#### **Sacraments**











**SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:** Baptisms are usually celebrated after any weekend Mass. Currently we only schedule one family at a time. Parents and godparents are required to attend a seminar prior to the Baptism. The seminar is usually held on the third Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Day Chapel in Church. More information and required forms can be found on our website.

SACRAMENT OF FIRST COMMUNION: First Eucharist is celebrated the first Saturday of May for students in the 2nd grade or above. Children older than 2nd grade will be prepared on individual situations. The Sacrament of Reconciliation must be celebrated prior to Communion.

**SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION**: Confirmation is celebrated in the Fall of 11th grade. Candidates who attend Catholic high school or are enrolled in the High School of Religion program come together for Sacramental preparation. All candidates are asked to pre-register in their freshmen year and no later than December of their 10th grade year. Information and registration can be found on our website: **www.olphbc.org**.

**SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:** Contact the Church Office at least nine months prior to the planned date. No other arrangements should be made before contacting the Church Office.

**VISITATION OF THE SICK:** Inform the Church Office when someone is sick, shut-in or hospitalized and unable to attend Mass.

## Religious Education

### **Religious Education**

The mission of OLPH's Religious Education program is to bring the "Good News" of God's love to all children and

their families and to call them to commit their lives to Christ. Religious Education is available for children in Kindergarten through adults. We encourage parents to be parishioners of OLPH when registering students for Religious Education classes. Census forms can be obtained from the Parish Office during regular business hours, on the Welcome Table located in the back of church or you can register online. Call the church office at (504) 394-0314, or email **cre@olphbc.org** for more information.

**SUNDAY LITURGY OF THE WORD:** Children in grades K-2nd are invited with a catechist during 11:00 a.m. Mass to the Day Chapel for the Liturgy of the Word for Children (September-May). A summary of the readings of the day is discussed on their level.

**PARISH SCHOOL OF RELIGION:** Our PSR program is divided in two parts. Family Faith Formation is the "academic" part with the textbook discussed at home as a family. Our Encountering Engaging Events are a chance to come together as a community to worship together, do crafts, or engage in traditional events like our Nativity Play and Living Way of the Cross.

HIGH SCHOOL OF RELIGION: Students in 9th through 12th grade not attending a Catholic High School are offered Faith Formation with academics at home, working at their own pace, but also some time to get together to discuss what they have learned with their peers about three times a year. It is intended to be an informal study with honest Catholic answers.

RCIA: Are you or someone you know interested in becoming Catholic or completing Sacraments? Please join our RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). We have a Year-Round RCIA process that you can enter into whenever you are ready. This is for you if you have never been baptized, if you have been baptized into another denomination and now want to become Catholic, or if you are an adult Catholic but have never been confirmed. Sessions will be held in person on Tuesday evenings at 7:30 p.m. (day and time can be adjusted to personal schedules). 

this again next year!



















Caution: Spirit at Work

If Pentecost celebrates the gifts of the Spirit, it can tempt us to separate the Spirit from the Father and Jesus. Sometimes we think of the Father as the God of the Old Testament, Jesus as center of New Testament, and the Spirit as God of the present age, almost as if the Father and Jesus were



enjoying their retirement. No, we have one God who is over all and in all.

The Spirit has been active in all ages. The prophets were empowered by the Spirit to proclaim God's word to Israel. Jesus was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit. Jesus was filled with the Spirit as he preached and worked miracles. Then at Pentecost the disciples were filled with the Spirit.

The Spirit's gifts are meant to be shared. The prophets could not help proclaim God's message. Jesus shared all he knew with his disciples. The disciples went out to the world to spread the news of Jesus' death and resurrection. So we, too, are given gifts to be shared. As we come to realize how much God has done for us and how close he is to us, we will want to share that with others. Obviously, we can't make everyone believe in Jesus. But how sad would it be if someone we know was looking for the truth and we neglected to offer it?

#### SAINT RITA OF CASCIA Feast Day—May 22 (1381-1457)

If you're ever in Philadelphia on May 22, forget parking anywhere near Saint Rita's shrine. Cars line streets and fill medians as throngs pack a candlelight vigil and six Masses, honoring this patroness of lost causes, hopeless situations, and—as her statue in countless churches built by twenti-

eth-century immigrants testifies—difficult marriages, troubled homes, and alienated children. Wise people warn, be careful what you pray for. "Divine Savior," Rita prayed, "let me suffer like you!" Obedient to parents who refused her wish to become a nun, Rita married a man who returned her devotion with twenty years of abuse. When enemies murdered him, Rita's two sons swore revenge. Paintings depict her pointing the angry boys toward Christ crucified, whom she begged to restrain them. Within the year, both sons died. Alone now, Rita went to the convent but was refused. The nuns feared violence, since one of them was related to the murderer. Rita arranged peace between the families, made vows, and became much sought after as a counselor and intercessor for forty years on earth—and ever since in heaven. —Peter Scagnelli

