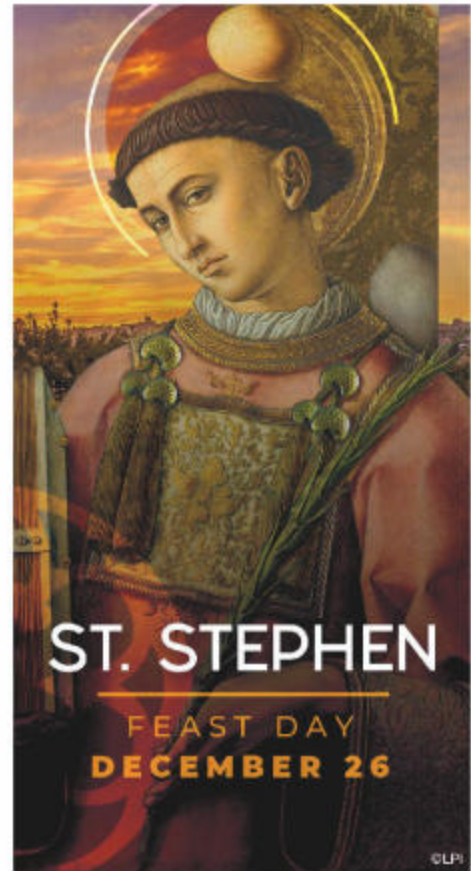

SAINT OF THE WEEK

The Acts of the Apostles tells the story of St. Stephen, the first Christian martyr. A man filled with grace and power, he worked great wonders among the people. Some Jews debated with St. Stephen but could not match his wisdom and spirit. Eventually, a charge of blasphemy was brought up against him, and the local population demanded that he be tried and sentenced. He was seized and carried before the Sanhedrin.

Despite the danger he faced, in front of the Sanhedrin and his accusers, St. Stephen gave a long speech about the history of Israel and the blessings that God had given upon His chosen people. He talked about how Israel had become disobedient despite God's abundant mercy. This enraged his accusers, and eventually the crowd dragged him out of the city and stoned him to death.

Even in his final moments, St. Stephen displayed great forgiveness and even asked God not to hold the sins of his attackers against them. Hundreds of years after his death, he is still a role model for us to follow.

LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

WEEKLY BULLETIN REFLECTION

Merry Christmas! As we celebrate this most joyful time with our families and friends, we remember the first Christmas in Bethlehem where the glory of the Lord was revealed to Mary, Joseph, the shepherds and the wise men.

In meditating upon this most joyful mystery of the nativity, we note that this event was not limited to those select few depicted in our manger scenes. Imagine all the other figures that would have known about the Christ Child that same night. We imagine that the shepherds proclaimed the message that “God is with us!” to the surrounding villages and countryside. They would have been the first messengers of the good news. They followed the instructions of the angels, who told them: *“Do not be afraid; for behold, I proclaim to you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For today in the city of David a savior has been born for you who is Messiah and Lord.”*

In turn, the Magi were given signs of the birth of Christ and had made a long journey to pay homage to the King of kings. As they traveled, they inquired to those along the journey on the whereabouts of the Christ Child. They asked, *“Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage.”* I see the wise men as the first missionaries who returned to their foreign lands proclaiming the birth of Jesus to all they encountered.

Another king was given the opportunity to pay homage to Jesus – King Herod. As we know, Herod was a very worldly king who was blinded by power and greed. He did not respond to the good news with great joy: *“When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him.”* Herod gave into fear and saw Jesus as a threat to his rule. He did not realize that God sent His Son to be in the world, but not of the world – that His rule was to encompass the whole world – to bring all into His heavenly kingdom. Herod had no concept of God’s plan for salvation for mankind.

God intended His Son to be revealed to the whole world, and to be acknowledged by all who were willing to listen and accept tidings of great joy. The question that we ask ourselves is: How are we going to spread the good news of His birth this Christmas? Are we going to respond like the shepherds and share the message with our local community? Will we be like the wise men and proclaim the message of Christ on social media and in other ways that are uncomfortable/inconvenient for us? Or will we be like King Herod, who gave into fear and kept the message of Christ to himself to only be troubled at Christ’s coming?

As sons and daughters of Christ, let us truly rejoice in Jesus’ birth. May this divine truth shine forth in the way we treat others with patience, love, understanding and joy. Jesus has come into the world to heal our sinful and broken world. He is here to stay and remain within our hearts. Let us reflect the words of the prophet Isaiah, whom Jesus quoted:

“The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord.”

Renewed in the joy of Christmas, let us now go forth to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord!

Take your household's copy and grow together in pursuit of joy we all seek!

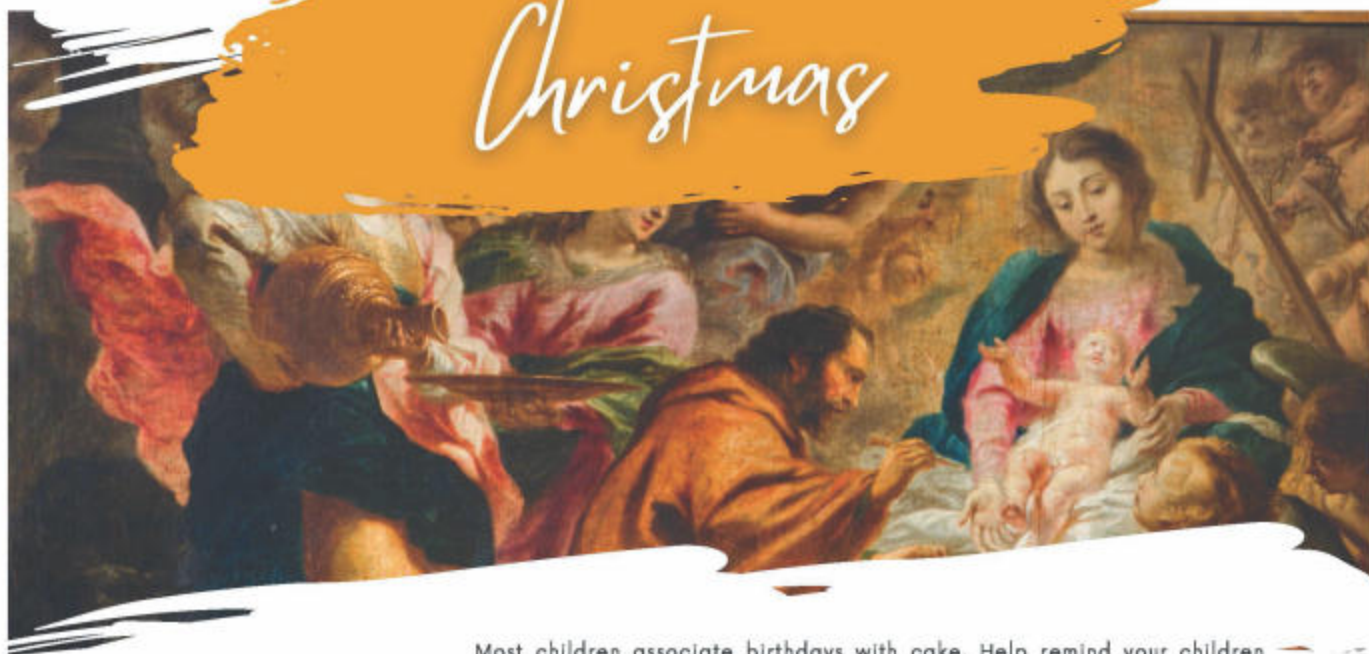


Many Hands Building God's Kingdom
