Dear sisters and brothers of Sacred Heart:

Prince & Pauper. In the historical fiction *The Prince and the Pauper*, written by Mark Twain, the two main characters exchanged their clothes and identities to try how it feels to be in the world of the other person. So, the lonely boy prince dressed-up as the pauper and the envious pauper dressed as the prince. In living the realities of their different roles, they realized that it was not as easy as they thought it to be. The famous line of the prince states: "Everyone sees what you appear to be, few experience what you really are." In the end their life stories taught the prince and the pauper the virtue of empathy and true happiness in helping one another. St. Paul in today's letter wrote:

Letter to the Philippians 4:12-...

Brothers & Sisters:

I know how to live in humble circumstances.

I know also how to live with abundance.

In every circumstance and in all things

I have learned the secret of being well fed and of going hungry,

Of living in abundance and of being in need.

I can do all things in Christ Jesus who strengthens

Still, it was kind of you to share in my distress.

Life's experiences guided by Christ, taught St. Paul to pattern his life after the Savior who saved him from perdition. Before his conversion, he was like a madman seeking to destroy those who believed and followed Christ. As a Pharisee, he had the power to root-out and eliminate them. After he personally encountered Jesus on the way to Damascus, he felt the love & mercy of the Savior and those who follow His way. As St. Paul began his ministry with the followers of Christ, he was able to empathize with their struggles and enjoy with them his newfound happiness. Let us ask the Good Lord today, to give us the grace to be keen to the needs of others, and to be able to share in their sorrows and joys. In the condition of a prince or a pauper, let us allow Christ Jesus to be our strength and quide. Amen.
