#### **Sacraments**













SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Baptisms are usually celebrated on the fourth Sunday of the month during the 10:30 a.m. Mass. To begin the process, parents are encouraged to go to our website at <a href="www.olphbc.org">www.olphbc.org</a> to access the forms under Sacraments and return the forms by email or drop off at the Church Office. Parents and godparents are required to attend a seminar prior to the Baptism. The Baptismal Seminar is held on the third Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Church Day Chapel. If you need more information or have questions, call the Rectory at (504) 394-0314 or email <a href="mailto:cre@olphbc.org">cre@olphbc.org</a>.

**SACRAMENT OF FIRST COMMUNION**: First Eucharist is celebrated the first Saturday of May for students in the 2nd grade or above. Children older than 2nd grade will be prepared on individual situations. The Sacrament of Reconciliation must be celebrated prior to Communion.

**SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION**: Confirmation is celebrated in the Fall of 11th grade. Candidates who attend Catholic high school or are enrolled in the High School of Religion program come together for Sacramental preparation. All candidates are asked to pre-register in their freshmen year and no later than December of their 10th grade year. Information and registration can be found on our website: **www.olphbc.org**.

**SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:** Contact the Church Office at least nine months prior to the planned date. No other arrangements should be made before contacting the Church Office.

## Religious Education

## **Religious Education**

The mission of OLPH's Religious Education program is to bring the "Good News" of God's love to all children and

their families and to call them to commit their lives to Christ. Religious Education is available for children in Kindergarten through adults. We encourage parents to be parishioners of OLPH when registering students for Religious Education classes. Census forms can be obtained from the Parish Office during regular business hours, on the Welcome Table located in the back of church or you can register online. **SUNDAY LITURGY OF THE WORD:** Children in grades K-2nd are invited with a catechist during 10:30 a.m. Mass to the Day Chapel for the Liturgy of the Word for Children (September-May). A summary of the readings of the day is discussed on their level.

PARISH SCHOOL OF RELIGION: Our PSR program is divided in two parts. Family Faith Formation is the "academic" part with the textbook discussed at home as a family. Our Encountering Engaging Events are a chance to come together as a community to worship together, do crafts, or engage in traditional events like our Nativity Play and Living Way of the Cross.

HIGH SCHOOL OF RELIGION: Students in 9th through 12th grade not attending a Catholic High School are offered Faith Formation with academics at home, working at their own pace, but also some time to get together to discuss what they have learned with their peers about three times a year. It is intended to be an informal study with honest Catholic answers.

RCIA: Are you or someone you know interested in becoming Catholic or completing Sacraments? Please join our RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). We have a Year-Round RCIA process that you can enter into whenever you are ready. This is for you if you have never been baptized, if you have been baptized into another denomination and now want to become Catholic, or if you are an adult Catholic but have never been confirmed. Sessions will be held in person with day and time to be adjusted to personal schedules. For additional information and to register, contact the Church Office or email cre@olphbc.org.

#### **Wise Fools**

When we were in high school, when we were in high school, we learned that the word sophomore came from Greek words

meaning "wise fools." The idea was that the second year student thinks he knows it all now, but still has a lot to learn. The first two readings invite us to a banquet of wisdom. Jesus says he himself is the way to understanding God's will; he gives himself as food and drink for eternal life. So how will we accept these invitations to partake of the Wisdom of God?

One way is to read the scriptures every day, taking time to think and pray about what you read. Don't do all the talking; let God have his chance to be heard. The gospels are especially good "food" because of all the examples Jesus gave in his sermons and parables. Listen to the readings and homily at Mass. The Pastor may have some insights that make you think. Receive communion often to be fed with the living Bread. The Church has always taught that we are fed with both the word and the Eucha-

If we want to grow in God's wisdom, we have to exercise our faith. If you have a friend or relative who is a good example of faith, talk with that person about how you experience God or your lack of experiences. You could offer to be a sponsor for someone in the RCIA, and help someone else's faith to grow. Your parish or diocese may also have on-line resources or discussions. God never forces himself on anyone. To grow in his Wisdom, we have to accept it. Ask him for real food and you won't be disappointed. But be patient, God only gives what we are ready to receive. ## Straight Talk by: Father William Maestri Handwriting: **Now and Forever**

The "thrill of victory and the agony of defeat", are not confined to Jim McKay's Wide World of Sports, nor to Michelangelo's Sistine Chapel. There once was such a thrill and agony that came to the everyday folk who waited by the mailbox for that special card or letter. The anticipation of its arrival was our own special agony - "not today, maybe tomorrow", and or ecstasy - "it's here, it came!", as we went running to that sacred space reserved for unveiling the mystery and soaking in the grace. And wonder of wonders - it was HANDWRITTEN!

In the long ago, one's initiation to formal education involved a new No. 2 pencil, an unmarked tablet made of paper, and the task of "writing legibly within the lines". Such was one of the first lessons for the writing of one's CHARAC-TER. Namely, good penmanship and a good moral character require respect for BOUNDARIES, BORDERS, and LIM-ITS. Writing requires DISCIPLINE of mind and hand; thoughts that were thoughtful, call for a hand trained in forming the alphabet correctly. Good penmanship and character are skills acquired, much like virtue, through PRACTICE, the joining of mind and hand nurtured by PERSISTENCE. Writing serves as the "Golden Mean" (Aristotle), which moderates the passions and rash judgements. One learns the cardinal virtue of Temperance - fine tuning the soul.

While smart boards and smart phones have replaced chalkboards and snail mail, there has been a "Renaissance", "a rebirth", of appreciation for and usage of snail mail, as well as the need for handwriting with a pencil on paper. A number of recent studies have indicated that handwriting improves various parts of the brain associated with early learning, creativity, memory, and motor skills necessary for lifelong well-being.

Professor Sophia Vinci Booker's research indicates: "Your fingers have to each do something different to produce a recognizable letter.... Letter recognition in early childhood is ...one of the best predictors of later reading and math attainment." (Professor Booker is an educational neuroscientist at Vanderbilt University.). Professor Robert Wiley, a cognitive psychologist at the University of North Carolina, Greensboro, concurs, "[handwriting] lets you make associations between your body and what you're seeing and hearing". Such associations can serve to provide a greater understanding of a concept or idea. When the dust settles on all the research one thing is clear: the "good Sisters" were right, handwriting mat-

Some might say, "Socrates and Jesus didn't write books." True enough. But they had great secretaries: Plato, Mark, Matthew, Luke and John! Without them, we would know little to nothing about the philosopher and the Savior.

Sorry, need to go. I have to finish the next HANDWRITTEN column!

P.S. Recently (6/17/2024), an account of Jesus' birth and childhood (Infancy Gospel of Thomas, noncanonical) was rediscovered and translated. It had been ignored for hundreds of years. Why? Penmanship experts indicated that it was because of BAD PENMANSHIP!


