

PADRE'S CORNER July 17, 2016

Human challenges in life prompt us to turn to each other for encouragement and prayerful support, which puts us on the bridge to the ultimate help of God. A courageous female friend writes to me: "I am sorry not to have reached out since our last exchange. I just found out I have breast cancer. Please keep me in your prayers. "A retired sports athlete buddy implored: "Hey pal, can I ask you a favor? Please offer prayers today for me. My work has come to a crossroad of sink or swim. It has been rough, but with God it will work out. God bless, and thanks. "A family is wiped out in a horrific tragedy. The children are no more. I say prayers over their caskets wondering how did it all come to this. Why did God allow this to happen, which was a frequent question often uttered by Job in the Old Testament.

A son has his parents living in Italy. His wife reflected that they " shared a lifetime of memories despite the ocean that separated them." Sixty-five years of marriage part way recently as they died within two months of each other. Grief compounded for loved ones not once, but twice. Parents in broken marriages still trying to paint a positive face for their children receiving church sacraments, with a meal to reflect their spiritual love and support. Friends we once thought would be lifetime pals, suddenly shifting gears and treating us like we don't exist. Once dynamic interactions being reduced to social media exchanges, that have as much meaning as a flea falling in love with another flea. Teenagers fearful that bad family associations could leave them in peril, as they maintain a stiff upper lip of optimism and hope in a frequently bitter and frustrating world.

Saint Augustine wrote nearly 1600 years ago: "The house of my soul is too narrow for thee to come into me; let it be enlarged by thee. It is in ruins, do thou restore it... Our pilgrimage on earth cannot be exempt from trial. We progress by means of trial. No one knows himself except through trial, or receives a crown except after victory, or strives except against an enemy or temptations." Even great saints like Augustine went through the many human battles we continue to experience in modern day America. These saints are not plaster pieces of material that we cannot relate to, but flesh and bones that understand well the pains we navigate our way through.

Saint Therese of Lisieux, the Little Flower, died in 1897 at the tender age of twenty-four. Living in anticlerical times in France, a century after the French Revolution, she weathered the adversity through a simple yet time-tested faith. She prayed for a convicted murderer, Pranzini, as he faced the guillotine. Moments before his execution he grabbed the cross a priest was holding in front of him, and kissed it. He embraced heaven just in time, largely due to the prayers of a young girl who would later become a saint of tremendous influence.

Each of us has the religious potential to positively impact the lives of others, much as the saints of the past did. By no means is this easy, especially when it involves others we have perceived to have wronged us. God's grace can assist us to capably guide loved ones, as well as face our own inner demons. At the recent "Cancer Relay " in Newburgh, on June 4, I offered a midnight Mass. I referred to the cancers we all have be it physical, emotional, mental, psychological, and/or moral. We turn to God and each other, asking for divine grace and sound human insight. An open heart plus patience will guide us to the heavenly light. Thinking positively, even with those who have seriously wronged us, can allow for each moment to provide a teaching principle of interior growth with proper introspection. May God grace us for such. 


