HOLY WEEK

Today we gather to celebrate the traditional prayer of Palm Sunday. There is an expectant atmosphere as we pray and sing while outdoors the world is blooming after the long winter.

At 9am mass many will process into the Church. **We are pilgrims who have arrived at Holy Week: a week of prayer and joy in the spirit of solidarity with all Christians who have come before us, who are with us now, and who will come after us. This is the most important week of the year for all of us and we will celebrate it in communion and simplicity, waiting for the Resurrection of Christ.**

Holy Week is a time to put the final touches on that "re-tuning" of our souls and hearts which occurred during Lent, a re-tuning to the chords of God's words and life.

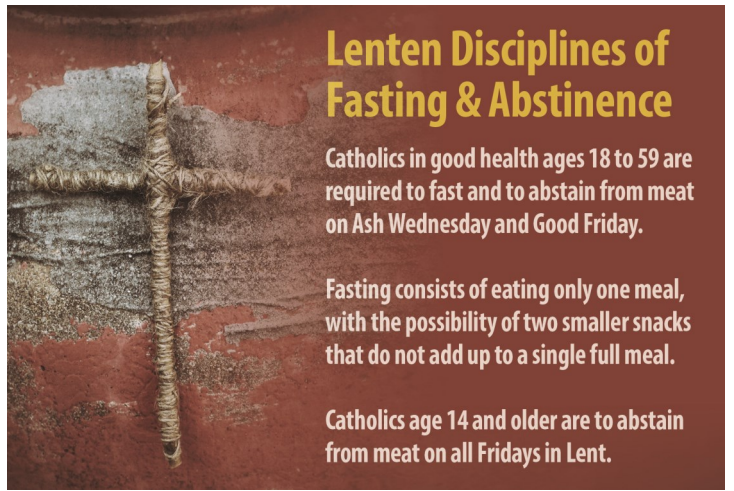

Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain
from meat on all Fridays in Lent.



Good Friday Collection



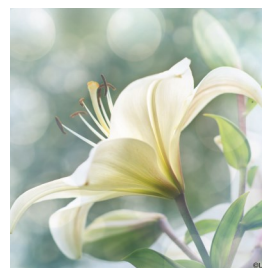

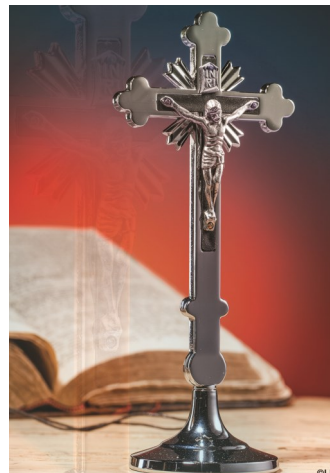
