FROM OUR PRIESTS' DESKS:

Bulletin insert for the 3rd Sunday of Advent

"Are you he who is to come, or should we look for another?" That was the question John the Baptist asked Jesus through two of his disciples in today's Gospel (Mt. 11:2-11). Kind of strange ... Didn't John himself point out Jesus to his disciples as "the Lamb of God", an affirmation of faith that we also echo as we gaze at the consecrated host at Mass before receiving Holy Communion: "Behold the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world." So why is it that John is now expressing doubt about the identity of Jesus? "Are you he who is to come," he asked, "or should we look for another?"

Maybe the reason for John's doubt is to be found in the words of Jesus himself, when he sends John's disciples back to him with the order to tell John what they have seen and heard-words and works of mercy and healing for the blind, the deaf, the cripples, and the lepers: all the outcasts of society in ancient Israel. They were words that pointed to the fulfillment of the promises of Isaiah in today's first reading that the eyes of the blind would be opened and the ears of the deaf would be cleared. In the end, it seems that John's vision of the Messiah was too restricted. Although he knew the Savior was coming, he envisioned that coming through the lens of the more severe prophets of the Old Testament, who warned of a time of judgment, of wrath, of fire, and of condemnation for sinners, and especially for unbelievers. This was something very different from what Jesus was actually doing! Rather, Jesus was revealing more the God of mercy than the God of judgement! In the end, John realized that his own understanding of his mission must be broadened, even humbling stating: "He [Jesus] must increase, and I must decrease."

Maybe the challenge of today's Scripture readings for us, then, is whether we are willing and able to change our own point of view about God, and of what it means to be a believer and a follower of Jesus. Is our own vision of God too limiting—for ourselves and for others? Do we see more the God of judgement or the God of mercy? Does our view of God cause us to approach God with fear and doubt rather than with confidence and trust? Tomorrow is

Reconciliation Monday when all Catholics are invited to "come home", to return to our Catholic family if we have drifted away; to return to the Sacraments. We are all in need of the healing grace, and perhaps especially the "healing of memories" from the guilt or shame or bitterness or regret that Reconciliation provides. In the Sacrament we do acknowledge the God of justice who calls on us to be faithful and responsible, but we also gratefully embrace the Father of mercies who is willing to forgive any offense, any sin of ours, if we have true contrition. Let's take advantage of this special moment for healing . . . and how about inviting a friend who has been away from the Church to accompany us? Make it a night out and have a bite to eat together after Confession! It doesn't have to be locusts and wild honey: we'll leave that to John the Baptist!


