

## Handbook Covid Extension

- An updated signed Covid waiver must be in your child's records before the first day of class. This waiver can be accessed on OLPH website under Parish School of Religion Documents.
- All students must wear masks if they are indoors and outdoors if they are less than 6 ft. away from another person.
- Students may not attend PSR if they have been told to quarantine by their school or other extra curricular activities such as dance class or sport organization. Please let the office know if your child is being quarantined.
- A student who shows signs of illness of any kind while at PSR will be separated from class and other individuals until he/she is picked up. Parents and emergency contacts will be notified as soon as possible if this happens.
- If a student needs to use the restroom while at PSR the restroom will need to be sprayed after each use. Therefore, please encourage your child to use the restroom before arriving. We will not prevent students from using the facilities, but want to limit cross contamination as much as possible.
- PSR will be required to sanitize school rooms after each session. Rooms used by OLPH school will be sanitized before PSR begins.
- If your child misses a PSR class, chapters will be sent home the next time they attend. If you prefer to arrange to pick up chapter work ahead of time, please contact the teacher or C.C.Merritt via email with your child's name, grade and day they attend.
- Due to lack of teachers and low registration numbers, some grades may have to combine to a single day of instruction. Students will either have to move to the day instruction is offered or homeschool.
- If at any time you wish to do PSR at home (like the 2020-21 year) contact C.C. Merritt to arrange for the textbook and any other instructional materials.
- The year's calendar and basic schedule of events is posted on our website. Updates will be posted as necessary as quickly as possible.
