### TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD AUGUST 6, 2023

#### FROM OUR PRIESTS' DESKS:

Dear sisters and brothers of Sacred Heart:

Of all the accomplishments of Pope John Paul II perhaps one of the most practical and familiar to ordinary Catholics would be his addition of another set of mysteries—the Luminous Mysteries—to the Rosary, one of the most popular Catholic devotions. And among those Luminous Mysteries which recount the Public Life of Christ, the fourth is the Transfiguration, the feast we celebrate this Sunday (August 6). All of the Synoptic Gospels-Matthew, Mark, and Luke-mention this event, showing how important it was to the early Christian community and, in particular, to the first leaders of the Church, Peter, James, and John, who were eyewitnesses. As a matter of fact, St. Peter himself says in today's second reading: "We ourselves heard this voice [God the Father] come from heaven while we were with him [Jesus] on the holy mountain." Another sign of the importance of the Transfiguration in Christian tradition is the fact that it is celebrated in the Church not only on August 6 but also as the Gospel reading for the Second Sunday of Lent each year.

What exactly happened? The Gospels tells us that Jesus took his three closest followers to a high mountain (traditionally identified as Mount Tabor in Galilee) where he revealed his divine nature in a brilliant flash of light, was identified by the voice of God the Father as his "Beloved Son," and confirmed as the Messiah, the fulfillment of Israel's hope, by the appearance of Moses and Elijah, representing the Law and the Prophets of the Old Testament. In reading the context of this Gospel story we realize that its purpose was to bring hope and encouragement to the disciples as they came to understand that Jesus must go to Jerusalem to suffer and to die. To us it is also a sign of hope and encouragement in our lives as we face our own crosses and difficulties. Finally, it is a challenge to believe that we too are meant to be transformed by the power and goodness of God and through our own best efforts to become God's children, and by listening to the words of Jesus to become sons and daughters of the Father in whom he is "well pleased."


