SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Baptisms are usually celebrated on the fourth Sunday of the month during the 10:30 a.m. Mass. Due to demand, some months may be eliminated or another day or time may be chosen by the family if it is available on the church schedule of events." To begin the process, parents are encouraged to go to our website at www.olphbc.org to access the forms under Sacraments and return the forms by email or drop off at the Church Office. Parents and godparents are required to attend a seminar prior to the Baptism. The Baptismal Seminar is held on the third Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Church Day Chapel. If you need more information or have questions, call the Rectory at (504) 394-0314 or email cre@olphbc.org.

SACRAMENT OF FIRST COMMUNION: First Eucharist is celebrated the first Saturday of May for students in the 2nd grade or above. Children older than 2nd grade will be prepared on individual situations. The Sacrament of Reconciliation must be celebrated prior to Communion.

SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION: Confirmation is celebrated in the Fall of 11th grade. Candidates who attend Catholic high school or are enrolled in the High School of Religion program come together for Sacramental preparation. All candidates are asked to pre-register in their freshmen year and no later than December of their 10th grade year. Information and registration can be found on our website: www.olphbc.org.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: Contact the Church Office at least nine months prior to the planned date. No other arrangements should be made before contacting the Church Office.

VISITATION OF THE SICK: Inform the Church Office when someone is sick, shut-in or hospitalized and unable to attend Mass.

FUNERALS: Inform the Church Office as soon as possible when someone in the family dies, preferably before contacting the funeral home.

Religious Education

Religious Education

The mission of OLPH's Religious Education program is to bring the "Good News" of God's love to all children and

their families and to call them to commit their lives to Christ. Religious Education is available for children in Kindergarten through adults. We encourage parents to be parishioners of OLPH when registering students for Religious Education classes. Census forms can be obtained from the Parish Office during regular business hours, on the Welcome Table located in the back of church or you can register online. SUNDAY LITURGY OF THE WORD: Children in grades K-2nd are invited with a catechist during 10:30 a.m. Mass to the Day Chapel for the Liturgy of the Word for Children (September-May). A summary of the readings of the day is discussed on their level.

PARISH SCHOOL OF RELIGION: Our PSR program is divided in two parts. Family Faith Formation is the "academic" part with the textbook discussed at home as a family. Our Encountering Engaging Events are a chance to come together as a community to worship together, do crafts, or engage in traditional events like our Nativity Play and Living Way of the Cross.

HIGH SCHOOL OF RELIGION: Students in 9th through 12th grade not attending a Catholic High School are offered Faith Formation with academics at home, working at their own pace, but also some time to get together to discuss what they have learned with their peers about three times a year. It is intended to be an informal study with honest Catholic answers.

RCIA: Are you or someone you know interested in becoming Catholic or completing Sacraments? Please join our RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). We have a Year-Round RCIA process that you can enter into whenever you are ready. This is for you if you have never been baptized, if you have been baptized into another denomination and now want to become Catholic, or if you are an adult Catholic but have never been confirmed. Sessions will be held in person with day and time to be adjusted to personal schedules. For additional information and to register, contact the Church Office or email cre@olphbc.org.

Teach and Remind

I'm not very good at telling jokes. I like them, but after I hear one and laugh at it, I let it go and forget it. I suspect this doesn't just apply to jokes. The Gospel today hints that the disciples may have had the same weakness when Jesus says the Spirit will "teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you" (John 14:26).

Jesus spent three years teaching his disciples and showing them how much God loves them and how to love their neighbor. He used parables as examples and miracles as signs of the Father's love. He answered their questions and explained things privately. Knowing that this would still not be enough, he promised to send the Spirit after he had risen. You have to experience some things to understand them. And that is what the disciples would do. When they received the Spirit after Jesus' resurrection, they also began to do the things Jesus talked about. They fed the poor and healed the sick. Thus they began to experience Jesus in those around them. They would remember what Jesus had taught them and apply it in their lives. They even accepted suffering for their faith.

