Dear brothers and Sisters of Sacred Heart:

Dear Family of Sacred Heart:

Today's first Gospel parable is about how we respond to invitations. The parable refers to God's chosen people being invited to the wedding of His Son. It's not as if these invited guests COULD NOT come to the feast but that they WOULD NOT come! Why would anyone turn down such a marvelous invitation, especially from a king!? The king in this parable does not take lightly being mocked just as God does not like to be mocked! He invited those whom pious Jews would have rejected. Those included pagans, women and outcasts of society. These outcasts, however, gladly accepted God's gracious invitation.

The second parable concerns the meaning of the man not wearing the required wedding garment. The wedding garment represents being wrapped up in the salvation of Christ. Both parables are concerned with God inviting us to the marriage feast of His kingdom.

Do we always choose to say yes to God and eagerly welcome His invitation to His Son's heavenly banquet or do we find there are times when we think there are more important things to do?

Immediately after criticizing the religious leaders through the parable of the tenants in <u>last Sunday's Gospel</u>, Jesus proceeded to tell another parable, again directed at the religious leaders. We hear this parable in today's Gospel.

In the parable of the wedding feast, Jesus offers an image of the kingdom of heaven using the symbol of a wedding banquet. In today's first reading from the prophet Isaiah and in today's psalm, the Lord's goodness is evident in the symbol of a feast of good food and wine. Jesus' listeners would have been

familiar with the image of a wedding feast as a symbol for God's salvation. They would consider themselves to be the invited guests. Keeping this in mind helps us to understand the critique Jesus makes with this parable. The context for this parable is the growing tension between Jesus and the Jewish religious leaders in Jerusalem. This has been the case for the past two Sundays and will continue to be true for the next several weeks.
