SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Baptisms are usually celebrated on the fourth Sunday of the month during the 10:30 a.m. Mass. Due to demand, some months may be eliminated or another day or time may be chosen by the family if it is available on the church schedule of events." To begin the process, parents are encouraged to go to our website at www.olphbc.org to access the forms under Sacraments and return the forms by email or drop off at the Church Office. Parents and godparents are required to attend a seminar prior to the Baptism. The Baptismal Seminar is held on the third Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Church Day Chapel. If you need more information or have questions, call the Rectory at (504) 394-0314 or email cre@olphbc.org.

SACRAMENT OF FIRST COMMUNION: First Eucharist is celebrated the first Saturday of May for students in the 2nd grade or above. Children older than 2nd grade will be prepared on individual situations. The Sacrament of Reconciliation must be celebrated prior to Communion.

SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION: Confirmation is celebrated in the Fall of 11th grade. Candidates who attend Catholic high school or are enrolled in the High School of Religion program come together for Sacramental preparation. All candidates are asked to pre-register in their freshmen year and no later than December of their 10th grade year. Information and registration can be found on our website: www.olphbc.org.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: Contact the Church Office at least nine months prior to the planned date. No other arrangements should be made before contacting the Church Office.

VISITATION OF THE SICK: Inform the Church Office when someone is sick, shut-in or hospitalized and unable to attend Mass.

FUNERALS: Inform the Church Office as soon as possible when someone in the family dies, preferably before contacting the funeral home.

Religious Education

Religious Education

The mission of OLPH's Religious Education program is to bring the "Good News" of God's love to all children and

their families and to call them to commit their lives to Christ. Religious Education is available for children in Kindergarten through adults. We encourage parents to be parishioners of OLPH when registering students for Religious Education classes. Census forms can be obtained from the Parish Office during regular business hours, on the Welcome Table located in the back of church or you can register online. SUNDAY LITURGY OF THE WORD: Children in grades K-2nd are invited with a catechist during 10:30 a.m. Mass to the Day Chapel for the Liturgy of the Word for Children (September-May). A summary of the readings of the day is discussed on their level.

PARISH SCHOOL OF RELIGION: Our PSR program is divided in two parts. Family Faith Formation is the "academic" part with the textbook discussed at home as a family. Our Encountering Engaging Events are a chance to come together as a community to worship together, do crafts, or engage in traditional events like our Nativity Play and Living Way of the Cross.

HIGH SCHOOL OF RELIGION: Students in 9th through 12th grade not attending a Catholic High School are offered Faith Formation with academics at home, working at their own pace, but also some time to get together to discuss what they have learned with their peers about three times a year. It is intended to be an informal study with honest Catholic answers.

RCIA: Are you or someone you know interested in becoming Catholic or completing Sacraments? Please join our RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). We have a Year-Round RCIA process that you can enter into whenever you are ready. This is for you if you have never been baptized, if you have been baptized into another denomination and now want to become Catholic, or if you are an adult Catholic but have never been confirmed. Sessions will be held in person with day and time to be adjusted to personal schedules. For additional information and to register, contact the Church Office or email cre@olphbc.org.



Getting to Know the Trinity

As if his own life, his teachings about God's love, his miracles, his death and resurrection were not enough, Jesus told us something about God that we never would have imagined: There are three But when he comes. Persons in one God. It is also something we cannot completely comprehend. So instead of trying to explain it, let's look at what it means for us believers. One thing it shows is that God wants to be known by us. In ancient times, people would expect

their gods to be mysterious and hidden. Many cultures thought that you could control a spirit or god if you knew its name. God sees us not as a threat, but as beloved children. Just as a couple falling in love wants to know everything about each other, so God wants to be known by those whom God loves. That leads to my second point.

The Trinity also shows us that "God is love" (1 John 4:16) because the three Persons are united in one God. God calls us to be united in love with God and with each other. Remember that God knows us perfectly and still loves us. Yet knowing our weaknesses and our sins does not hurt God's love for us. On the contrary, our weaknesses allow God to help us by forgiving sins, or inspiring someone to come to our assistance. We may not be able to grasp the full meaning of the Holy Trinity, but knowing that God shares this with faithful people helps us to love God even more. Tom Schmidt

Straight Talk by: Father William Maestri **Trinity and Families**; **Fathers, Above and Below** By a gift of grace, today we celebrate the Blessed Trinity, especially the Fatherhood of God, and we honor our earthly fathers. Today we witness the splendid communion of "Our Father who art in heaven" and our earthly fathers, living and dead. St. John Paul II wrote: "In revealing and in reliving on earth the very fatherhood of God, a man is called upon to ensure the harmonious and united development of all the members of the family." (See the apostolic exhortation on the family, Familiaris Consortion (1981), especially "Men as Husbands and Fathers", No. 25).

