SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Baptisms are usually celebrated on the fourth Sunday of the month during the 10:30 a.m. Mass. Due to demand, some months may be eliminated or another day or time may be chosen by the family if it is available on the church schedule of events." To begin the process, parents are encouraged to go to our website at www.olphbc.org to access the forms under Sacraments and return the forms by email or drop off at the Church Office. Parents and godparents are required to attend a seminar prior to the Baptism. The Baptismal Seminar is held on the third Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Church Day Chapel. If you need more information or have questions, call the Rectory at (504) 394-0314 or email cre@olphbc.org.

SACRAMENT OF FIRST COMMUNION: First Eucharist is celebrated the first Saturday of May for students in the 2nd grade or above. Children older than 2nd grade will be prepared on individual situations. The Sacrament of Reconciliation must be celebrated prior to Communion.

SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION: Confirmation is celebrated in the Fall of 11th grade. Candidates who attend Catholic high school or are enrolled in the High School of Religion program come together for Sacramental preparation. All candidates are asked to pre-register in their freshmen year and no later than December of their 10th grade year. Information and registration can be found on our website: **www.olphbc.org**.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: Contact the Church Office at least nine months prior to the planned date. No other arrangements should be made before contacting the Church Office.

- VISITATION OF THE SICK: Inform the Church Office when someone is sick, shut-in or hospitalized and unable to attend Mass.

FUNERALS: Inform the Church Office as soon as possible when someone in the family dies, preferably before contacting the funeral home.

Religious Education

Religious Education

The mission of OLPH's Religious Education program is to bring the "Good News" of God's love to all children and

their families and to call them to commit their lives to Christ. Religious Education is available for children in Kindergarten through adults. We encourage parents to be parishioners of OLPH when registering students for Religious Education classes. Census forms can be obtained from the Parish Office during regular business hours, on the Welcome Table located in the back of church or you can register online. SUNDAY LITURGY OF THE WORD: Children in grades K-2nd are invited with a catechist during 10:30 a.m. Mass to the Day Chapel for the Liturgy of the Word for Children (September-May). A summary of the readings of the day is discussed on their level.

PARISH SCHOOL OF RELIGION: Our PSR program is divided in two parts. Family Faith Formation is the "academic" part with the textbook discussed at home as a family. Our Encountering Engaging Events are a chance to come together as a community to worship together, do crafts, or engage in traditional events like our Nativity Play and Living Way of the Cross.

HIGH SCHOOL OF RELIGION: Students in 9th through 12th grade not attending a Catholic High School are offered Faith Formation with academics at home, working at their own pace, but also some time to get together to discuss what they have learned with their peers about three times a year. It is intended to be an informal study with honest Catholic answers.

RCIA: Are you or someone you know interested in becoming Catholic or completing Sacraments? Please join our RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). We have a Year-Round RCIA process that you can enter into whenever you are ready. This is for you if you have never been baptized, if you have been baptized into another denomination and now want to become Catholic, or if you are an adult Catholic but have never been confirmed. Sessions will be held in person with day and time to be adjusted to personal schedules. For additional information and to register, contact the Church Office or email cre@olphbc.org.

days Lent is a time of reflection and renewed faith as we focus on the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. The Lenten season (Wed., March 5, 2025 - Thurs., April 17, 2025) is a valuable time where each person can deepen Lent their relationship with the Lord through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

Prayer: During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture, especially the Gospel Books (Matthew, Mark, Luke, John) and Acts of the Apostles to read about the life of Christ. Other ways to seek the Lord include:

- Praying the Rosary each day (Please join us before Mass, Saturday @ 3:25 p.m., Sundays @ 7:25 a.m. & 10:15 a.m., and Tuesday @ 6:20 p.m.)
- Attending a Mass during the week (On Fridays, there's a 7:30 a.m. Mass and 6:00 p.m. Mass, both followed by Stations of the
- Checking the myParish App for (a) daily Lent Reflections and (b) Lent with Sr. Josephine Garrett, CSFN (Wilderness icon)
- Signing up for Matthew Kelly's "Best Lent Ever (Your Spiritual Pilgrimage to Divine Mercy)" email program at www.bestlentever.com to receive daily emails of short, inspirational videos of profound spiritual insight and intensely practical ways to apply the consecration to your life. The journey will inspire you to encounter God's mercy like never before.
- Search for Lenten content and daily reflections on Formed (see App information above).
- Watching Seasons 1-4 of "The Chosen" (for free on The Chosen App), about the life and ministry of Jesus of Nazareth.
- Attend Fr. Maestri's Lenten Series on Thursdays during Lent, beginning March 6, 2025 at 7:00 p.m. in the Cafeteria.

