# TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY AUGUST 23, 2020

From the priests' desks:

Dear Brothers and Sisters of Sacred Heart:

"Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" That was the question Jesus asked his disciples in today's Gospel. We know that the title "Son of Man" was one that Jesus used exclusively in referring to himself, so that what he was really asking was: "Who do people say that I am.: And the question may have caught the disciples off guard; maybe they weren't too sure what answer to give. There were, after all, many opinions circulating about Jesus in his day, and not all of them were complimentary. Some people thought Jesus was an imposter who deceived people: others thought that he was a magician who played clever tricks; some thought he was a blasphemer who denied his Jewish faith; and some even thought that he was a crazy person, who was possessed by a demon. But the disciples didn't report any of these unfavorable opinions to Jesus. Perhaps because they were his followers and even his friends. they wanted to speak only about the positive opinions that people had. And so they told Jesus, that the people were saying that he was like John the Baptist, who called sinners to repentance; that he was like Elijah, who worked amazing miracles and cured people of their illnesses; or that he was similar to one of the ancient prophets, like Jeremiah, who preached the Word of God and challenged people to be more faithful to the Covenant. And certainly, they were correct in what they said . . . But Jesus wanted something more from the disciples than just to report the opinions of others, and so he went on to ask: "But who do you say that I am?"

In an age in which there are many contrary opinions, Jesus asks us who we think he is. And unless we are solidly anchored in our faith, we may find ourselves pulled in different directions, back and forth, depending on the prevailing opinion of Jesus in popular culture: a culture that tries to make Jesus as relevant or controversial as possible, the better to try to control him and cut him down to size to fit our own expectations and needs. The fact is that the real Jesus is a mystery who escapes our categories and descriptions; he can make us uncomfortable because he challenges us with his notions of taking up our cross, telling us to love our enemies, or stating that the last will be first. After Peter responds to Jesus' question by stating that he is "the Christ, the Son of the Living God," Jesus addressed Peter as Simon, a name which means "to hear, or to listen". So it is the one who hears God's word and listens to his voice who is able to discern Jesus' true identity through the

din of false and deceptive voices, and in knowing who Jesus really is, to follow his path with assurance, with peace of soul, and with hope in our hearts.

I pray this note reaches you in good health and spirits. I know we are all in agreement that 2020 has been a year of trial and turmoil thus far. Although things are slowly returning to normal, nothing seems quite the same. As you are probably aware our beloved Catholic School has closed its doors, after 110 years. Heartbreaking news for sure. As Christians and Catholics, we know that trials and tribulations are a part of life and that no matter what, our Lord is with us. That being said, He also wants us to move forward.

At Sacred Heart we typically post our weekly donations in our parish bulletin, doing so in the worst of the pandemic proved difficult. Two weeks ago, we posted a monthly comparison for the months that donations were not posted weekly against last year's figures; this was done on a monthly basis to show the total of the losses. Understandably, the parish revenue is down. Adding, to the loss is our Easter Collection which was less than half of our normal donation amounts. In addition to that and due to the pandemic, we felt it prudent to cancel our yearly \$10,000 Raffle, which is currently our largest fundraising event of the year.

After considerable thought we are reinstating the \$10,000 Raffle beginning this September. The drawing will be held on the First Sunday of Advent, November 29<sup>th</sup> at 3:00pm in our gymnasium. With your help and support which we greatly need, we pray, this will be a financial boon to the potential winners and to the parish.

I hope we can count on your support! The tickets will be on sale beginning September 1! Please drop by the rectory to purchase one (or more!) and we will also be sure to have them available after Masses on a few weekends.