The disciples of Jesus came to him with this request: "Lord, teach us to pray". In re-

sponse, Jesus taught them, and us, what came to be known as "The Our Father", and /or, "The Lord's Prayer" (Lk 11:2-4). Jesus' gift of 'The Prayer' contains seven petitions (7), the number which designates completion, fulfillment, and holy wholeness.

- 1. Fatherhood denotes holiness: a state of being which is both heavenly AND earthly. Fatherhood is wise in that it looks ABOVE and BEYOND the passing currents of the moment and the fads of popular culture. Fatherhood is also prudent by providing for those earthly things that really matter.
- 2. The earthly kingdom of the father is to reflect the Kingdom of our Heavenly Father. How? A father's authority is shown by a single-hearted devotion to the spiritual, moral, and material NEEDS of the family. That is, a father's vocation is one of love not coercion. A father's love is one with The Father who is LOVE (1Jn 4:8).
- 3. Our heavenly Father's will for the whole of humanity is blessedness, that is, to be true to our nature as a fully alive human being (St. Irenaeus, "the glory of God is a human being fully alive!"). The supreme model for being fully alive is Jesus, for he reveals the Father and he reveals by his life what promotes human well-being. Each father is entrusted with the stewardship of promoting family well-being. In effect, "The family, is so to speak, the domestic church." (Lumen Gentium #11). The father is the PASTOR of the family church!
- 4. The petition for "daily bread" is directed to Our Father and to earthly fathers. Such bread is BOTH spiritual and material. God established the COVENANT with the Israelites for their spiritual nourishment as they travel through the desert into the land He will provide (Ex 19-24). God provides the nourishment for their desert sojourn (Ex 16). Once in the Promised Land, the desert manna gave way to "the bread from heaven" and "the food of angels (Neh 9:15; Ps 105: 40; Wis 16: 20-21). Earthly fathers are privileged to continue this basic act of nourishment-providing nourishment for the body and soul; the bread which is necessary for daily existence, and 'soul-food' which nourishes the family's communion with our Heavenly Father.
- 5. An essential aspect of Our Father's love is forgiveness. It is this forgiving love that is revealed by Jesus. This connection of love and forgiveness is revealed by Jesus' encounter with "a sinful woman in the city". She anointed his feet with ointment after she washed them with her tears. Jesus remarked: "her many sins have been forgiven; hence, she has shown great love...to whom little is forgiven, loves little." (Lk 7:36-50). Likewise, earthly fathers who extend forgiveness from the heart, strengthen the bonds of love within the family, and promote the common good.
- 6. Our Father does NOT entrap us to be tempted. The Father sent His Son out of love in order to save (Jn 3:16). However, in a 'fallen world' temptation is an everyday reality which God ALLOWS; NOT CREATES. Temptation is a time of testing, of struggle (Mk 1:12-13). In the struggle is the strength. Our Father does not abandon us, for the Spirit abides in each of us, and the Church with Scripture and Sacrament. Earthly fathers are called to provide 'daily bread', that is, the material and spiritual nourishment, by word and EXAMPLE, in order to BE CHRISTIAN in a highly secular culture.
- 7. Temptation is the enticement of the Evil One. This last petition is the culmination of the six previous ones. For Our Father "delivers us from evil" by turning to Our Father; desiring to be holy; to live daily the will of the Father and seek above all His Kingdom; being nourished each day in the Scriptures; extend and receive the Divine Love which forgives and resists temptation. In so doing, the Evil One is restrained and rejected. Earthly fathers can provide no greater gift to the family.

On this day of honoring earthly fathers, we praise our Heavenly Father. In gratitude we bless earthly fathers and family life. In praising the glory of Our Father, we offer glory to the Holy Trinity. In the words of Pope Benedict XVI: "The human family, in a certain sense, is an icon of the Trinity because of its interpersonal love and fruitfulness of this love."







