Sacraments











SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Baptisms are usually celebrated on the fourth Sunday of the month during the 10:30 a.m. Mass. To begin the process, parents are encouraged to go to our website at www.olphbc.org to access the forms under Sacraments and return the forms by email or drop off at the Church Office. Parents and godparents are required to attend a seminar prior to the Baptism. The Baptismal Seminar is held on the third Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Church Day Chapel. If you need more information or have questions, call the Rectory at (504) 394-0314 or email cre@olphbc.org.

SACRAMENT OF FIRST COMMUNION: First Eucharist is celebrated the first Saturday of May for students in the 2nd grade or above. Children older than 2nd grade will be prepared on individual situations. The Sacrament of Reconciliation must be celebrated prior to Communion.

SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION: Confirmation is celebrated in the Fall of 11th grade. Candidates who attend Catholic high school or are enrolled in the High School of Religion program come together for Sacramental preparation. All candidates are asked to pre-register in their freshmen year and no later than December of their 10th grade year. Information and registration can be found on our website: **www.olphbc.org**.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: Contact the Church Office at least nine months prior to the planned date. No other arrangements should be made before contacting the Church Office.

VISITATION OF THE SICK: Inform the Church Office when someone is sick, shut-in or hospitalized and unable to attend Mass.

FUNERALS: Inform the Church Office as soon as possible when someone in the family dies, preferably before contacting the funeral home.

Religious Education



The mission of OLPH's Religious Education program is to bring the "Good News" of God's love to all children and

their families and to call them to commit their lives to Christ. Religious Education is available for children in Kindergarten through adults. We encourage parents to be parishioners of OLPH when registering students for Religious Education classes. Census forms can be obtained from the Parish Office during regular business hours, on the Welcome Table located in the back of church or you can register online. SUNDAY LITURGY OF THE WORD: Children in grades K-2nd are invited with a catechist during 10:30 a.m. Mass to the Day Chapel for the Liturgy of the Word for Children (September-May). A summary of the readings of the day is discussed on their level.

PARISH SCHOOL OF RELIGION: Our PSR program is divided in two parts. Family Faith Formation is the "academic" part with the textbook discussed at home as a family. Our Encountering Engaging Events are a chance to come together as a community to worship together, do crafts, or engage in traditional events like our Nativity Play and Living Way of the Cross.

HIGH SCHOOL OF RELIGION: Students in 9th through 12th grade not attending a Catholic High School are offered Faith Formation with academics at home, working at their own pace, but also some time to get together to discuss what they have learned with their peers about three times a year. It is intended to be an informal study with honest Catholic answers.

RCIA: Are you or someone you know interested in becoming Catholic or completing Sacraments? Please join our RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). We have a Year-Round RCIA process that you can enter into whenever you are ready. This is for you if you have never been baptized, if you have been baptized into another denomination and now want to become Catholic, or if you are an adult Catholic but have never been confirmed. Sessions will be held in person with day and time to be adjusted to personal schedules. For additional information and to register, contact the Church Office or email cre@olphbc.org.






Pope Francis' Prayer Intentions for 2024 October—For a Shared Mission



Great Service

In Mark's gospel, he has a short description of the Last Supper, without the washing of the disciples' feet found in the gospel of John. Today's passage has a similar message. While James and John seem to be close friends of Jesus, they obviously have not learned what it means to

follow him. But they think this is the time to ask for their share in the glory of Jesus' Kingdom.

Jesus doesn't make any promises of worldly glory, but he does promise a share in his suffering. When he goes on to remind them of how Gentiles rule over people, they probably thought he was going to let them do the same. Imagine their surprise when he told them that the greatest of them would be the ones who served the rest.

They still did not understand that Jesus had to suffer and die to complete his life mission. They probably did not know what Jesus meant about their being baptized in death as Jesus would. But then how many people today know that leadership is a form of service? Whether you are head of a family, or of a nation, you were given that authority by God. And God expects leaders to not only direct those under them, but inspire and encourage them to do better. Parents do more than correct their children: They also guide them, love them, protect them, and sometimes even let them learn from their mistakes.

