A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners:

I hope and pray everyone had a very blessed Thanksgiving with family and friends. Let us give thanks for this New Year of Grace which begins today with this First Sunday of Advent – a new start, a new opportunity to grow deeper in our faith and to live it even more fervently and sincerely than we did last year.

As we prepare to celebrate the birth of our Lord Jesus at Christmas, this Holy Season of Advent is a time for us to rekindle in our hearts a burning desire for the coming of our Lord. Theologians speak of three comings of Christ: First, in *History* over 2000 years ago when He was born as a little baby in Bethlehem; Second, in *Majesty* when He will come again in glory at the end of time to judge the living and the dead; and Third, in *Mystery* as comes to us right here and now in so many ways, most powerfully in the Sacraments, and culminating in the supreme gift of the Eucharist.

Jesus' first coming happened very quietly and humbly. His birth in the middle of the Night in a tiny town called Bethlehem went largely unnoticed by the world. His second coming is what Jesus speaks of in the Gospel today, when He will come on the clouds in great power and glory to judge the living and the dead. On that day everyone will notice Him, everyone will see Him, those who believed in Him and those who did not, those who loved Him and those who hated Him. It will be a time of great fear or a time of great joy, depending on whether we know Him now and live in His Love every day.

Then there is the third coming of Christ, His coming in mystery right here and now. Jesus implores us to be vigilant in preparing for his coming every day. We are given this sacred and precious time of Advent to begin again to set things right in our relationship with God, to recommit ourselves to living our faith with all our might, living in the presence of the Lord every day of our lives. Then we will know the Peace for which our hearts are longing, a Peace that the world cannot give or take away.

Saint Augustine put it: "You have made for yourself O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in you." May we experience the Love and Mercy of God in a more profound way than we ever have before this Advent, and may His Peace descend upon our world and remain in our hearts now and forever. May God bless us all.

FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT THE ADVENT WREATH

The Advent Season is a time to look forward to Christ's coming. The Advent Wreath is a circle of four candles, each candle representing a week of Advent. The family may gather around the wreath, recite a short prayer and light the appropriate number of candles. As each week passes, one more candle is lit to remind the family that Christ's birthday is getting closer. The purple candles remind us of our need for penance. The Rose candle (third week) reminds us Christmas joy is truly near.

Let your blessing come upon us as we light the candles of this wreath. May the wreath and its light be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation. May he come quickly and not delay. We ask this through Christ our Lord.
