Sacraments



SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Baptisms are usually celebrated after any weekend Mass. Currently we only schedule one family at a time. Parents and godparents are required to attend a seminar prior to the Baptism. The seminar is usually held on the third Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Day Chapel in Church. More information and required forms can be found on our website.

SACRAMENT OF FIRST COMMUNION: First Eucharist is celebrated the first Saturday of May for students in the 2nd grade or above. Children older than 2nd grade will be prepared on individual situations. The Sacrament of Reconciliation must be celebrated prior to Communion.

SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION: Confirmation is celebrated in the Fall of 11th grade. Candidates who attend Catholic high school or are enrolled in the High School of Religion program come together for Sacramental preparation. All candidates are asked to pre-register in their freshmen year and no later than December of their 10th grade year. Information and registration can be found on our website: www.olphbc.org.

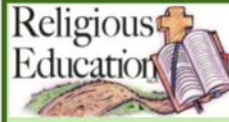
SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: Contact the Church Office at least nine months prior to the planned date. No other arrangements should be made before contacting the Church Office.

VISITATION OF THE SICK: Inform the Church Office when someone is sick, shut-in or hospitalized and unable to attend Mass.

FUNERALS: Inform the Church Office as soon as possible when someone in the family dies, preferably before contacting the funeral home.



Religious Education

The mission of OLPH's Religious Education program is to bring the "Good News" of God's love to all children and their families and to call them to commit their lives to Christ. Religious Education is available for children in Kindergarten through adults. We encourage parents to be parishioners of OLPH when registering students for Religious Education classes. Census forms can be obtained from the Parish Office during regular business hours, on the Welcome Table located in the back of church or you can register online. SUNDAY LITURGY OF THE WORD: Children in grades K-2nd are invited with a catechist during 11:00 a.m. Mass to the Day Chapel for the Liturgy of the Word for Children (September-May). A summary of the readings of the day is discussed on their level.

PARISH SCHOOL OF RELIGION: Our PSR program is divided in two parts. Family Faith Formation is the "academic" part with the textbook discussed at home as a family. Our Encountering Engaging Events are a chance to come together as a community to worship together, do crafts, or engage in traditional events like our Nativity Play and Living Way of the Cross.

HIGH SCHOOL OF RELIGION: Students in 9th through 12th grade not attending a Catholic High School are offered Faith Formation with academics at home, working at their own pace, but also some time to get together to discuss what they have learned with their peers about three times a year. It is intended to be an informal study with honest Catholic answers.

RCIA: Are you or someone you know interested in becoming Catholic or completing Sacraments? Please join our RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). We have a Year-Round RCIA process that you can enter into whenever you are ready. This is for you if you have never been baptized, if you have been baptized into another denomination and now want to become Catholic, or if you are an adult Catholic but have never been confirmed. Sessions will be held in person on Tuesday evenings at 7:30 p.m. (day and time can be adjusted to personal schedules). 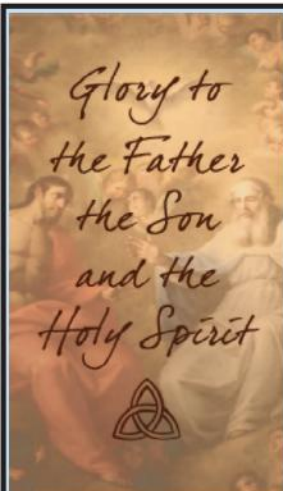

Three-in-One Love

When I was much younger, I used to think that God was totally invisible, not to be experienced as the people in the bible did. After all, they heard God's voice in the fiery cloud; they saw the waters parted so they could pass through—all the things that Moses talks about in the first reading. But then I ask myself, do I want my faith to be based on special effects? Or do I want to trust Jesus, who told Thomas, "Blessed are they who have not seen and have believed." (Jn 20:29)

Jesus was referring to his resurrection appearances, but it also applies to the Holy Trinity. When we see a newborn child, she can remind us of God the Father creating the earth and all living things. When we see the cross, we recall Jesus saving death and resurrection. When we share our faith with someone, we know that it is the Holy Spirit who gives us the words to speak and the courage to speak them. Seeing God's work around us, we can still experience God in Three Persons.

