FROM OUR PRIESTS' DESKS:

Hi, brothers and sisters in The Lord:

The Trinity is the central article of our faith as Christians. We profess that belief in the Creed, which we recite together every Sunday at Mass: I believe in God-Father, Son, and Spirit: One God in three persons. . . . So easy to say; so difficult to comprehend! We say that the Trinity is a "strict mystery", that it's not something we could deduce from human reason alone. Rather it's something which must be revealed to us by God, and even then, it's not easy to understand. So, it's not surprising that over the centuries, and, indeed, from the very beginning of Christianity, there have been mistaken and erroneous notions-what we used to call heresies-about the Trinity. And all of these errors about the Trinity can be reduced basically to a single baffling question: How can there be one and three at the same time? How can there be both true unity and equally true diversity in God? Here Catholic Christians part company with their Jewish and Muslim neighbors . . . and even with some Protestant Christians.

It seems to me that a lot of our troubles in understanding the Trinity are related to our problems in respecting persons and forming genuine human community. We want a community which will respect human dignity and the rights of the individual; a community which will guarantee equality for all; but also a community which will draw all the members together to promote the common good. And I suppose most of all we want communities, families, that are really loving-not simply places where people live together, but places where they care-places we can call home-where we can find acceptance and belonging. Places that are not closed in on themselves but are open and welcoming . . . And insofar as we strive to live this way we are living in the Trinity, even though it remains a mystery on the level of our understanding. For the real challenge and meaning of the Trinity for us is not a theory, however beautiful and profound; it is, rather, that Father, Son, and Spirit provide a model of genuine community, of genuine family-that which God is and that which we, in turn, are called to become.