We too can receive that promise from Jesus to have the Spirit teach and remind us. As we share our faith with others, we begin to experience Jesus in them. As we listen to the Lord in prayer, we are reminded of passages in the Bible and we begin to understand how they apply in our lives. May the Holy Spirit teach and remind us of the signs of God's love. Tom Schmidt

Straight Talk

The Catholic Tradition is essentially an INTEGRATED one, that is, whenever possible truth is revealed as BOTH/ AND rather than EITHER/ OR: Faith AND Reason, Grace AND Nature, Spirit AND Law, Tradition AND Creative Advance, Divine AND Human, etc. So, it is with Pentecost - BOTH noun and verb; contemplation and action. The Catholic Church welcomes Martha and Mary (Lk 10: 38-42); the prodigal and stay at home; the lost sheep and the faithful pasture ninety-nine (Lk 15: 3-7). (See Francis George's discussion on 'An Integrated Life', pp. 18-44 in A Godly

Pentecost has a backstory worthy of note. The Pentecost Event extends from the Genesis beginning (Gen 1:2); through the ups and downs of God's Love Story with Israel; to the Emmanuel revelation in a crib (Mt 1:23); the three year public ministry of Jesus (Lk 4:17); Jesus' promise of the Holy Spirit (Jn 14:16-17); the reappearance of the One given up for dead, raised from the dead by the Holy Spirit (Rom 8:11); Jesus' promise of the Holy Spirit at his ascension (Acts 1:1-11); and Jesus' promise kept on that first Christian Pentecost (Acts 2:1-4).

The setting of the Pentecost is deceptively ordinary, which usually means the extraordinary is soon to be revealed.

The disciples and Mary are together at the end of the Jewish Pentecost (Shavuot: commemorating God giving Moses the Torah (Ex 19:25)), fifty days after Passover. Into their midst "suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the whole house." Along with the wind "there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each of them". (Acts 2:2). With the tongues of fire "they were all filled with the holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them." (Acts 2:3-4).

In St. Luke's account of Pentecost, five elements deserve our attention.

- 1. Strong, driving wind from the sky. The presence of wind recalls the beginning of creation in which "a mighty wind" came over the formlessness and set the stage for creation (Gen 1: 1-3).
- 2. Filled the whole house. The house symbolizes the cosmos in which the Spirit is omnipresent. The Psalmist declares: "The earth is full of the goodness of the Lord." (Ps. 33).
- 3. Tongues of fire. Fire represents the powerful, protective presence of God (Ex 13: 21). Fire represents purification that will occur with the coming of the Messiah (Mal 3: 2-
- 3). Fire is also a time of decision as to following Jesus or rejecting him (Lk 12: 49-50).
- 4. Speak in different tongues. The story of the Tower of Babel explains the origin of the many languages as a punishment by God in response to Israel's infidelity and desire to be autonomous. The many languages result in confusion and division (Gen 11:5-9).
- 5. Speaking in his own language. With the Spirit, the disciples go forth to proclaim Jesus as the Messiah. Even though there are Jews' from every nation", the disciples, Spirit filled, are able to be understood; each according to one's own language (Acts2:5-41). The Gospel is the UNIVERSAL GOOD NEWS, for Jews and Greek, that is to be preached to the whole world (Mt 28:19-20) until he comes again (Rev 22:13).

The Pentecost Christian life is dynamic - receiving the Holy Spirit, and being sent forth to live and share the Gospel. Such a life is an ECCLESIAL one, that is, being part of a community (CHURCH) - a member of the Body of Christ (1 Cor 12:27); a branch engrafted to Jesus, the True Vine (Jn 15:5). The blood of the Body and the sap of the True Vine is LOVE (1Cor 13:13; Jn 15:16-17).

To each of US, this OUR Pentecost; OUR time of the Spirit. NOW is the acceptable time for US to receive, be sent forth, and in solidarity with those before, now, and yet to come, who have, are, and will DAILY die to self, carry one's cross, and follow Jesus (Mk 8:34).

May it be said of us and the Church, now and about generations waiting in the web of time: "[We are] not ashamed of the gospel. It is the power of God for the salvation of everyone who believes." (Rom 1:16).




