





FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The Passion of the Christ An Insight

reat artists have great spiritual insights.

We can see this in the way director Mel Gibson connected two scenes in his 2004 movie, *The Passion of the Christ*.

The first scene is solely the product of Gibsen's creative imagination. It does not appear anywhere in the gospel accounts of the suffering and death of Jesus. The other scene is based on the encounter of Jesus and the woman caught in adultery, about to be stoned to death. By the interrelationship of these two scenes, the film eloquently illustrates the power of God's forgiveness and how His love redeems us.

In Gibsen's version of the Passion, Mary Magdalene, who stays by the side of Mary, the mother of Jesus, and accompanies her to the foot of the cross, is, in fact, that same adulteress whom Jesus saved.

But the audience learns this only near the end of the film when we come to Gibsen's fictional scene.

The scene is set in the flagellation courtyard after Jesus has been scourged at the pillar and taken away. All the soldiers are gone, and Mary and Mary Magdalene are alone. They see Jesus' blood on the paving stones. According to Jewish custom but with heartbreaking love Mary takes some clean white linens, kneels down, and starts to wipe up the blood of her son. A moment later, Magdalene kneels down to help. But instead of using one of the clean linens, Magdalene actually removes her veil and uses that to wipe up Jesus' blood.

This is a way of showing how personal this gesture is for her. And in a moment, we find out why.

While she is wiping up the blood, the film reveals what she is thinking through a flashback of her first meeting with Jesus, when she was about to be stoned for adultery.



We see her cowering on the dusty ground as a crowd of angry Pharisees stand ready to stone her. Then Jesus steps into the scene. We don't hear any words, but we know He is saying these beautiful words: "Let him who has no sin throw the first stone." We see the Pharisees, one by one, drop their stones and walk off.

Then Magdalene's hand reaches out to touch Jesus' foot. She looks up at Him with wonder, gratitude, and near disbelief. She has been saved. Jesus reaches down and takes her hand in His, smiles, and lifts her up to a new life.

Then the beautiful flashback ends and we are brought back to the scene in the courtyard. The blood Mary Magdalene has wiped onto her veil is the blood of the one who once saved her.

And it's the blood of Our Savior too, the one who will come to our defense, as He did for Magdalene, and give us another chance.

He shed His blood for all of us, to redeem us. This is what He came to do. This is how much he loves us.
