FROM OUR PRIESTS' DESKS:

Dear sisters and brothers of Sacred Heart:

"The person who is dishonest in very small matters," Jesus warns his disciples in today's Gospel (Luke 16:1-13), "is also dishonest in great ones." The central figure in the Gospel parable, as we shall see, is the "unjust steward" [manager] who used his position to enrich himself rather than be responsible with his boss's money. Maybe in saying this, Jesus was thinking about Judas, the one chosen from among the apostles to be the group treasurer and who was entrusted with the funds that had been donated to support Jesus' activities as well as to help the poor. It is reported at a later point in the Gospel that Judas was a thief and used to help himself to the money bag. And of course, Judas' small acts of theft escalated over time until they led him to betray Jesus to his enemies who arrested, tried, and crucified him, eventually leading Judas, once he had seen the consequences of his actions, to despair of his own life and to commit suicide. Maybe this parable, then, was Jesus' way of reaching out to Judas to give him another chance to change his ways, to repent, and to open himself to the Divine Mercy: something which Judas, of course, failed to do. The parable speaks about the generosity of the boss toward the unjust steward who removed him from his position but did not otherwise punish him.

None of us is immune from the temptation to be dishonest, to be untruthful, or to misuse our position to benefit ourselves at the expense of others. This dishonesty may be in regard to material things: money, office supplies or equipment, store merchandise, even items belonging to family members or friends. Jesus invites each of us to do the right things when it comes to respecting the possessions of others; to be as concerned about the common good as we are about our own welfare. To refraining from stealing, cheating, and slander—this last an act that deprives another not of his or her material possessions but of something even more valuable: their good name and reputation! As we have all been given responsibility for many things in this life may we in turn be grateful and responsible for their use so that when we finally come before God as our just Judge we may hear the words: "Well done good and faithful servant; enter into the joy of your Lord."
