**SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM**: Baptisms are usually celebrated on the fourth Sunday of the month during the 10:30 a.m. Mass. To begin the process, parents are encouraged to go to our website at <a href="www.olphbc.org">www.olphbc.org</a> to access the forms under Sacraments and return the forms by email or drop off at the Church Office. Parents and godparents are required to attend a seminar prior to the Baptism. The Baptismal Seminar is held on the third Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Church Day Chapel. If you need more information or have questions, call the Rectory at (504) 394-0314 or email <a href="mailto:cre@olphbc.org">cre@olphbc.org</a>.

**SACRAMENT OF FIRST COMMUNION**: First Eucharist is celebrated the first Saturday of May for students in the 2nd grade or above. Children older than 2nd grade will be prepared on individual situations. The Sacrament of Reconciliation must be celebrated prior to Communion.

**SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION**: Confirmation is celebrated in the Fall of 11th grade. Candidates who attend Catholic high school or are enrolled in the High School of Religion program come together for Sacramental preparation. All candidates are asked to pre-register in their freshmen year and no later than December of their 10th grade year. Information and registration can be found on our website: **www.olphbc.org**.

**SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:** Contact the Church Office at least nine months prior to the planned date. No other arrangements should be made before contacting the Church Office.

### **Religious Education**

The mission of OLPH's Religious Education program is to bring the "Good News" of God's love to all children and

their families and to call them to commit their lives to Christ. Religious Education is available for children in Kindergarten through adults. We encourage parents to be parishioners of OLPH when registering students for Religious Education classes. Census forms can be obtained from the Parish Office during regular business hours, on the Welcome Table located in the back of church or you can register online. Call the Church Office at (504) 394-0314, or email **cre@olphbc.org** for more information.

**SUNDAY LITURGY OF THE WORD:** Children in grades K-2nd are invited with a catechist during 10:30 a.m. Mass to the Day Chapel for the Liturgy of the Word for Children (September-May). A summary of the readings of the day is discussed on their level.

**PARISH SCHOOL OF RELIGION:** Our PSR program is divided in two parts. Family Faith Formation is the "academic" part with the textbook discussed at home as a family. Our Encountering Engaging Events are a chance to come together as a community to worship together, do crafts, or engage in traditional events like our Nativity Play and Living Way of the Cross.

HIGH SCHOOL OF RELIGION: Students in 9th through 12th grade not attending a Catholic High School are offered Faith Formation with academics at home, working at their own pace, but also some time to get together to discuss what they have learned with their peers about three times a year. It is intended to be an informal study with honest Catholic answers.

RCIA: Are you or someone you know interested in becoming Catholic or completing Sacraments? Please join our RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). We have a Year-Round RCIA process that you can enter into whenever you are ready. This is for you if you have never been baptized, if you have been baptized into another denomination and now want to become Catholic, or if you are an adult Catholic but have never been confirmed. Sessions will be held in person with day and time to be adjusted to personal schedules. For additional information and to register, contact the Church Office or email cre@olphbc.org.



### **Blessings and Glory**

The second reading from Ephesians is rather long and with only six sentences, it is not easy to follow. If you take it apart, you see that Paul is very encouraging. He is giving a description of the many blessings God has given us.

He says that we are chosen by God and destined for spiritual blessings: First is Redemption, meaning that Christ saved us from punishment for our sins by forgiving them instead. Second is the plan of God for saving everyone, by making Christ ruler of the universe. We have to accept these gifts by letting go of the temptations around us and holding on to the love we have received from God. The things of the world, possessions, wealth, or power that pretend to make us happy are replaced with love of God; we then share that love with others, so that they know God loves them, too. As our experience of God's love grows, we begin to understand the mystery of how God lives in all people. Another blessing Paul notes is adoption by God to a new relationship as brothers and sisters of Christ; holiness is now for all believers, not just priests or religious.

Paul also reminds us that we are chosen and destined to help God bring his plan, his Kingdom, to completion. When we teach children how to love and share, when we are honest with customers or suppliers, when we are not ashamed to show our faith in Jesus, when we are respectful of the poor, elderly, or disabled, we are slowly building the Kingdom of God, or as Paul says, "to bring all things together in heaven and on earth under Christ" (Eph 1:10) Paul mentions three times in this reading about "the praise of God's glory." (Eph 1:14) When we are able to help or forgive, or just be a good example to others, we want them to know that God is in all the good we do. Instead of taking credit for the results, we give God the glory. No, you don't have to take off your glasses and put on a red cape before helping others. Just mention that God does the real work, we just try not to get in his way. Tom Schmidt

### The Fifteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time



Straight Talk by: Father William Maestri **Human Dignity: Gender Theory** and Surrogacy

The parts of the Vatican document which has drawn the most at tention, and the most push back, both pro and con, concerns "gender theory" and surrogacy. As "to any sex-change intervention, as a rule, risks threatening the unique dignity the person has received from the moment of conception". The document makes a distinction between gender-affirming surgeries (rejected), and "genital abnormalities" either at birth or develop later. Such ab-

normalities can be "resolved" by the appropriate health care professionals.

The document goes on, in a teaching and pastoral vein, to indicate that "every sign of unjust discrimination is to be carefully avoided, particularly any form of aggression and violence." Furthermore, it [unjust discrimination] should be denounced as contrary to human dignity the face that, in some places, not a few people are imprisoned, tortured, and even deprived of the good of life solely because of their sexual orientation."

The document in addressing the issue of surrogacy, affirmed the traditional teaching: "[it is] a grave violation of the dignity of the woman and the child.... A child is always a gift and never the basis of a commercial contract.... Every human life, beginning with that of the unborn child in its mother's womb, cannot be suppressed, nor become an object of commoditv." The document echoes the teaching of the Church formally expressed by the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith: "Surrogate motherhood represents an objective failure to meet the obligations of maternal love, of conjugal fidelity and responsible motherhood, it offends the dignity and right of the child to be conceived, carried, ...brought into the world and brought up by his own parents...". The Catechism recognizes the suffering experienced by childless couples: "Spouses to whom God has not granted children can have a conjugal life full of meaning.... Their marriage can radiate a fruitfulness of charity, of hospitality, and of sacrifice. (CCC, No.1654).

An authentic teaching must be pastoral, that is, the Church must be with and for those spouses in pain. There must be a genuine solidarity, what Pope Francis terms, "Accompaniment", that is, a journeying with others. He uses the episode of the two disciples on the road to Emmaus (Lk 24: 13-35): "We need a Church capable of walking at people's side, of doing more than simply listening to them, a Church which accompanies them on their journey, a Church able to make sense of the "night" ...[like] Jesus warmed the hearts of the disciples of Emmaus.... Are we still a Church capable of warming hearts?"

To be such a Church, we must constantly bid the "Stranger", "Stay with us...the day is almost over." (Lk 13: 29).
