Sacraments



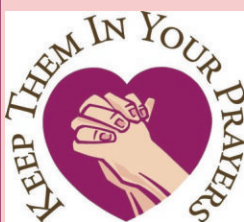
SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Baptisms are usually celebrated on the fourth Sunday of the month during the 10:30 a.m. Mass. Due to demand, some months may be eliminated or another day or time may be chosen by the family if it is available on the church schedule of events." To begin the process, parents are encouraged to go to our website at www.olphbc.org to access the forms under Sacraments and return the forms by email or drop off at the Church Office. Parents and godparents are required to attend a seminar prior to the Baptism. The Baptismal Seminar is held on the third Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Church Day Chapel. If you need more information or have questions, call the Rectory at (504) 394-0314 or email cre@olphbc.org.

SACRAMENT OF FIRST COMMUNION: First Eucharist is celebrated the first Saturday of May for students in the 2nd grade or above. Children older than 2nd grade will be prepared on individual situations. The Sacrament of Reconciliation must be celebrated prior to Communion.

SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION: Confirmation is celebrated in the Fall of 11th grade. Candidates who attend Catholic high school or are enrolled in the High School of Religion program come together for Sacramental preparation. All candidates are asked to pre-register in their freshmen year and no later than December of their 10th grade year. Information and registration can be found on our website: www.olphbc.org.

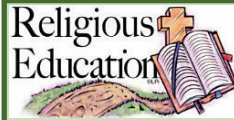
SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: Contact the Church Office at least nine months prior to the planned date. No other arrangements should be made before contacting the Church Office.

VISITATION OF THE SICK: Inform the Church Office when someone is sick, shut-in or hospitalized and unable to attend Mass.

FUNERALS: Inform the Church Office as soon as possible when someone in the family dies, preferably before contacting the funeral home.



Religious Education

The mission of OLPH's Religious Education program is to bring the "Good News" of God's love to all children and their families and to call them to commit their lives to Christ. Religious Education is available for children in Kindergarten through adults. We encourage parents to be parishioners of OLPH when registering students for Religious Education classes. Census forms can be obtained from the Parish Office during regular business hours, on the Welcome Table located in the back of church or you can register online. Call the Church Office at (504) 394-0314, or email cre@olphbc.org for more information.

SUNDAY LITURGY OF THE WORD: Children in grades K-2nd are invited with a catechist during 10:30 a.m. Mass to the Day Chapel for the Liturgy of the Word for Children (September-May). A summary of the readings of the day is discussed on their level.

PARISH SCHOOL OF RELIGION: Our PSR program is divided in two parts. Family Faith Formation is the "academic" part with the textbook discussed at home as a family. Our Encountering Engaging Events are a chance to come together as a community to worship together, do crafts, or engage in traditional events like our Nativity Play and Living Way of the Cross.

HIGH SCHOOL OF RELIGION: Students in 9th through 12th grade not attending a Catholic High School are offered Faith Formation with academics at home, working at their own pace, but also some time to get together to discuss what they have learned with their peers about three times a year. It is intended to be an informal study with honest Catholic answers.

RCIA: Are you or someone you know interested in becoming Catholic or completing Sacraments? Please join our RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). We have a Year-Round RCIA process that you can enter into whenever you are ready. This is for you if you have never been baptized, if you have been baptized into another denomination and now want to become Catholic, or if you are an adult Catholic but have never been confirmed. Sessions will be held in person with day and time to be adjusted to personal schedules. For additional information and to register, contact the Church Office or email cre@olphbc.org.

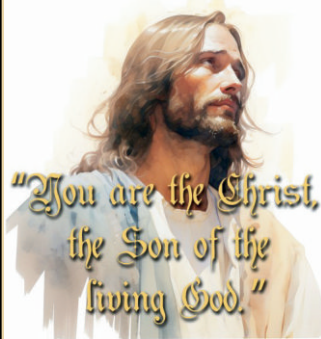

Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles Key to the City

Sometimes a mayor presents the key to the city to a citizen who has given outstanding service to the community. When Jesus gives Simon the keys to the kingdom of heaven, it is more than just a symbolic honor bestowed by a mayor.

Jesus is actually giving both a blessing and a responsibility. The blessing is that Peter recognized Jesus as the Son of God. Even today, people are blessed with this kind of faith. An atheist who has heard of Jesus but regards him as just another holy man may receive the faith to see that Jesus is the Son of God. A sick person may see that Jesus is with her in her suffering and begin to have hope. The faith that sees Jesus in others is the rock on which Jesus builds his church.

The responsibility comes in the binding and loosing. One meaning of this is the power that Jesus gives his church to forgive sins. So those who follow Jesus have that same obligation to forgive others. If we forgive those who hurt us, they may come to see God's love in us and know that God forgives them, too. So why pass up an opportunity to show God's love by forgiving someone? All Christians pray in the Lord's Prayer that we may be forgiven as we forgive others. Let us use the keys of the kingdom to open the doors of God's love.