#### **Pentecost Sunday**



**Straight Talk** by: Father William Maestri Pentecost: YOU are Sent!

It is fitting that at this time Pope Francis has declared Blessed Elena Guerra (1834-1914), a Saint with the title, "Apostle of the Holy Spirit". She was a spiritual writer with a deep devotion to the Holy Spirit. During her lifetime. Sister Elena wrote a number of letters to Pope Leo XIII, urging his support that Catholics increase their devotion to the Holy Spirit. Her efforts were fruitful: Pope Leo XIII wrote a letter to the universal Church encouraging Catholics to pray a novena to the Holy Spirit in preparation for Pentecost (1885). This was followed up with the encyclical to the Holy Spirit, (Divinum ILLUD MUNUS).

In the encyclical, Pope Leo XIII wrote: "The Church which already conceived forth from the side of the second Adam in His sleep on the Cross [Jn19: 34], first showed herself [the Church] before the eyes of men on the great day of Pentecost. On that day, the Holy Ghost began to manifest His gifts in the mystic body of Christ [Church] by that miraculous outpouring already foreseen by the prophet (Joel 2: 28-29/ see Joel 3:1-2)" (No. 5).

The Apostles (and Mary within her sphere of influence) went forth in fidelity to the Ascension commissioned by Jesus to "go forth and proclaim the Gospel to the whole world". (Mk 16: 15). They go forth not simply on a mission but they are mission! The Apostles, through the indwelling Holy Spirit, have become "one in being" with the Gospel. The Gospel is not a teaching like that of the scribes and Pharisees, rather it is one "with authority", that is, grounded in the Person of Jesus and the Kingdom of God (Mt 7: 29). Apostolic preaching is one within Jesus and the Spirit.

The account of the first Pentecost in Acts (1: 1-4), serves as the distant mirror for the Church through the ages. Pentecost is not a frozen, historical event to be remembered and forgotten. Rather, it is the abiding presence of the Spirit throughout the life of the Church until He comes again. (Mt 16: 18). For in every historical epoch and place, the hosannas (Mk 11: 9-10), and "crucify Him" (Mk 15: 12-13), the Church is present. But NOT alone! For Jesus pledged that He and the Father would send the Spirit (Paraclete), (Jn 14: 18). The abiding Spirit of Truth is ever present within the Church, and each of us (Jn 14: 17).

On that first Pentecost, the disciples were "shut-ins", fearful to proclaim Jesus as Risen Lord. Perhaps they forgot the words of Jesus to stay in Jerusalem, for the Holy Spirit will come and they will be empowered to "be my witnesses...to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1: 8). After Jesus ascends, two angels appear and direct them back to Jerusalem (Acts 1: 10-12). There is a sense of urgency. The angels question, more a bewilderment, as to why the disciples are "standing there looking at the sky?" (Acts 1: 11). After all, Jesus told them he must go away so the Spirit can be sent. (Jn 16: 7).

The disciples return and gather during the Jewish Pentecost. While together in a house "a strong driving wind filled the house" followed by "tongues of fire, which parted on each of them". (Acts 2: 1-3). The promised word of Jesus is fulfilled: "...they were all filled with the Holy Spirit". (Acts 2: 4). The disciples, once timid, sky gazers, and slow to remember, emerge speaking "in different tongues, as the spirit enabled them to proclaim." (Acts 2:4).

Today is our Pentecost, individually and as Church. We, Spirit filled, are to be timid, sky gazers, and forgetful NO MORE! We are empowered to go forth into our everydayness and proclaim, "Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." (Phil 2: 11).

As it was at the first Pentecost, so it is now. We find ourselves engaged in a great spiritual conflict, "not with flesh and blood, but with the powers, with the world rulers of this present darkness, with the evil spirits in the heavens." (Eph 6: 12).

We can emerge triumphant, as Church and individually, IF we daily walk wet in our Baptism; the oil of Confirmation remains fresh, and the fire burns bright. Let us resolve to "draw [our] strength from the Lord and from His mighty power. Put on the armor of God so that you may be able to stand firm against the tactics of the devil". (Eph 6: 10-11).


Through the Spirit, this we can be and do. Why? Because "neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor present things, nor future things, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Rom 8: 38-39).