This connection of leadership and service is all inclusive. A manager is called to help his employees do their jobs better, not by badgering, but by giving the support they need. Government leaders are called to serve all constituents, not just the ones who donate to their election fund. Military leaders must support their troops with respect as well as discipline. God calls Church leaders in a special way to service of their flock: to protect the weakest members, to give an example of Jesus' love to all, and to be open to the movement of the Holy Spirit in both clergy and laity. Anyone who lives a life of loving service can be "greatest" in the Kingdom of God.



The Twenty-Ninth Sunday of Ordinary Time



Straight Talk

Confirmation:
Come Holy Spirit!

Pope Benedict XVI, addressed those attending the 2008 World Youth Day with these words: "The Holy Spirit has been in some ways the neglected person of the Blessed Trinity. A clear understanding of the Spirit almost seems beyond our reach."

God, the Blessed Trinity, IS beyond our capacity to <u>fully</u> understand. The infinite God cannot be comprehended by our finite, limited rational powers. However, through Divine Revelation, the free, loving self-disclosure by God, we can come to know God

through the gift of Faith building on natural reason (CCC, No. 50).

Pope Benedict seems to be saying our neglect of the Holy Spirit results from or inability to obtain a "clear understanding" of the Holy Spirit. In effect, he seems to be indicating our neglect of the Spirit results from a kind of spiritual and intellectual weariness (akedia).

This condition of neglect and weariness does <u>not</u> seem to affect the Father and the Son. The obvious question: Why is this so? Among the reasons: the name itself Holy Ghost/Spirit, conjures up cartoonish characters (Casper the Friendly Ghost); in a more sinister way, ghosts can be vengeful, possessive, and associated with the occult/Satanic; calling forth the dead (spiritualism) is associated with fraud and deception; and the "Personhood" of the Holy Spirit, unlike Father and Son, is more foreign to our experience of person as a flesh and blood being.

There is a challenge beyond those listed above. The Bible, when speaking of The Holy Spirit, does so with images - wind (Gen 1:2), fire (Acts 2:3), breath (Jn 20:22), and a dove (Mt 3:16) - and various roles - witness (Jn 1: 32-4), truth (Jn 16: 12-15), life (2 Cor 3:6), convicting (Jn 16: 8-11), and tutoring (Jn 14:26). These images and functions do not give us a <u>definition</u> of the Holy Spirit. This is on purpose. For a definition <u>limits</u> the entity defined. It indicates what a thing is and is <u>not</u>. However, as Jesus tells Nicodemus: "The wind [Spirit] blows where it wills...you do not know where it comes from or where it goes." (Jn 3:8). In effect, the Holy Spirit cannot be confined by the limits of space, time, and language. There is no part of creation that is a Spirit-free zone.

If the Holy Spirit is neglected and misunderstood, so is Confirmation. To many, Confirmation is optional, a "second Baptism", or a kind of "rite of passage". Confirmation is NONE of these. The <u>Catechism of the Catholic Church</u> teaches: "Baptism, the Eucharist, and Confirmation together constitute ...'Christian initiation'... [their] unity must be safeguarded...the reception of the sacrament of Confirmation is necessary for completion of baptismal grace." (CCC, No. 1285). Confirmation effects what it signifies: a deepening of union with the Church; enrichment by the Holy Spirit (the Gifts of the Holy Spirit); the courage to <u>daily witness</u> that Jesus is Lord (Phil 2:11); and to share the Christian faith.

The last words of Jesus to the disciples just before the Ascension were: "...you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses...to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1:8). With each new assembly of confirmed witnesses, the light shines in the darkness, a fallen world is renewed, and a hope beyond hope carries us foreword.

To all to be Confirmed: May the Holy Spirit, the Lord and Giver of Life, fill your whole being with Wisdom, Understanding, Knowledge, Counsel, Fortitude, Piety, and Fear (Awe) of the Lord.

Go forth in the Holy Spirit into your everyday world, and bring the Gospel, Good News of Truth, that God is LOVE and drives out all fear; God is HOPE so you may face today and tomorrow; and God is FAITH so you may see His presence in all things and in all people. Amen.
