FROM OUR PRIESTS' DESKS:

Dear Sisters and Brothers of Sacred Heart:

Our readings for today and for these next few weeks as we transition into the season of Advent speak to us about the uncertainties of life, and how we can only find stability in a world of constant and often unwelcome changes by growing in our faith in the God who is the beginning and the end of all life. In the Gospel (Lk 21:5-19) Jesus warns his disciples about a disaster of cosmic proportions which will come upon this world at an unexpected moment: there will be a series of wars, powerful earthquakes, famines, and plagues, and awesome sights in the sky. Of course, apart from awesome sights in the sky, haven't we already seen all these other things happen: from horrendous acts of terrorism, with 9/11 especially burned into our memories; to seemingly endless wars in Iraq and Afghanistan and many other places as well; to hurricanes, tsunamis, and floods that have taken tens of thousands of lives, left economies in ruins, and displaced untold people from homes and jobs; to outbreaks of Ebola and other highly infectious and deadly diseases? Haven't all the things Jesus warned us about already come true? Well, yes! So...is the end of the world at hand? The answer to that question is very simple: we just don't know! "Of the day and hour, no one knows," the Gospels state, "neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, [nor the Mayan calendar!] but only the Father." Sorry, prophets of doom! But if all these calamities are not signs just yet of the end of the world, they are clearly signs of a world in great disorder. Over the disorders of nature, we have only limited controlalthough climatologists and especially our own Pope Francis in his encyclical letter Laudato Si' tell us we have more control and more responsibility over our environment than we are willing to admit. Over the disorders of the human heart, however, we assuredly should have greater control—over those dark forces that lead us to be greedy and self-centered, dishonest, lacking in respect for others or for mother earth, unwilling to forgive. Why is it that we so often allow these negative and destructive tendencies to control our thoughts and our actions?

The reason why the Church celebrates the lives of the saints, as we do in a special way during this month of November, is in part to provide positive role models, examples to encourage and inspire us to believe in the power of goodness and the power of holiness to transform lives and ultimately to transform

our world. That we need such role models and such positive reassurance is only too clear in a world where violence and injustice and crimes of all kinds seem so prevalent. The saints remind us that integrity of life is possible and challenge us to persevere in our efforts to resist what is evil and to embrace what is good. So, if the possibility of catastrophe always seems to be just around the corner, then we must know that the possibility of salvation is also present and, as our faith assures us, is something infinitely more powerful. St. Augustine says that we must trust the past to God's mercy and the future to God's providence. Certainly, in making that statement Augustine did not mean that we have no role in our own destiny, but rather that God is on our side and will most assuredly sustain us in our efforts to turn away from what is evil and be faithful to the Gospel.
