Sacraments















SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Baptisms are usually celebrated on the fourth Sunday of the month during the 10:30 a.m. Mass. Due to demand, some months may be eliminated or another day or time may be chosen by the family if it is available on the church schedule of events." To begin the process, parents are encouraged to go to our website at www.olphbc.org to access the forms under Sacraments and return the forms by email or drop off at the Church Office. Parents and godparents are required to attend a seminar prior to the Baptism. The Baptismal Seminar is held on the third Monday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Church Day Chapel. If you need more information or have questions, call the Rectory at (504) 394-0314 or email cre@olphbc.org.

SACRAMENT OF FIRST COMMUNION: First Eucharist is celebrated the first Saturday of May for students in the 2nd grade or above. Children older than 2nd grade will be prepared on individual situations. The Sacrament of Reconciliation must be celebrated prior to Communion.

SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION: Confirmation is celebrated in the Fall of 11th grade. Candidates who attend Catholic high school or are enrolled in the High School of Religion program come together for Sacramental preparation. All candidates are asked to pre-register in their freshmen year and no later than December of their 10th grade year. Information and registration can be found on our website: www.olphbc.org.


SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: Contact the Church Office at least nine months prior to the planned date. No other arrangements should be made before contacting the Church Office.

VISITATION OF THE SICK: Inform the Church Office when someone is sick, shut-in or hospitalized and unable to attend Mass.

FUNERALS: Inform the Church Office as soon as possible when someone in the family dies, preferably before contacting the funeral home.



Religious Education

The mission of OLPH's Religious Education program is to bring the "Good News" of God's love to all children and their families and to call them to

commit their lives to Christ. Religious Education is available for children in Kindergarten through adults. We encourage parents to be parishioners of OLPH when registering students for Religious Education classes. Census forms can be obtained from the Parish Office during regular business hours, on the Welcome Table located in the back of church or you can register online. SUNDAY LITURGY OF THE WORD: Children in grades K-2nd are invited with a catechist during 10:30 a.m. Mass to the Day Chapel for the Liturgy of the Word for Children (September-May). A summary of the readings of the day is discussed on their level.

PARISH SCHOOL OF RELIGION: Our PSR program is divided in two parts. Family Faith Formation is the "academic" part with the textbook discussed at home as a family. Our Encountering Engaging Events are a chance to come together as a community to worship together, do crafts, or engage in traditional events like our Nativity Play and Living Way of the Cross.

HIGH SCHOOL OF RELIGION: Students in 9th through 12th grade not attending a Catholic High School are offered Faith Formation with academics at home, working at their own pace, but also some time to get together to discuss what they have learned with their peers about three times a year. It is intended to be an informal study with honest Catholic answers.

OCIA (aka RCIA): Are you or someone you know interested in becoming Catholic or completing Sacraments? If so, please join our OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults). We have a Year-Round OCIA process that you can enter into whenever you are ready. Everyone can work at their own pace and attend gatherings as they like. Sharing our faith with one another is a huge part of our Baptismal call. This is for you if you have never been baptized, if you have been baptized into another denomination and now want to become Catholic, or if you are an adult Catholic but have never been confirmed. Sessions will be held in person with day and time to be adjusted to personal schedules. Straight Talk by: Father William Maestri **Cross WITHOUT Christ?**

One of America's most distinguished Protestant theologians of the twentieth century was H. Richard Niebuhr (1894-1962), though not as well celebrated as his brother Rein-

Both came to question some of the basic tenets of Liberal Protestant Theology (LPT). especially as it relates to the doctrine of Original Sin and its effects on human nature

and world history. Much of their disillusionment with LPT (and Communism) grew out of the overly optimistic view of human nature, a godless Marxist-Leninism, and the rise of Nazism and Fascism. Such atheistic ideologies, which replace the Judeo-Christian God with an idol-worship of the State, embodied in the Fuhrer, Il Duce, or Chairman, does NOT usher in the golden age of man on earth. Rather, it calls forth a Hobbesian - Darwinian world of all against all governed by an indifferent nature in which only the fittest prevail.

H. Richard Niebuhr wrote the following sentence which is relevant today, if not more so, then when first penned: "[Christianity in America desires] A God without wrath brought man without sin into a Kingdom, without judgement through the ministrations of a CHRIST WITHOUT A CROSS." (The Kingdom of God in America, 1937).

These words of Niebuhr resonate today which is also averse to calling evil by its name, and substituting a therapeutic approach for the Gospel message of repent and reform (Mt 4:7). While exhibiting the same malady but with a difference, we put on display the CROSS WITHOUT CHRIST. We have come to view the "cross" as purely a piece of jewelry to be fashioned by OUR individual taste; a fashion statement I want the world to take note of. The Cross is no longer the "power and wisdom of God" that saves, but a personal display promoting the IMPERIAL SELF. In either case -Christ without a cross, or a cross without Christ - does NOT save. St Paul writes: "...if Christ has not been raised, ...empty is our preaching; empty too, YOUR FAITH..., you are still in YOUR SINS..., If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are the most pitiable people of all.... But now Christ has been raised from the dead" (1Cor 15:12-28).

The Church calls us to the TRIUMPH of the Cross, that is, Jesus NAILED to the Cross. Such is the only victory over our ultimate enemies - sin and eternal death. That "Old Rugged Cross" on Calvary, affixed to earth and pointing to heaven, bearing the Savior amidst the condemned, is "the light in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it" (Jn 1:5). The shadow of the Cross and the Savior, the crucifix, extends over all history and points to that time when He will come again. Hence, the crucifix is both an ever-present reminder that evil is real but greater still is the invincible hope that NEVER fails (Rom 5:5).

Living in the shadow of the Cross, we must daily answer this question: "Were you there when they crucified my [our] Lord?" Are we in solidarity with the mother of Jesus, the beloved disciple, Mary the wife of Clopas and Mary Magdala? (Jn 19:25-27). If so, this guestion follows: "Were you there when He rose up from the tomb?" If yes again, then as with Mary Magdala on that first Easter morning, her words may be ours, "I have seen the Lord." (Jn 20:18).

We can exalt in the Cross because the stone of sin and death have been rolled back (Mt 28:2), the guards were "shaken with fear...and became like dead men" (Mt 28:4), the Evil One has been defeated by the Cross and Empty Tomb, and the Advocate is sent so that "the ruler of this world has been condemned" (Jn 16:11).

Jesus Christ's Cross-Crucifixion and glorious Resurrection and the indwelling Spirit is His TRIUMPH. And it is OURS! For it is Divine Love which redeems and drives out all fear (1Jn 4:18).




