### **Sacraments**















SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Baptisms are usually celebrated on the fourth Sunday of the month during the 10:30 a.m. Mass. Due to demand, some months may be eliminated or another day or time may be chosen by the family if it is available on the church schedule of events." To begin the process, parents are encouraged to go to our website at www.olphbc.org to access the forms under Sacraments and return the forms by email or drop off at the Church Office. Parents and godparents are required to attend a seminar prior to the Baptism. The Baptismal Seminar is held on the third Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Church Day Chapel. If you need more information or have questions, call the Rectory at (504) 394-0314 or email cre@olphbc.org.

SACRAMENT OF FIRST COMMUNION: First Eucharist is celebrated the first Saturday of May for students in the 2nd grade or above. Children older than 2nd grade will be prepared on individual situations. The Sacrament of Reconciliation must be celebrated prior to Communion.

**SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION**: Confirmation is celebrated in the Fall of 11th grade. Candidates who attend Catholic high school or are enrolled in the High School of Religion program come together for Sacramental preparation. All candidates are asked to pre-register in their freshmen year and no later than December of their 10th grade year. Information and registration can be found on our website: www.olphbc.org.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: Contact the Church Office at least nine months prior to the planned date. No other arrangements should be made before contacting the Church Office.

VISITATION OF THE SICK: Inform the Church Office when someone is sick, shut-in or hospitalized and unable to attend Mass.

FUNERALS: Inform the Church Office as soon as possible when someone in the family dies, preferably before contacting the funeral home.

# Religious Education

# **Religious Education**

The mission of OLPH's Religious Education program is to bring the "Good News" of God's love to all children and

their families and to call them to commit their lives to Christ. Religious Education is available for children in Kindergarten through adults. We encourage parents to be parishioners of OLPH when registering students for Religious Education classes. Census forms can be obtained from the Parish Office during regular business hours, on the Welcome Table located in the back of church or you can register online. Call the Church Office at (504) 394-0314, or email **cre**(a)**olphbc.org** for more information.

SUNDAY LITURGY OF THE WORD: Children in grades K-2nd are invited with a catechist during 10:30 a.m. Mass to the Day Chapel for the Liturgy of the Word for Children (September-May). A summary of the readings of the day is discussed on their level.

PARISH SCHOOL OF RELIGION: Our PSR program is divided in two parts. Family Faith Formation is the "academic" part with the textbook discussed at home as a family. Our Encountering Engaging Events are a chance to come together as a community to worship together, do crafts, or engage in traditional events like our Nativity Play and Living Way of the Cross.

HIGH SCHOOL OF RELIGION: Students in 9th through 12th grade not attending a Catholic High School are offered Faith Formation with academics at home, working at their own pace, but also some time to get together to discuss what they have learned with their peers about three times a year. It is intended to be an informal study with honest Catholic answers.

**RCIA:** Are you or someone you know interested in becoming Catholic or completing Sacraments? Please join our RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). We have a Year-Round RCIA process that you can enter into whenever you are ready. This is for you if you have never been baptized, if you have been baptized into another denomination and now want to become Catholic, or if you are an adult Catholic but have never been confirmed. Sessions will be held in person with day and time to be adjusted to personal schedules. For additional information and to register, contact the Church Office or email cre@olphbc.org.

# Patty's Peace




In September, 2024, the parish lost a 150-200 year old oak tree. It had stress and termite damage and we had no choice but to cut it down. A sobering moment turned into a delight when a parishioner was passing by and saw the tree being cut down. David Vallot started doing wood work as a hobby when he retired. Just then he said, "Call it luck or Devine Intervention but I knew I would use that wood to make something." That's how the bench idea was born. A touching addition are the memorials to Fathers Jimmy Jeanfreau and Otis Young which are engraved on the back rest of the bench. David and wife Ann are originally from Thibodeaux but have been in this area since the early 1980s.

Thank you David for this beautiful donation to our parish. It will be enjoyed by many for years to come.

## Rejoicing in the Lord

In the first reading, Ezra gets a strange reaction from the people to whom he reads the book of the law. First they lie down, with faces to the ground, and then they all are weeping. Remember the background of this reading. The people of Israel had returned from exile and needed to become a unified nation. Most had never heard the



laws, so when they learned what was expected of them and realized how much of the Law they had broken, they wept from shame. Many probably didn't know that they had been breaking the law. Others might have been overwhelmed with all the requirements of the law.

