to God? When you are shopping, do you buy what you really need, or what you think will make you happy? Jesus calls us all to this new way of living. With Jesus, we can make a new world.

#### The Third Sunday in Ordinary Time



The persecution of the Church, and the shedding of the martyr's blood is <u>not</u> frozen in time. Throughout history, the Church, the People of God who profess Jesus is Lord, has suffered the demonic rage of worldly tyrants. The past is prologue, and the Church is once again being crucified and the blood again stains the pages of history.

The latest episode of persecution by an instrument of the Evil One, and by no means the only one, is being conducted by the tyrannical Daniel Ortega and his fiercely anti-Catholic

wife Murillo. President Ortega came to power in 1979, with the Sandinistas (FSLN). They overthrew the dictator, Anastasio Somoza. In a democratic election in 1990, Ortega was defeated but returned to power in 2007. Since then, there has been a slow, calculated restriction of human rights, especially RELIGIOUS FREEDOM. Protests against these repressive actions by the State were answered by increased oppression, especially against the Catholic Church.

A new eruption of persecution has been imposed by Ortega during this Holy Season of Advent and Christmas. This sacred time of God's love entering humanity and history; God's victory over the chains of sin; have been met with the jailing of bishops, priests, seminarians; the closing of churches, and the forbidding of religious services, as well as the silencing of sermons and speeches that were critical of the UNJUST Ortega dictatorship. Many courageous witnesses have been deported, others have received harsh jail sentences in the most violent and dehumanizing of prisons. All of this without benefit of legal counsel, contact with family and loved ones, and sacramental support.

The latest episodes occurred on December 20, 2023, with the arrest of Bishop Alvarez and a subsequent 26-year sentence. His "crime"? He dared to proclaim the Gospel call to conversion to Ortega and his unjust regime. The Ortega thugs declared this to be subversive, obstructing justice, undermining authority, and promoting civil unrest. Next, after offering the New Year's Eve Mass, Father Gustavo Sandino was taken into custody for praying for Bishop Alvarez! Father Sandino has not been seen since.

Pope Francis, during his Angelus address, said, "I follow with deep concern what is happening in Nicaragua." He went on to say that the actions by the Ortega dictatorship shows a disregard for the "rule of law and fundamental freedoms." One Vatican official viewed the situation under Ortega as "one of the worst since the Cold War." Following the regime's increased persecution, the Vatican closed its embassy and recalled its Ambassador who was threatened with expulsion. Pope Francis concluded his Angelus address by calling for "the sincere search for peace, which is born of truth, justice, freedom, and love, which is achieved through the patient pursuit of dialogue." Martha Molina, Nicaragua: A Persecuted Church, notes the following: since 2018, there have been more than 770 attacks, arrests, expropriations and harassments including obstruction of religious processions, prayers, Masses in cemeteries, along with numerous messages of hate and threats of violence by the regime.

The situation is <u>not</u> just the suffering of the Church in Nicaragua, it is a UNIVERSAL SIN in that it is an egregious affront to humanity, and to all that is just in promoting the dignity of the human person and the common good. The persecution of the Catholic Church transcends a particular religious tradition; it calls for the SOLIDARITY in prayer and witness by <u>all</u> who hold dear those rights and freedoms which do <u>not</u> proceed from government, but are gifts bestowed by God in whose image the human person is made.

We may ask, "Where is Jesus?" (Mt. 2:1-2; Jn. 20:11-18). He is in the midst of it all, lying in a manger and nailed to a cross. He is saying to each conscience, "Follow me. Be not afraid. For there is an EMPTY TOMB. Divine Love and Life shines in the darkness and is not overcome." (Lk. 2:10-11; Lk. 5:8-11; Jn. 21:20-22; Jn. 1:5).


