Padre's Corner

February 17, 2019
Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Planet Earth is a world of deep confusion, with philosophies and viewpoints pointing in directions that are as diverse as an economic forecast. One issue that has torn the nation and its political parties apart is the life issue for the unborn child. Why anyone would be so selfish to support abortion of these holy innocents, all possible problem solvers and saints for the future, is beyond me especially considering that these proponents were all granted the right-to-life themselves. The over-population credo is based on lies. What we have is a distribution problem not an excessive population. Ever go across America or around the world on plane and see the vast expanse of unused and unclaimed properties ? There is also concrete statistical proof that the shortage of labor, because of less people born, is disrupting our economic systems. Fewer people means fewer buyers which means fewer contributors to government programs like Social Security. The numbers do not lie. Much of our national debate today is around the abortion issue, which is also tied increasingly to a medical system supportive of euthanasia or so-called mercy killing. Referred to as compassionate care, I am noticing a growth of programs and workshops in nearby settings that are soft-pedaling society towards acceptance of these two horrific attacks on humanity. Catholicism is a particular target of attack by the cultural media because of its ardent defense of the rights of the unborn child and ill senior citizen. The late Monsignor William Smith, moral theology professor at Saint Joseph's Seminary in Yonkers, would often express this maxim to we theology students : " Verbal engineering precedes social engineering. " Our day and age needs clear thinking and teachings, to allow us to navigate our complicated and confusing times. The Church, despite the inherent weaknesses and imperfections of each of its members, still authentically represents the most coherent teachings to protect people from their worst enemies : themselves. What follows are a few snippets of such clarity, which our times greatly thirst for. Perhaps a good start is with Pope Francis, writing in the papal document " Gaudate et Exsultate : " Our defense of the innocent unborn needs to be clear, firm and passionate, for at stake is the dignity of a human life, which is always sacred." Elsewhere, the Holy Father stated on this issue : " Last century, the whole world was scandalized by what the Nazis did to purify the race. Today, we do the same thing but with white gloves. " The late Saint Pope John Paul II added a few decades before in the papal document " Evangelium Vitae : " The issue of life and its defense and promotion is not a concern of Christians alone... The value at stake is one which every human being can grasp by the light of reason ; thus it necessarily concerns everyone... To be actively pro-life is to contribute to the renewal of society through the promotion of the common good. "

President Abraham Lincoln once uttered : " No law can give me the right to do what is wrong. " Political leaders of 2019 need to deeply meditate on this statement, from a great and heroic former president 150 years ago. From an " Author Unknown " come these pearls of wisdom, undoubtedly influenced by a Christian vision of the world. " Would you respect human life in the following situations? 1. A preacher and his wife are very, very poor. They already have 14 kids. Now she finds out she's pregnant with the 15th child. They are living in severe poverty. 2. The father is ailing, the mother has tuberculosis. The eldest child is blind, the second died, the third is deaf, and the youngest also has TB. The mother learns she's pregnant again. 3. A white man raped a 13 year-old black girl and now she's pregnant. 4. Another teenage girl is pregnant. She's not married. Her fiancé is not the father of the baby, and he's very upset. If you thought ending an innocent life was the best solution under these circumstances- In the first case, you have just killed John Wesley before he could become the famed evangelist from England. In the second case, you aborted Beethoven and deprived the world of some of our greatest musical compositions. In the third case, you gave up on Ethel Waters the renowned black gospel singer. In the fourth case, the teenage girl is the Blessed Virgin Mary and you have just declared the murder of our Savior Jesus Christ. " How can anyone look at these sentiments and say that the fate of the unborn child is like a " seamless garment, " one issue of many others equally important ? If our culture and legal system can mess up with the most defenseless of all human beings, what decent prospect can we hold that other laws on human potential can rise to the scope of nobility ? I will go down to my last breath in life passionate for the human rights of the unborn child and senior citizen. Should God forgive me my many faults and deem me worthy enough for entry, I hope their angelic chorus plus repentant parents greet me at the pearly gates of Heaven. Father Bill

SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Jeremiah 17:5-8

Jeremiah compares a man who seeks strength in flesh but abandons God to a bush in the desert, bereft of nourishment and unable to grow. Yet a man who trusts in God is like a tree beside a river, fed & strengthened by it even during times of drought.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:12, 16-20

Paul addresses those who believe in Christ's teachings, but are not convinced that he rose from the dead. He calls their faith worthless, because they have not been freed from their sins. Paul then emphatically declares that Jesus did rise up again, as will all those who truly believe in him.

Gospel: Luke 6:17, 20-26

Jesus tells his followers that those who are insulted in this life because of him will be rewarded richly in heaven. Yet those well received by all will despair in heaven, since people had often respected false prophets and mistreated true prophets. Those who hunger, perhaps for spiritual knowledge, shall be filled. Yet those who are full in this life will be hungry.

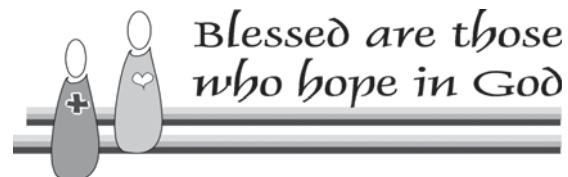
