


# COME JOIN AMERICAN HERITAGE GIRLS TROOP NY1315

# COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS AVAILABLE



# **Every Christian Is a Full-Time Missionary**

Some of us may think that we aren't called to spread the gospel because we don't have what it takes to influence other people.

But that is a deception of the devil.

Every Christian is called to be a full-time missionary, not because we are all super-intelligent, good-looking, creative, or endowed with a charismatic personality. Our missionary identity comes from our baptism, which made us members of God's family, and our confirmation, by which God equipped us to become his

messengers, courageous soldiers of his Kingdom. It is God who will work through us; our job is just to give him the chance.

A few years ago, a young woman who had consecrated her life to God as a full-time missionary became seriously sick. She was confined to bed and her days were filled with intense physical suffering.

But more than that, she experienced a deep moral suffering, a deep existential frustration: she had given her life to God to become a missionary, and now she couldn't even get out of bed. She prayed and asked God for guidance.

Soon people started visiting her and asking for her prayers. As she prayed for these intentions, she united her suffering to Christ's cross as part of her prayer. Soon more people began to ask for her prayers, and she stumbled upon her mission: she would use her difficult situation as a model for other people who had been given similar crosses, inviting them to offer their sufferings for the needs of others.

So she started a website apostolate. It has inspired a growing network with members in 14 countries and on five continents.

Every one of us is called to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ, no matter what limitations we may be facing.
