Sacraments















SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Baptisms are usually celebrated on the fourth Sunday of the month during the 10:30 a.m. Mass. Due to demand, some months may be eliminated or another day or time may be chosen by the family if it is available on the church schedule of events." To begin the process, parents are encouraged to go to our website at **www.olphbc.org** to access the forms under Sacraments and return the forms by email or drop off at the Church Office. Parents and godparents are required to attend a seminar prior to the Baptism. The Baptismal Seminar is held on the third Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Church Day Chapel. If you need more information or have questions, call the Rectory at (504) 394-0314 or email **cre@olphbc.org**.

SACRAMENT OF FIRST COMMUNION: First Eucharist is celebrated the first Saturday of May for students in the 2nd grade or above. Children older than 2nd grade will be prepared on individual situations. The Sacrament of Reconciliation must be celebrated prior to Communion.

SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION: Confirmation is celebrated in the Fall of 11th grade. Candidates who attend Catholic high school or are enrolled in the High School of Religion program come together for Sacramental preparation. All candidates are asked to pre-register in their freshmen year and no later than December of their 10th grade year. Information and registration can be found on our website: www.olphbc.org.


SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: Contact the Church Office at least nine months prior to the planned date. No other arrangements should be made before contacting the Church Office.

VISITATION OF THE SICK: Inform the Church Office when someone is sick, shut-in or hospitalized and unable to attend Mass.

FUNERALS: Inform the Church Office as soon as possible when someone in the family dies, preferably before contacting the funeral home.



Religious Education

The mission of OLPH's Religious Education program is to bring the "Good News" of God's love to all children and their families and to call them to

commit their lives to Christ. Religious Education is available for children in Kindergarten through adults. We encourage parents to be parishioners of OLPH when registering students for Religious Education classes. Census forms can be obtained from the Parish Office during regular business hours, on the Welcome Table located in the back of church or you can register online. SUNDAY LITURGY OF THE WORD: Children in grades K-2nd are invited with a catechist during 10:30 a.m. Mass to the Day Chapel for the Liturgy of the Word for Children (September-May). A summary of the readings of the day is discussed on their level.

PARISH SCHOOL OF RELIGION: Our PSR program is divided in two parts. Family Faith Formation is the "academic" part with the textbook discussed at home as a family. Our Encountering Engaging Events are a chance to come together as a community to worship together, do crafts, or engage in traditional events like our Nativity Play and Living Way of the Cross.

HIGH SCHOOL OF RELIGION: Students in 9th through 12th grade not attending a Catholic High School are offered Faith Formation with academics at home, working at their own pace, but also some time to get together to discuss what they have learned with their peers about three times a year. It is intended to be an informal study with honest Catholic answers.

OCIA (aka RCIA): Are you or someone you know interested in becoming Catholic or completing Sacraments? If so, please join our OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults). We have a Year-Round OCIA process that you can enter into whenever you are ready. Everyone can work at their own pace and attend gatherings as they like. Sharing our faith with one another is a huge part of our Baptismal call. This is for you if you have never been baptized, if you have been baptized into another denomination and now want to become Catholic, or if you are an adult Catholic but have never been confirmed. Sessions will be held in person with day and time to be adjusted to personal schedules. 

The Better Part—The Gospel for this Sunday can sometimes give the impression that Jesus favored Mary over Martha. But if they had both sat down to listen, there would have been no dinner to serve to Jesus. He wasn't just saying, "Sit down and listen." He meant that just as Mary was content to listen to him, so Martha could have been content to prepare the meal for him. Instead of thinking of her work as a gift to Jesus, she was more concerned with why Mary was not helping her. Remember the first reading, in which Abraham insisted on serving the visitors, whom he came to recognize as the Lord and two angels. He was rewarded with the assurance that he would soon have a son. So simple acts of hospitality can also be how people can welcome the Lord into their homes. Paul reminds us in the second reading that Christ is in us; the church is the body of Christ. When we welcome someone into our homes as a visitor, or into our lives as a friend, we are also welcoming Christ.

When we get to know someone better, we are also getting to know Christ. When we are respectful to people who help us, like the maintenance staff, the mail carrier, the waiter, we are also showing respect for the Lord. And what about that "better part" that Mary had chosen? Are we sometimes like Martha, with too many things on our minds to be aware of the Lord? Sometimes we can't avoid the distractions that are part of life. But if we keep the Lord on our minds, we may be able to see which are distractions to be put aside and which are opportunities to serve the Lord in a different way. Sometimes kids interrupt when we're fixing dinner—maybe they need to be taught how to take care of things by themselves, or maybe they just need a few moments of attention. We can certainly ask the Lord to help us handle distractions. And as we spend more time with the Lord in prayer, we begin to experience God's peace, which gives us the ability to choose the better part.

