
Baptism Class

Have you tried Maria's squash blossoms yet? Here's a tasty recipe with an Italian flair!

Fried Squash Blossoms

ots forre fugees.org 20 fresh zucchini or other squash blossoms 6 T freshly grated Parmesan cheese 1 cup fine dry bread crumbs 1 T finely chopped parsley 3 eggs Watch us Salt and freshly ground black pepper 1 cup all-purpose flour 1-2 cups olive oil, for frying Rinse flowers carefully under cold running water. Trim the stalks and dry the flowers carefully with paper towels. Mix the Parmesan and bread crumbs in a large bowl. Add the parsley, 1 egg, and salt and pepper. Use this mixture to carefully stuff the flowers. Beat the remaining eggs in a small bowl. Place the flour in another small bowl and dip the stuffed flowers first in the flour and then in the egg. Heat the oil in a large frying pan until very hot. Fry the flowers in small batches until golden, 5-7 minutes each batch. Remove with a slotted spoon and drain on paper towels.

Season with salt and serve hot. Serves 4-6.
