A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners:

Time continues to fly as we enter into the month of November this week. We begin November on Tuesday, November 1st, with the great Solemnity of All Saints as we honor the men and woman of every time and place who have achieved the goal of our Faith, our true homeland in Heaven. Our belief in the Communion of Saints reminds us that we are all connected in the Church by our Baptism - those of us still on our way through this world toward Heaven, the souls in Purgatory who are still being purified in preparation for Heaven, and the Saints who have reached the goal of Heaven. We rely on the intercession of the Saints to help us and strengthen us so that where they are we one day may be. And we look to the example of their lives of heroic virtue and holiness to inspire us, for it is God's Will that all of us become Saints. That is why God made us, as the Old Baltimore Catechism put it: "To know, love and serve Him in this world so as to be happy with Him forever in the next." We were made for Heaven, we were made to see God, we were made to be Saints. Every desire we have in our hearts for happiness and peace in this world is ultimately a longing for Heaven, a longing to see the Face of God.

The next day, Wednesday, November 2nd, we observe All Souls Day, when we pray in a special way for all the souls of the faithful departed. The Church prays for all who have died in every Mass, but this day and the entire month of November is dedicated in a special way to remembering and praying for the dead as we come to the end of the Church's year focusing on the Four Last Things: Death, Judgment, Heaven and Hell. The idea of praying for the dead goes all the way back to the Old Testament where it says in the Book of Maccabees: "It is a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they might be loosed from their sins." Jesus told us that to see God we must be pure of heart: "Blessed are the Pure of Heart for they shall see God." The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches: "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of Heaven." The state in which the dead are purified in preparation for Heaven is what the Church has

traditionally called "*Purgatory*," from the Latin word, "Purgare," which means "to cleanse."

Our prayers for the dead help them in this process of purification. And the greatest and most powerful of all prayer we could offer for them is the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. This is what we will do as a Parish family at the 7:30pm evening Mass on All Souls Day as we remember, and pray for by name, all of our departed parishioners and loved ones who died this past year (See the insert in today's bulletin.) "May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed through the Mercy of God rest in Peace." May God bless us all.