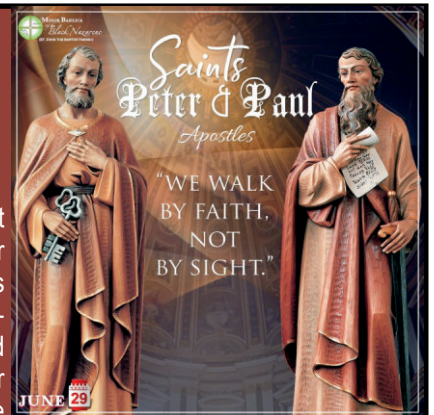
Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles (June 29)

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION


Today is an exceptional event on our calendar: the regular Sunday of Ordinary Time is eclipsed by a solemnity honoring two saints who didn't spend much time together in their earthly ministry, and who have

distinct feasts so they probably don't mind sharing this one. Yet each suffered a similar fate in the same city, Rome, during the persecution of the Emperor Nero. Nero probably ordered the destruction of many of the residential neighborhoods in service to his building projects, and when the homeless began to look for someone to blame for the fires, Nero targeted the Christians. Soon, Peter was crucified, upside down, on the Vatican hill. Excavations (called *scavi*) under the Vatican basilica have proven the authenticity of his burial place near the place of his death. Paul, a Roman citizen, was later granted a swifter execution by sword, and is remembered at a vast basilica on the city's outskirts.

Peter and Paul were just about polar opposites. Peter rough and ready, Paul poetic and polished. Peter carried a burden of regret for his denials, Paul had his own issues with which he struggled. Peter leapt over barriers to go to the Gentiles, Paul strove with and surrendered to the same call. True, they spent very little time together in this life, but the same Spirit filled their hearts and by their witness changed the face of the earth. —Rev. James Field

Some guidelines include: (a) An intention may be for the deceased or the living (i.e. "The Healing of...", "The intentions of ..."); (b) Each week-end, one Mass is reserved for "All Parishioners' Intentions."; (c) Only one intention can be offered at each Weekday Mass, except for Holy Days of Obligations that fall during the week; and (d) Mass can be said for an individual (e.g. "John Smith"), a married couple ("Joe and Mary Smith") or a family (e.g. "The Smith Family").

Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles



Straight Talk by: Father William Maestri **Apostles INSIDE and OUT**

Today the Catholic Church, and all creation, raises its collective voice in praising God as we celebrate two towering Apostles - Simon Peter and Saul Paul. Truly "Saint Inside" (Peter) and "Saint Outside" (Paul).

I couldn't help but think of one of the, if not the, greatest college football backfield tandems - Glenn Davis (1924-2005) "Mister Outside", and Felix "Doc" Blanchard (1924-2009) "Mister Inside". Please allow me to explain.

George Trevor, a sports columnist for the New York Sun, named Blanchard and Davis, led Army to three consecutive national championships (1944-46), compiling a record of 27-0-1. (A "0-0" tie with Notre Dame blemished Army's perfection-BOO!).

Both Davis and Blanchard won Heisman and Maxwell Trophies as college football's best. Blanchard was the first football backfield player to win the Sullivan Award as voted by head coaches, sports information directors, and members of the Maxwell Club. Davis went on to play for the LA Rams, who won the 1951 NFL Championship.

For all they shared on the football field, they were different in their approach to life. Davis was a "by the book" man. Blanchard was "free spirit". Yet both were united in the things that really matter - honor, duty, and dedication to the mission.

As we shift from the gridiron to another place and time - first century Jerusalem and beyond - we meet Christianity's "Apostle Inside" (Peter) and "Apostle Outside" (Paul). Similar to Davis and Blanchard, Peter and Paul shared much in common and much that differentiated:

Like Davis/Blanchard, Peter/Paul were united in what endures to life eternal. These two Apostles disclose the COMPLEMENTARITY of the Church as institutional and missionary; memory and hope; Tradition and creative advance; eternal and historical; Divine and human; inside and outside; at all times and places under the guidance of the indwelling Holy Spirit (Jn 14:16-17, 26; 15:26-27; 16:7-15; 1Cor 12:12-13; Acts 2:14-21).

St. Peter represents the institutional Church entrusted with the Deposit of Faith (*depositum fides*), Sacred Scripture and Tradition, which is essential for the oneness, harmony, prayed for by Jesus (Jn 17:20-26).

The DEPOSIT is not to be a buried treasure but one that is meant to be taught and preached to the whole world (Mt 28:16-20). While Peter preaches the Pentecost sermon to those gathered in Jerusalem, it is to Paul to proclaim the Good News to the Gentiles (Rom 15:14-21). In effect, Peter to the Jews and Paul to the Gentiles UNIVERSALIZES the Gospel by which ALL are to be saved.

May each of US, throughout the GIFT of each day, be in communion with Sts. Peter and Paul. May WE live on the field of daily life as INSIDERS - grateful members of Christ's Church. May WE be courageous OUTSIDERS - "proclaim the word; be persistent whether it is convenient or inconvenient...perform the work of an evangelist" (2Tim 4:1-5). May it be said of us that each gift we receive, we use for the good of all so that "in all things...God may be glorified through Jesus Christ". (1Pt 4:7-11).