Fasting: During Lent, we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. Many know of the tradition of abstaining from meat on Fridays during Lent, but we are also called to practice self-discipline and fast in other ways throughout the season. In addition to giving up your favorite food, have you thought about fasting from TV or Social Media?

Almsgiving: During Lent, the giving of alms is one way to share God's gifts—not only through the distribution of money or goods to the poor, but through the sharing of our time and talents. The foundational call of Christians to charity is a frequent theme of the Gospels. Some ideas include:

- Making or paying for dinner for someone you know.
- Think about helping your immediate and extended family.
- Find out which homeless shelter is nearest to you and make a donation; donate to our local St. Vincent DePaul food bank.
- Make designated care kits to offer anyone you encounter who is experiencing homelessness.

Straight Talk by: Father William Maestri The Road Ahead

[NOTE: During this Holy Season of Lent, and including Easter Sunday, this column will focus on the spiritual wisdom of St. Thomas Aquinas (1225-1274) as our spiritual director. His Holy Spirit inspired reflections are both timely and timeless for our journey with Jesus to the Cross and the Empty Tomb of Easter morning (Jn 20).]

The Gospel readings for the First Sunday of Lent is familiar to us, perhaps too familiar. Over time, they may become like a threadbare nut and bolt which no longer grips and fixes our attention. Unfortunately, the Living Word is viewed as a "heard it all before" corpse. Such is NOT the case. The Letter to the Hebrews proclaims in a straight away fashion: "Indeed, the word of God is living and effective, sharper than any two-edged sword, penetrating even between soul and spirit, joints and marrow, and able to discern reflections and thoughts of the heart. No creature is concealed from him, but everything is naked and exposed to the eyes of him [God] to whom we must render an account." (Heb 4:12-13).

In his discussion of the temptations of Jesus (Mt 4:1-11; Mk 1:12-13; Lk 4:1-13), St. Thomas reminds us that he was not forced into the desert to be tempted, rather, following his baptism by John, Jesus "was led by the Spirit into the desert to be tempted by the devil." (Lk 4:1). Before Jesus commences his public ministry, he freely submits to John's baptism of water (Mt 3:13-17), Spirit filled, and confirmed as the "beloved Son, with whom Lam [the God of Sinai (Ex 3:14)] well pleased." Jesus must prepare for the Adversary he will contend against his entire ministry (Lk 4:13).

The question arises: WHY did Jesus undergo the temptations? St. Thomas offers a fourfold response:

- 1. Jesus, who did not know sin, took on himself the temptation we face in or daily lives, especially during Lent. Jesus' SOLI-DARITY with us in times of temptation reveals the way to overcome them - "He should overcome our temptations by His own." (Summa, Question 41).
- 2. Jesus is teaching us that Baptism is NOT the end of the struggle with Satan but the BEGINNING. Each day is a challenge against the Evil One who tempts us to follow him. (1Pt 5:8).
- 3. The whole of Jesus' public ministry serves as an example of the cost of discipleship. In addition to the desert temptations, there is the Baptism of Jesus (Mt 3:13-17), and the washing of the disciples' feet (Jn 13:1-20). St. John Vianney (1786-1859), asks: "are we being tempted by the demon? ...our lovable Redeemer...[was] also tempted...leading the way...and assuring us of victory as long as we genuinely desire it." (Selected Sermons, First Sunday of Lent).
- 4. Our Lenten journey with Jesus will have its experiences of transfiguration (Mt 17:1-9), and walking in "the valley of the shadows of death" (Ps 23:4). Throughout, we are to be of courage. Yes, we will encounter the Adversary, but the Father sends us the Advocate, the Holy Spirit of truth (Jn14:16-17). Do not fear or become discouraged. In the midst of it all stands Jesus with arm extended and saying, "...take courage, I have conquered the world". (Jn 16:33).
