Sacraments



SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Baptisms are usually celebrated on the fourth Sunday of the month during the 10:30 a.m. Mass. To begin the process, parents are encouraged to go to our website at **www.olphbc.org** to access the forms under Sacraments and return the forms by email or drop off at the Church Office. Parents and godparents are required to attend a seminar prior to the Baptism. The Baptismal Seminar is held on the third Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Church Day Chapel. If you need more information or have questions, call the Rectory at (504) 394-0314 or email **cre@olphbc.org**.

SACRAMENT OF FIRST COMMUNION: First Eucharist is celebrated the first Saturday of May for students in the 2nd grade or above. Children older than 2nd grade will be prepared on individual situations. The Sacrament of Reconciliation must be celebrated prior to Communion.

SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION: Confirmation is celebrated in the Fall of 11th grade. Candidates who attend Catholic high school or are enrolled in the High School of Religion program come together for Sacramental preparation. All candidates are asked to pre-register in their freshmen year and no later than December of their 10th grade year. Information and registration can be found on our website: **www.olphbc.org**.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: Contact the Church Office at least nine months prior to the planned date. No other arrangements should be made before contacting the Church Office.

VISITATION OF THE SICK: Inform the Church Office when someone is sick, shut-in or hospitalized and unable to attend Mass.

FUNERALS: Inform the Church Office as soon as possible when someone in the family dies, preferably before contacting the funeral home.

Religious Education

Religious Education

The mission of OLPH's Religious Education program is to bring the "Good News" of God's love to all children and

their families and to call them to commit their lives to Christ. Religious Education is available for children in Kindergarten through adults. We encourage parents to be parishioners of OLPH when registering students for Religious Education classes. Census forms can be obtained from the Parish Office during regular business hours, on the Welcome Table located in the back of church or you can register online. Call the Church Office at (504) 394-0314, or email **cre@olphbc.org** for more information.

SUNDAY LITURGY OF THE WORD: Children in grades K-2nd are invited with a catechist during 10:30 a.m. Mass to the Day Chapel for the Liturgy of the Word for Children (September-May). A summary of the readings of the day is discussed on their level.

PARISH SCHOOL OF RELIGION: Our PSR program is divided in two parts. Family Faith Formation is the "academic" part with the textbook discussed at home as a family. Our Encountering Engaging Events are a chance to come together as a community to worship together, do crafts, or engage in traditional events like our Nativity Play and Living Way of the Cross.

HIGH SCHOOL OF RELIGION: Students in 9th through 12th grade not attending a Catholic High School are offered Faith Formation with academics at home, working at their own pace, but also some time to get together to discuss what they have learned with their peers about three times a year. It is intended to be an informal study with honest Catholic answers.

RCIA: Are you or someone you know interested in becoming Catholic or completing Sacraments? Please join our RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). We have a Year-Round RCIA process that you can enter into whenever you are ready. This is for you if you have never been baptized, if you have been baptized into another denomination and now want to become Catholic, or if you are an adult Catholic but have never been confirmed. Sessions will be held in person with day and time to be adjusted to personal schedules. For additional information and to register, contact the Church Office or email cre@olphbc.org.

Royal Treatment — St. James is exaggerating a little when he describes how people might greet visitors or new members in the church. Hopefully, no one was that obvious at treating wealthy members better than poor ones. Sadly, prejudice is a sin that is just as prevalent today as it was 2000 years ago. Today we have laws for business and government to prevent prejudice. But the subtler forms of judging people by their race, clothing, speech, religion, etc. sometimes hide behind patriotism, faith, or the desire to protect our families. So how can we stop it?

One reason for prejudice is ignorance. Some people will believe anything they hear or read, especially if they see it on the internet. When you get an e-mail that says "true Americans" are white, English-speaking Christians, there is probably some prejudice behind it. The only way to fight ignorance is with the truth. Jesus himself said the truth will set you free. (Jn 8:32) He ignored the laws/traditions that said you cannot associate with unclean people, Gentiles, or sinners. He told us that God loves all people, even sinners, so what right do we have to judge someone just because they are different?

A second reason for prejudice is fear. We are told that certain neighborhoods are dangerous. Or an older adult sees three teenage boys walking down the street and because of her fear, she thinks they could be gang members. Sometimes fear stops us from helping the needy. But remember how many times Jesus tells us in the gospels, "Do not be afraid." If we can learn to see Christ in all peoples, regardless of their race or lifestyle, we are beginning to leave prejudice behind. If we teach our children to respect the poor, the disabled, the homeless, we can help them to understand what James meant about God choosing the "poor in the eyes of the world to be rich in faith and to inherit the kingdom." (Jas 2:5)

The Twenty-Third Sunday of Ordinary Time



Straight Talk

Change of Seasons

Those "lazy, hazy, crazy days (daze) of summer" are slowly giving way to the UPS brown of autumn's shameful undressing of summer's greenery.

Reluctantly, I (we?) put away the shorts, tank tops, flipflops, sun screen, ice cooler, and bug repellent. Out comes long sleeve shirts, pants, jackets, and a new hat from Meyer the Hatter.

The "Boys of Summer" vacate the diamond to make room for Bears, Falcons, Lions and what else - SAINTS!

The summer wind that comes blowing in from across the Gulf changes direction and comes howling down from our Canadian "neighbors". Unfortunately, there is no wall so high to repel this seasonal invasion.

The Bible gives us fair warning: "There is an appointed time for everything, and a time for every affair [season] under the heavens." (Ecc 3:2).

If there is a silver lining in the dark winter clouds, it belongs to those suffering from football deprivation. Their "dark night of the soul" (St. John of the Cross), has given way to tailgating, football pools, and the weekly agony/ecstasy known only to the congregation of "gotta believe" fans.

Does all this mean that for the next six months a goodly number will be SAD - Seasonal Affective Disorder (Depression)? No. At least it need not be. Even though the sun is lower and the nights are longer, this shut-in time contains its own silver lining - "a time to give birth...to plant; ...to gather...to seek...a time to be silent...". (Ecc 3:1-8). It can be a time to properly love ourselves by BEFRIENDING SOLITUDE. We can periodically enjoy a brief retreat from the "buzz, bang, and boom", of our "normal" days. The long silent nights can shun the TV and computer screens. The hearing of noisy distractions can be replaced by a blessed listening: "Deep call to deep". (Ps 42:7).

Granted such solitude and listening can be frightening. It is safer to be "up and doing". In the story of Martha and Mary (Lk 10:38-42), at first blush we admire Mary but we are more comfortable with Martha. However, Jesus' evaluation is worth considering.

Jesus is welcomed and shown hospitality by Martha. She goes all out to make a good impression. However, her sister, Mary, "has left [Martha] to do all the serving". Jesus seems to be indifferent to Martha's plight: "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me by myself to do the serving?"

Martha's SELF-INFLICTED situation IS of concern to Jesus. His response is an <u>invitation</u> to concern herself with the things that really matter: genuine hospitality is PERSON-CENTERED, the "serving" is an expression of welcome. Unfortunately, Martha's hospitality is a performance as a gracious hostess. By so doing, her part will be fleeting, replaced by Martha's next self-exhibition.


By contrast, Mary's hospitality is <u>internal</u>, that is, her welcoming of Jesus is through a listening heart. Martha's preparation and serving ARE important, but NOT ultimately so. It is Jesus' Person and words that are "Spirit and Life" (Jn 6:63). Such is "the better part and it will not be taken from her." (Lk 10:42).

And such will NOT be taken from US!
