

Greetings to the Good People of God!

If, then, we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with him.

~ *Romans* 6:8

Recently I have had the privilege of participating and leading various funeral rites and prayers for some of our parish members. The prayers and rites of the Church are here to help all of us at the various stages of our life. Funeral rites accompany the deceased faithful, as well as those mourning the loss of a loved one. Speaking personally, I have powerful memories of God's presence at the committal service of my dad at St. John Cantius Cemetery in Pennsylvania from over 30 years ago. These prayers are the words of the Church here on earth and the Church in heaven. It is a connection to something timeless, something eternal.

The Church uses its loving experience of almost two thousand years to suggest certain best practices from her treasury of prayer. As our Conference of Catholic Bishops writes on its website,

Because of our belief not only in the immortality of the soul, but also in the resurrection of the body, the Church professes hope in the face of death, and acts with charity in the funeral rites. The Church provides a number of prayers for the faithful to offer both to accompany the dying of a loved one and to strengthen our faith upon their death. Through private prayer and public funeral rites, we strengthen our faith and hope, comfort those who mourn, and bury the bodily remains of the deceased with care befitting what was the Temple of the Holy Spirit.




