A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners:

It is hard to believe that Labor Day is only two weeks away and the slower pace of Summer is almost over. If that is not challenging enough, Jesus has some real challenging words for us in today's gospel. In response to a question about how many will be saved, Jesus answers: "Strive to enter through the narrow gate." Instead of answering the question of how many will be saved, Jesus tells us what we should be doing to save our own soul. "Strive to enter through the narrow gate." Jesus, Himself, is the narrow gate. In fact, Jesus has already done what is needed to save our souls by His Sacrifice on the Cross for us. What we need to do is to make our lives an offering to God in union with His, to enter into a relationship with Him and to remain in Him. Jesus gave us the supreme gift of Himself the Eucharist to make this possible in a very real way: "He who eats My Flesh and drinks My Blood remains in Me and I in Him."

The Christian life is more than just knowing about Jesus or keeping the Commandments. It is that, but so much more. It is fundamentally about participating in the very life of God, drawing our life from Jesus through the Sacraments culminating in the Eucharist. That is why the Second Vatican Council teaches that the Eucharist is the "Source and Summit of the Christian life." Our union with Jesus in the Eucharist is source from which everything we do begins, and the goal toward which everything we do tends. That is the whole ebb and flow of our week. That is why the Mass on Sunday, the Lord's Day, is absolutely essential. Jesus said at the Last Supper when He gave us the Mass: "I am the vine, you are the branches. Just as a branch cannot live apart from the vine, so neither can you live apart from me." Jesus is speaking about the Eucharist, the food for the life of our souls.

Let me just leave you with these beautiful quotes about the Eucharist by Saint John Vianney, the Patron Saint of Parish Priests, who in the 19th Century converted the entire town of Ars in France by getting his parishioners back to Mass on the Lord's Day: These quotes were taken from a talk by a friend and classmate of mine, Fr. Rodger Landry.

- Attending Mass is the greatest action we can ever do.
- One will understand the greatness of the Mass only in Heaven.
- All good works taken together would not equal the sacrifice of the Mass, because they are the works of men...and the holy Mass is the work of God. Martyrdom is nothing in comparison...for martyrdom is the sacrifice of a man's life made to God. The Mass is the sacrifice that God made of his Body and Blood for man.
- Even if you had all the money in the world, you would not be able to pay for one Mass...because we can never pay for the blood of our Lord Jesus Christ.
- If we have faith, we will see Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament like the angels see him in Heaven. He is there. He awaits us!
- Holy Communion! What honor God gives to his creature! O man, how great you are, nourished and fed by the body and blood of God! If you were to understand it, you would not be able to live! You would die of love! This God gives himself to you. You can carry him, if you want, where you want. For He makes Himself one with you!

May God bless us all.
