Engaged couples should contact the Rectory at least six months in advance in order to arrange for their participation in the marriage preparation program. Please email assistantpastor@spasaparish.org.


Anointing of the Sick

How Do You Count the 40 Days of Lent?

In Lent we imitate Jesus, who spent 40 Days fasting and praying in the desert. But if you count the calendar days between Ash Wednesday and Easter, it comes to 46. Here's how Lent is calculated. Ash Wednesday through the following Saturday is four days. Then six weeks of Lent minus the Sundays (never days of penance) are 36 days. So 4 + 36 = 40.

Actually, Lent, which is the *period of preparation* for Jesus' Passion, Death and Resurrection, officially comes to an end at sunset on Holy Thursday — when we begin to celebrate these mysteries in the Easter Triduum. However, since we still continue to fast and do penance on Good Friday and Holy Saturday, those two days are counted into the 40.


PENITENTIAL RULES FOR ASH WEDNESDAY

FASTING (ages 21 through 59)

- ♦ One full meal allowed along with two smaller meals which, together, do not equal a full meal.
- No snacking in between meals.

ABSTINENCE (ages 14 and up)

♦ No meat or soups made with meat.


COME JOIN AMERICAN HERITAGE GIRLS TROOP NY1315

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

An Unlikely Football Game

Every human heart needs to know that we are loved even when we may not deserve it. That makes the difference between a meaningful life and an empty life.

A few years ago a high school football game in Texas made that kind of difference. The game was between Gainesville State School and Grapevine Faith Christian School.

Grapevine Faith is a private Christian school. Gainesville State is a high-school prison, a maximumsecurity state correctional facility for 285 teenage inmates.

Gainesville State lost to Grapevine Faith to finish their season 0-9.

But ever since that game, a sort of miracle has taken place on the Gainesville State campus.

Teacher Chris Styles put it concisely: After that game, he said, "The culture just switched."

Why? Because of how Grapevine Faith hosted the players from the prison: they treated them like real people, not hopeless outcasts.

First, student fans at Grapevine Faith formed a 40-yard spirit line for the Gainesville players to run through before the start of the game. Then, half the Grapevine fans sat behind the Gainesville sideline and cheered them on — by numbers and even names throughout the game. Grapevine Faith even loaned the Gainesville State Tornadoes their junior high cheerleaders.

Gainesville lost, but they ended up scoring as many touchdowns in that one game as they had in their eight previous games combined.



And Gainesville State is a different place now. "It's like people's hearts have really changed," the superintendent said.

And not just the hearts of the inmates, but area residents too. They think of the correctional facility differently now; they encourage the young men there; they even come out for their games.

All because a group of Christians decided to follow Christ's example and to reach out instead of condemn.