Next Sunday is the Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year C)

Genesis 18:20-32. Lord, do not be angry if I speak.

Colossians 2:12-14. He has made you alive with Christ for he has forgiven all our sins.

Straight Talk

(AD) Vance to the Future

Vice President J. D. (AD)Vance has troubled the comfortable. How so? He has dared to remind us of some fundamental truths about marriage, family, and especially the importance of welcoming children (those in the womb, the newly born, and those new generations waiting in the web of time) within the time-tested embrace of one man (husband) and one woman (wife) - the traditional family.

Who are the comfortable? They are our 'progressive despisers' (the elite in academia, media, corporate, government, and social media 'influencers') who live by the ethic of 'you be you' and 'I WILL be me'. In effect, the traditional structures of marriage and

family, the spiritual and moral foundation of a society's well-being (especially a republic), are judged to be oppressive conventions which favor the powerful at the expense of the marginalized (women, minorities, and those with different 'life-styles'). One should be 'free' to make and remake the 'Mercury Self' as an unfettered expression of the AL-MIGHTY WILL. Likewise, society is viewed as malleable as hot wax.

What got the 'chatter class' in a Red Zone state of apoplexy, was the following remarks by Vice President Vance: "Our people [American citizens, NOT any suggestion of 'angry old white men' taking back America] aren't having enough children to replace themselves.... We want babies not just because they are economically useful. We want more babies because children are good."

Mr. Vance told the Federalists in an interview, "We owe something to our country. We owe something other than our future...we have to go to war against the anti-child ideology that exists in our country." This anti-child mentality is often justified in economic terms - a significant number of Americans "can't afford to have a child". Without minimizing economic challenges, we may have to cut the bread thinner, but we may come to CUT LOVE THICKER. While we do not live without bread, we do not really nourish the soul through a diet of perishable food (Mt 4:4; Jn 6:27).

The concern over a declining birth rate is NOT 'right wing' propaganda. The Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) released its annual report with the headline: "The U. S. Fertility Rate Drops to Another Historic Low" (April 25,2024). The overall findings report a 3% DECREASE from 2022. The latest figures since 2007 indicate that the fertility rate has shown a steady DECLINE. Since 1990, the fertility rate has dropped overall by 14%.

Why the decline? Recent studies indicate the following factors are considered prime contributors: increased education and career opportunities for women, the cost of raising a child(ren), cultural values, and government policies to name a few (see Heritage Foundation, Harvard Gazette, Center for Disease Control, and New Estimates of Fertility and Population in the United States (Ansley Johnson Coale and Melvin Zelnik. Princeton University Press)).

The concern over a declining fertility rate is not confined to the political sphere, nor to the United States. Pope Benedict XVI had long been warning about such declining fertility in Europe. In a 2007 interview with the AP (Associated Press), Pope Benedict voiced the following: "One must unfortunately note that Europe seems to be going down a road which could lead it to take its leave from history."-EXTINCTION!

The Pope believes this decline in birth rates extends beyond pure economics: "besides putting economic growth at risk, it [declining fertility rates] can also cause enormous difficulties for social cohesion, and above all, favor dangerous individualism, [and] carelessness about the consequences about the future."

Saint John Paul II views the Church and the family as intimately connected, that is, "man is the way of the Church" (Redemptor Hominis). This union of Church and family are powerfully expressed by the Second Vatican Council: "The family, is so to speak, the domestic church" (Lumen Gentium, No. 11). Furthermore, he presents the family as the foundation of the good society and the sound development of the human person: "...family is a community of persons and the smallest social unit. As such, it is an institution fundamental to the life of every society." (Families, No.17).

The discussion of family must include the importance of marriage and CHILDREN. Once again, Saint John Paul II: "The family founded on marriage...creates the environment in which children can be born and develop their potentialities" (Centesimus Annus, 1992). And the GIFT of children are blessings, for "when children are born...the married couple becomes a family in the full sense" (St John Paul II. Familiaris Consortio, No. 69).

Kevin Roberts (Louisiana native / President of The Heritage Foundation), in his excellent book, Dawn's Early Light, writes: "Getting married and having kids...gives you skin in the game...to live in the real world...gives you a sense of purpose...helps generate community, gratitude, and joy. A CULTURE OF CHILDREN IS A CULTURE OF HOPE." (p. 47, enlargement added).