Ezra and Nehemiah console the people by reminding them that their return makes this a day "holy to the Lord" (Nehemiah 8:10). He adds that they would draw strength from "rejoicing in the Lord." That may be good advice for us also.

We might find ourselves so trapped in sin that we think we could never be forgiven. We need to remember that Jesus loved sinners so much that he gave his life on the cross to free us from sin. No sin can be so bad that God's love cannot forgive it. In other words, God's forgiveness is only limited by our failure to ask for it. As the psalms say, God's mercy endures forever. In fact, the more I have to repent, the more God wants to forgive. So we can rejoice in the Lord's forgiveness and the Spirit will give us the strength to change our lives.

And what about those who find the law overwhelming? That usually means a lack of faith in God's willingness to help us or in our ability to do the best we can to live as Christians. It can also be because we have forgotten Jesus' saying that all of God's laws are contained in the command to love God and love our neighbor as we love ourselves. The more we come to accept God's presence in our lives and see God in others, the easier it becomes to keep the law of love.



Pope Francis:

'The Dangerous Plague'

On November 21,2024, Pope Francis addressing the Dicastery for Culture and Education said there is a 'dangerous plague' which is pervasive in today's world. This lethal dis-ease is known as NIHILISM. Accompanying this general mood (geist/spirit, or better, dis-spirit) is what Pope Benedict XVI termed the "dictatorship of relativism" (2005 Sermon too soon to be electors to fill the 'shoes of the Fisherman'). By this he means a philosophy which "does not recognize anything as definitive and whose ultimate

goal consists solely of one's own ego and desires." (Same 2005 sermon). The third leg of the stool is an <u>anti-metaphysical</u> perspective which denies there is an objective truth to reality (Being), which can be <u>discovered</u> by reason and not simply invented by one's will or desires (the "MY truth" approach to everyday life. See George Weigel's important book, <u>The Fragility of Order</u>, esp. pp.101-03.).

Just what is nihilism? The answer(s) are as numerous as Joseph's multicolored coat (Gen 37:3;31). For our purpose's nihilism, in its cultural, intellectual, and existential mutations, is the denial of God's existence, objective truth, a universal human nature which reveals moral principles for human flourishing, and general principles which promotes the development of a just social order and advances the common good.

Pope Francis views this Unholy Trinity (nihilism, relativism, and anti-metaphysics) in its deepest manifestations. Specifically, it is a direct attack on the theological virtue of HOPE (<u>Catechism</u>, Nos. 1817-21); a desire to "erase hope". In response to this spiritual pandemic infecting the soul, Pope Francis issued a clarion call to those entrusted with the stewardship of the educational and cultural spheres of public life.

The Pope issued a direct challenge to those in attendance: "Understand your mission in the educational and cultural fields as a call to broaden horizons, to overflow with inner vitality, to make room for possibilities unseen, to bestow the ways of the gift [Christian Tradition] that only becomes wider when it is shared." (One is reminded of the words of George Bernard Shaw: "Some men see things as they are, and say why. I dream of things that never were, and say why not." See Pope Francis, Let Us Dream.)

These stirring words of Pope Francis were meant <u>not</u> only for those present. They were directed to the Church universal. Now is the acceptable time to "awake from sleep" and seize the movement of the Spirit (Jesus' call to be watchful and awake occurs six times in Mark: Chapter 13 verses 9, 23, 33, 35, and 37). The Spirit is not confined to a particular place, time or a specific group: "The wind blows where it wills"; "so it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit." (Jn 3:8). Of special vitality are the "little platoons" of religious and civic virtue which draws one out of an isolated individualism, and buffer local communities (family, neighborhood, school, civic organizations, church) from the all-consuming reach of the state (see Edmund Burke, "Reflections on the Revolution in France", and Thomas Hobbes, LEVIATHAN).

Pope Francis closed his remarks by reminding us there is "no reason to be overwhelmed by fear...we are surrounded by such a host of witnesses [saints and sages, past and present]...let us get rid of any burden of pessimism; it is not Christian...we must not let the feeling of fear win.... Contemplating the living Christ enables us to have the courage to launch into the future."

In this Jubilee Year with its theme, 'Pilgrims of Hope', let us go forth with the life-giving waters of the Gospel for a parched world (Jn 4:14); with the food of Word and Sacrament for a world overfed and undernourished (Jn 6:35), and the Truth with Love that drives out all fear, and sets us free (1Jn 4:18; Jn 8:31-32).
