FROM OUR PRIESTS' DESKS:

Dear sisters and brothers of Sacred Heart:

This Sunday, the 34th and last Sunday in Ordinary Time, has for many years now been called the Feast of Christ the King. Viva Cristo Rey! The Scriptures, as we certainly know, use a variety of images to describe the nature and mission of Jesus, who is at the center of our Christian faith, and the one whom we are addressing when we say: "I believe." To me, Jesus always looks a bit out of place and maybe even a bit uncomfortable wearing a crown . . . unless it be a crown of thorns. Perhaps it was for that reason that Jesus responded to Pilate's question in the Passion story we hear on Good Friday: "Are you a king?" with the response: "You say that I am a king." And then he as if to clarify Pilate's obvious continues. misconception: "My kingdom is not of this world." In other words, my kingdom is not a political but a spiritual one.

It's interesting that with the variety of images we have of Jesus-King, Shepherd, Judge, Light of the World—that the one we are about to embrace in a few short weeks is that of a baby-the image of innocence and helplessness. Christmas is a reminder to us that Jesus understands our human conditionour strengths and our weaknesses—because he has experienced them himself. If Jesus is a King who rules through service and leads through the inspiration of his words and actions, then perhaps this is so because of the mystery of Christmas: God becomes human, the Word becomes flesh, heaven and earth are joined together. As we reach the end of the Church year and begin once again the "Christmas countdown" may it be with an awareness of the greatness of the God we have come to know through our Christian faith, with gratitude for the salvation we have received through the love and self-sacrifice of Jesus, with the determination to exercise leadership in our own lives and in our own world by the service we freely give to others, and by the responsibility we take for living good lives and promoting justice and peace through the positive example we set for those around us.