The three are not just equal parts of God, one-third of God each. No, they each are totally God. That is why we say God is love: Three infinite Persons are united in one substance or being, so the love they have for each other is infinite. The actions that show each Person's qualities are not done by that person alone. Everything God does is done by all three Persons. So you could say that everything the Trinity does, is done out of love. Tom Schmidt

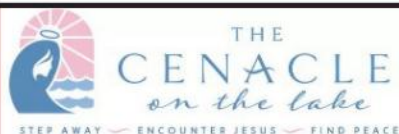

NOTE: Mass intentions can be scheduled for weekday and weekend Masses. Some guidelines include:

- Each weekend, one Mass is reserved for "All Parishioners' Intentions."
- Only one intention can be offered at each Weekday Mass, except for Holy Days of Obligations that fall during the week.
- Mass can be said for an individual (e.g. "John Smith"), a married couple ("Joe and Mary Smith") or a family (e.g. "The Smith Family").

Solemnity of the Holy Trinity



Straight Talk

The Deepest Mystery

One of the most popular genres in literature and cinema centers on mystery: Who done it? How did that happen? Why did that happen? These questions seek understanding. We human beings have an innate desire for knowledge, truth, and wisdom. Such a desire moves us to ask questions about the world, self, other, and ultimately about God. The mind is restless, irritated, until it can be at peace through truth - the illumination of the mind to what is real, and the Really Real.

The Christian Adventure involves the "mind's search for God" (St. Bonaventure), with faith providing the first step. This Adventure of "faith seeking understanding" (St. Anselm), must avoid being "deceived through an unreasonable and misguided love of reason." (St. Augustine). For the Christian adventurer, the journey is one in which one believes in order to understand, not understanding in order to believe. For faith is the Gift that lights the road ahead, and uncovers those dimensions which are veiled to reason alone. It is the complementary oneness of faith and reason that unveils, never fully, the Truth (1Cor 13: 8-13).

Jesus tells Pilate, "I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice" (Jn 18: 37). Pilate's dismissive response, "What is truth?" (Jn18: 38), represents the persistent response of the world influenced by Satan, "a liar and the father of lies" (Jn 8: 44). For Pilate, truth is determined through the "will to power" (Nietzsche). By contrast, the silent, powerless One testifies to the truth - the power of love: "...take heart I have overcome the world" (Jn 16:33). Centuries later, St. Augustine would express it this way: "...the essence of Christian truth is to be dramatic, to be an encounter cast in dramatic form between God revealing and man responding." In the Gospel of John, this encounter - revealing and responding - takes place from the Cross in which Jesus, the Son of the Father, completes his mission (4: 34), and "handed over the spirit [Holy Spirit]" (19: 30). It is from the Cross that God's name is unveiled and confirmed by the Spirit of Truth (16: 13-15).

Who is the God revealed from the Cross? "God is love" (1Jn 4: 7-21). God's name, His essence, is a Trinity of Persons, a Divine community, distinct in personhood, and perfectly one in Being (the Son of God, consubstantial with the Father, and the Holy Spirit, who proceeds from the Father and the Son is adored and glorified [Nicene Creed]). This distinction in personhood and oneness in Being, affirms that God is One and NOT three separate Gods (CCC, No. 253).

How is this distinction of Persons and oneness in Being as Love manifested? The Father's love is expressed as the "creator of heaven and earth"; the Son's love is revealed in the Word becoming flesh, and through his crucifixion and resurrection; and the Holy Spirit as, "the Lord, the giver of life". In effect, the distinctive ways in which the Divine Love is manifested are - creative (Gen: 1-3), redeeming (1Pt 2: 29), and sanctifying (Heb 12: 14).

The Trinitarian God is more than a Church dogma. It is existential. The Tri-unity God reminds us Whose we are, and who we are. The creative love of the Father calls us into existence and destines us for eternal blessedness; the redeeming love from the Son opens the way to eternal life; and the indwelling Holy Spirit sanctifies and guides our earthly pilgrimage home.

Whose are we? We belong to the Triune God who is LOVE, both NOW and into ETERNITY.
